FROM PASTOR DAVE

We are about to enter the period in the church year that is referred to as Lent. The English word Lent comes from a Middle English word, *lente*, which means spring, and that came from an Old English word, *lengthen*, which means to lengthen (daylight). Lent is the period of forty weekdays prior to Easter Day, beginning with Ash Wednesday. The Sundays are not counted, as each Sunday during this period is meant to be thought of as a mini Easter.

The season was originally thought of as a time to prepare candidates to receive the Sacrament of Baptism and enter into the life of the church, and there are still some traditions that use this period of forty days as such. But, for many traditions, Lent has become a season of intentional reflection on what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, before we celebrate the glorious event of Easter. It is thought of as a period of preparation, preparing our heart, soul, mind, and body, to again celebrate the glorious gift of Resurrection Day, which becomes our lifetime gift. Often, in many traditions and even in families, this period becomes a time to eliminate something from one's life, "giving up" something that makes us happy, or something indulgent, as a way to sacrifice something before we receive the glory of Easter. I like to think of Lent as a time to truly look at my life and my being and see where it is that I am still reluctant to receiving this glorious gift; what is still a part of me that stands in the road to receiving the gift of Christ fully. In other words, what can I "give up" that is still a stumbling block to my reconciliation with God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. However you choose to observe this period of forty days, we at Faith United Presbyterian Church will observe the season in worship.

We begin the season with supper and worship on Wednesday, Marcy 1, as we observe Ash Wednesday. During the Ash Wednesday service, we will receive the imposition of ashes, to remind us of our frailty and our shortcoming, and we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion as a reminder that Jesus shared his body and blood with all his disciples, even the one who would betray, the one who would deny, and all who would desert. Our shortcomings do not preclude us from receiving the gracious love of God, made real in Jesus. Then, each Wednesday evening we will follow the steps our Lord Jesus took as he made his way to the cross, through the Garden of Gethsemane, through the betrayal, through the denial, through the trial and scourging and walk of the cross, through the hammering of the nails and the lifting of the cross. The Wednesday gatherings will be offered as part of an evening gathering that includes supper, an adult study around the topic of Forgiveness, and the time of worship which will be intentionally brief. On Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter, we will confirm our Confirmation Class and welcome them into the membership of the congregation. Then, each morning during Holy Week, we will hold a brief prayer service in the chapel at 8 am, Monday through Thursday. On Thursday evening we will remember the Last Supper and the washing of the disciple's feet with worship at 7 pm, in the Dining Room. We will also celebrate the Supper during this service. We will also hold a Good Friday Prayer Service at noon, on Good Friday, in the sanctuary, and there will be a Community Good Friday service, here at Faith United Presbyterian Church, at 6:30, with people from all of the Presbyterian Churches in the area joining together for worship. This will all lead, of course, to the celebration of the Easter Event on Sunday, April, 16.

This is a busy time, but it is also a time to step back and reflect. I invite us to step back and reflect together, and worship God in community. Blessings and peace. Dave

In the spring our women take part in the “Birthday Offering”. It is suggested that each member contribute an amount of money Signifying their age. PW’s are very strong in their giving. This Money has helped those in need in the U.S. and overseas. It has enabled many mission projects to be accomplished. The annual fund of PW’s world-wide varies to approximately around \$1,197,465.

Actually, it started in 1922. Hallie Paxton Winsborough, superintendent of women’s work, visited Miss Dowd’s School for Girls in Kochi, Japan, and saw the inadequate facilities and recognized a need that could be met by Presbyterian women in the United States. She challenged all women of the church to give one penny for each year of their lives (or a dollar, if they didn’t want to reveal their ages) as a “birthday gift” to those schoolgirls in Japan.

Horizon Bible Study for 2017-18 The title of the Bible Study for next year is "Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews". The author will explore major themes found in Hebrews and relate these to other parts of our faith tradition. The cost of the Bible Study has increased to \$10 plus a portion of the shipping/handling. 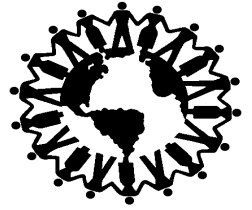

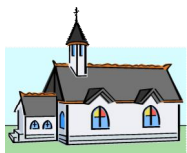
Update on "Faith Together"
