(select one by season or “At any time”)

Confession of Sin Page 79

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on *us*, forgive *us* all *our* sins, through *our* Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen *us* in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep *us* in eternal life. Amen.

The Invitatory and Psalter Page 80

Officiant: Lord, open our lips,

People: *And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.*

Officiant: The earth is the Lord’s, for he made it:
(or any of the antiphons list on pp. 80-82
and the proper response for that antiphon.)

People: *Come let us adore him.*

Venite, Jubilate, or Christ our Passover Pages 82-83

Officiant and People: The earth is the Lord’s, for he made it: Come let us adore him.

May be read in unison or antiphonally by half verse (at the asterisk).

Intercessions (all may add petitions or thanksgivings either silently or aloud)

Additional Directions

The Daily Office (Morning and Evening Prayer) are usually led by lay people. References to the officiant do not imply clergy.

Psalms are located on pages 585 through 808 in the BCP. Psalms for each day are found either in “Forward Day by Day” or listed throughout the Psalms with the calendar date and identified as Morning Prayer. If you choose this method, the entire Psalter is read in one month in Morning and Evening Prayer.

Readings may be found in the “Forward Day by Day” publication or beginning on page 953 according to the week of the liturgical year (odd years equal year one) or online www.satucket.com/lectionary/.
