This morning as I awoke early the phrase, “Showing the Rifle” was in my spirit along with thoughts about the lying spirit which, though it is an evil spirit without much spiritual power, is in the family of *deceiving* spirits that the Lord told me in 1985 is one of “the two greatest spirits in operation in the earth today”—the other being religious spirits.

As you know if you’ve read *Mysterious Secrets of the Dark Kingdom*, the devil’s kingdom is well organized and many of these spirits work together against the Christian to destroy us. I also write that “the dominant spirit over Washington, D.C., is a lying spirit. I plan to write an article about the lying spirit next week because it is not only one of our main enemies but also is being used to destroy the Christian Church in America. I believe the reason both of these was in my spirit this morning is because they are related to what is coming for the Church of America—persecution and bloodshed for those who will not conform!

But probably the phrase, “Showing the Rifle,” is new to you. When I met my wife, Evelyn, the Lord gave her my vision for Africa and gave me her vision for the Native Americans. Evie’s father was a full-blood Cherokee and her mother was Irish. The Lord has revealed much to me about the American Indian tribes or native Americans as they are called now. When we began the church on the Hualapai Reservation

back in the '90s the Lord told me, "They don't need money; they need the Holy Spirit."

When we first moved to Helena, Montana, under the direction of the Spirit back in 1997 I did some research at the library on all the tribes and reservations in America and Canada. One of the things that struck me was the fact that the USA had reneged on all 265 (I think the number was) treaties that they'd made with the Indians. I completely lost all respect for President Andrew Jackson when I read about all the things he did—it certainly appears that he had a severe hatred of the Native peoples and his "Indian Relocation Act of 1830" is just one example of the brutality, theft and lies that our government fostered against these peoples for financial gain. Even the missionaries of the Church exploited them—the Lord told me as I prayed about His assignment back then. He said, "I sent them to an innocent people and they exploited them."

The Lord had told me back then and Eve and I ministered it in South Africa in 1997 to some Zulus that the American Indians were the peoples of the earth He had made "with the greatest warring spirit." That's the main reason why they've been under such attack for centuries—the devil is afraid of them! But as I've said on reservations and reserves many times, "Where are the warriors today?"

When Custer attacked the Cheyenne and Lakota peoples at Little Big Horn both Crazy Horse and Gaul rode out of camp yelling, "It's a good day to die." Gaul became a Christian and wore his war paint to church! We need such warriors today to teach the Church how to war!

We've been to the Battle of the Big Hole outside of Wisdom, Montana, where the Nez Perce were savagely attacked without provocation as they retreated out of Idaho in an attempt to join Sitting Bull up in

Canada. Almost a hundred Nez Perce, mostly women and children, were killed that day as they were opened fire on by cannons.

One of their chiefs, Yellow Wolf, had strong medicine and was told by his spirit guide that “bullets would never touch him”; he gives many accounts where he rode between cavalry soldiers and 6, 8, 10 of them were all firing at him at once and he was never hit! Of course we recognize this as demonic power but it’s another testimony to the power of the Dark Kingdom that most people dismiss. He received his name because he was given the nose of a wolf and could smell a man a mile away!

But the phrase, “Showing the Rifle,” is from the native culture and it refers to the fact that the “long knives” used the threat of death against them all the time. If they were at some treaty signing or such and the Indians were suspicious—because they’d been lied to so many times—then the Indians would report that the troops would “show the rifle” as a means to intimidate them into submission to do whatever they wanted them to do. In other words, it was the army’s main means of control.

The significance of this term for today, I believe, has to do with what is coming for the Church in America as the government along with more and more groups will be seeking to “show the rifle” to those true Christians who will not bow down to their golden statues and commandments.
