Pastor's Message

*Imagination.*

As we celebrate Pentecost this past week I am reminded that the Holy Spirit is the creative holy spark, a source of life. Present and part of the making of the universe, when God imagined what could be. Given as gift to the disciples to guide and teach and lead. *Imagination* – the ability to see beyond the present reality and say “what if? Yes! THAT would be cool!”

Vacation Bible School is coming up, filled with little kids whose imagination is so often overflowing, able to “see and be in” the jungle, or space, or any other place. Our leaders using their imagination to create a story and a place.

Ministry teams exercise their imagination, praying to open themselves to the Holy Spirit, so that they can envision a possible new future of sharing, caring, teaching, helping, worshipping. We're exploring the possibility of hosting a Senior Respite Care ministry of Lutheran Services of the Carolinas. Might happen, might not, more to be worked on. But *\*imagine\** how that might help some of our members, and families, and the families of the community around us. Evangelism team and leaders try to imagine many things, such as the experience of our guests – their first impressions, finding parking, getting directions, “what is” and “where is” and “who are” kinds of questions. *\*imagining\** those experiences means setting aside our own already-know-that kind of thoughts and stepping into their shoes, and working to make that guest experience better. Our Worship team is always working on new ideas, trying to use imagination, to blend tradition with some new elements in order to better share the Gospel – songs and forms and media and congregational involvement.

God didn't just create the world, once, long ago, then walk away and let it run. As imaginative as that was, we know that God stayed engaged, working, calling, trying new things, new covenants, new ways to connect with us – such as Jesus coming down, to us.

*Imagination* – if you let the Holy Spirit in, and let it run a bit, what new things might it share with you?

**Council Meeting Notes**

*A reminder: Council meetings are normally open for all members to attend and detailed minutes are on record, if desired. The Congregation Council met the morning of Sunday, May 20. Notable actions and decisions include:*

Treasurer's report was accepted.  
 Finance committee – church credit cards for Pastor, Youth Director, and Music Director have been received.

Stewardship reported that they have and are continuing to explore recycling options, including an aluminum can collection trailer/bin, which seems too expensive. Other options will be explored as well.

Worship & Music reported that the new microphones were ordered and received, and have already been put to use.

Property reported that stained glass windows glazing project still underway, doors project due to start soon. Work is continuing on options to raise/lower the sanctuary Eternal Light so that a ladder is not necessary every week.

Hoffner Scholarship team shared that they have made awards of grants for individuals and youth mission experience.

Council directed Property Team to review options for ongoing cleaning Fellowship Hall and Activity Building (neither of which are part of Sexton's duties) and bring recommendation to council.

Pastor shared background checks have been completed on staff that work with youth.

Pastor also shared that Lutheran Services of the Carolinas is looking for space and partnership to establish a Senior Respite Care ministry, and is preparing a proposal for St. Luke's to consider based on a meeting with Pastor and Social Ministry representatives.

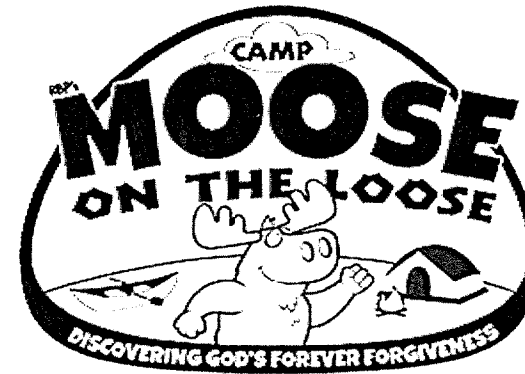

The Catherine H. Hoffner Endowment Fund administration team is joyfully privileged to share with the 2018 award of grants. This year the fund investment proceeds for distribution totaled \$8,500, of which 2/3 (\$5,700) was allocated to individual Career Advancement Scholarship grants and the remaining 1/3 (\$2,800) was allocated for Youth Group Mission Experience grants.

By the published deadline, 5 applications were received for individual Career Advancement Scholarship grants, and all applicants were deemed eligible. These individuals will be recognized during the worship service on June 10.

A Youth Group Mission Experience grant of \$2,800 was awarded to support the upcoming SLY trip to Houston for the ELCA National Youth Gathering for worship, service and fellowship.

As a result of these experiences I have created a short 1-page Funeral/Memorial Plans and Wishes document, which I hope is helpful in recording a few life events, messages to share, favorite verses and hymns, desires for participants, preferences for memorial gifts, etc. Share it with family and we'll gladly keep a copy here at St. Luke's. A second page, meant for family use, is a reminder question list of important documents and contacts for wills and legal documents, etc.
