Original Prayer Shawl Knitting Pattern

Using size 11 needles, cast on 57 stitches

1st row: K3 P3 to end

2nd.row: knit the opposite of what you see.

Knit the purls and purl the knits.

It should not look like ribbing.

If you cast on 57 stitches you will always

start with K3.

Continue until the shawl is 54-60 inches long. Fringe may be added to each end.

Crochet Pattern

Using a size "I" or "J" hook

Chain 54-60 stitches

Ch I, turn—single crochet in each stitch to end.

Ch 3, turn—double crochet in the top of each

Single crochet to end. Repeat this row

2 more times. Ch 1, turn and do 1 row of

single crochet. Ch 3, turn—do 3 rows of

double crochet. Repeat these 4 rows

until the shawl is 54-60 inches.

Fringe may be added to each end.
