September 1st we will "Reopen the church"! We will be back to business as usual! This means Worship, Sunday School, meetings, and all regular activities will be back to normal just like before the coronavirus. The church office will be functioning with the doors unlocked also.

Our first worship service back in the Sanctuary will be on Sunday, September 6th. Mask will not be required but those wanting to wear one are encouraged to do as they are comfortable doing. We have mask available and several new automatic hand sanitizer stands throughout the church. One is located in the narthex, one outside the parlor/ kitchen area and another as you enter the office doors. Classrooms will have hand sanitizer bottles for use.

As we join together for Sunday School, please enter through the office doors. There will be someone stationed there to check temperatures with a non-contact infrared thermometer. At 10:25am the office doors will be locked and we ask that you enter the church through the Sanctuary front doors. At that time, there will be someone there to check your temperature.



UMYF will resume meeting on Wednesday, September 2nd from 5:30-7pm. We will have dinner and a lesson. On September 9th at 5:00pm there will be a meeting to discuss plans for this years Pumpkin Patch. The Lindsay Public Schools is not allowing fieldtrips this year. But we will discuss other ways to

get people and fun in our Pumpkin Patch.

Choir will resume on Wednesday, September 9th at 7:00pm. Adult Handbells will resume in October and Junior Handbells will resume in January 2021.

"Then an angel from heaven appeared to him and gave him strength. In his anguish he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat became like great drops of blood."

~Luke 22:43-44

This first Sunday of September, the sermon will be about developing a Christian memory. The last Sunday of August was on Prayer and I'm just not finished with that topic yet. Sometimes our prayers are so intense, we struggle and labor in anguish. We want our way, but we desperately want God's will to be done.

In Genesis, Jacob wrestles with a stranger all night long and it is strongly suggested that this stranger was God. The closest parallel to Jacob's struggle is Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane. The Greek word used in this narrative is *agonia*. The English translation is *agony*. Jesus is struggling in such anguish that Luke uses an extraordinary metaphor: *His sweat became like great drops of blood*. Jesus' sweat falls to the ground the way blood might drip. That imagery of blood ties Gethsemane to Golgotha.

We may not "sweat like blood falling to the ground" every time we approach God in prayer, but such times may come when we are facing severe circumstances: bedside vigil for a child, facing a terminal diagnosis for oneself or loved one.

When faced with *agonia* in prayer, remember the second thing about Jesus' garden prayer: the presence and gift of God's grace strengthens us so we can pray. There was an angelic presence in the garden that night that prepared and sustained Jesus through his prayer. God's grace and presence will prepare you and sustain you through prayers that take you to the depths of life and death. You do not go alone or unaided. God is with you. So you may pray. So you may life. So you may hope.

When I am weary and without words, be with me, O God. Strengthen me with your grace for my labors and my prayers. Sustain me by your presence. Amen.

You are Invited . . .

We are re-entering the Sanctuary this Sunday for worship and we do have some guidelines.

- 1. We will take your temperature as you enter the building. Please do not proceed until your temperature is taken. Only one set of doors will be open at a time so we can insure the safety of all who enter.
 - a. 9:00 10:30 The glass doors to the Education building (by the nursery/offices)
 - b. 10:30 1:00 The glass doors to the Sanctuary
- 2. Wearing masks (or some kind of face covering).
 - a. Please wear a mask or some kind of face covering in the hallways.
 - b. Sunday school teachers will decide if you need a mask in the classrooms.
 - c. In the Sanctuary: If you are not wearing a mask, please sit on the west side, and those wearing masks may sit on the east side.
- 3. Sanctuary is in two sections. Masks on piano side; no masks on street side.
 - a. Enter the sanctuary through the double doors (which will be closed).
 - i. You may deposit your offering in the offering box just inside the door.
 - ii. Please sit on pew that is not blocked off, keeping a distance between families.
 - iii. We are using bulletins. Please do not leave them in the pew, but take them out of the building with you. There will be a recycle bin to put them in just outside the doors.

We have purchased equipment to sterilize the church and hope you feel comfortable coming. There are hand sanitizer stands as you enter the building on the south side and as you enter the sanctuary. We have equipped all the bathrooms with sanitizer and disinfectant spray.

If you do not feel comfortable coming, we will still be live-streaming on KBLP radio 105.1 FM and on Face-book at Lindsay United Methodist Church. Our website has a link to the Radio broadcast, as well as bulletins for you to follow along as we worship. One of the things available on Facebook is the capability to make comments among yourselves during the live streaming. Take advantage of that as you worship with us. Also, if you are watching from home, "Like" us on Facebook so we know you are there.
