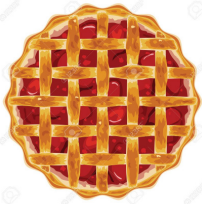
## Sunday Morning Forum

## Report from Waycross Camp

I spent 6 weeks at Waycross as an Asst. Director from June 5 - July 20. There were 4 adventure camp sessions serving 50-72 campers a week. A canoe camp session had 12 campers. We survived lots of variations in the weather, including an extremely wet week and an extremely hot week. The campers participated in lots of fun activities: hiking, swimming, archery, whole camp games, overnights in the woods, arts and crafts, etc.

An important component of camp this year was the implementation of Peace Works, a curriculum for our worship time in the mornings and evenings, and at our Sunday and Friday evening Eucharists. Every day, the worship centered around a different word for peace and used scripture for illustration and discussion:

- \* Aloha, from Hawaii (Luke 14:15-24, the Great Banquet, hospitality);
- \* Ubuntu, from Africa (1 Corinthians 12: 1-27, the Body of Christ, community);
- \* Shalom (Genesis 27:1-26, Jacob and Esau's conflict, responding to conflict);
- \* Agape (John 13:1-17, the Last Supper and foot washing, God's reconciling love);
- \* Heiwa, from Japan (Mark 12:28-31, the Great Commandment, self-sacrifice for the unity of all);
- \* Si Se Puede, a Hispanic phrase for "Yes, we can!" (Luke 10:25-37, the Good Samaritan, active peacemaking);
- \* and Aloha (John 14:25-27, My peace I give to you; going out into the world).

It is our hope that the campers take these themes back home to use daily.
