

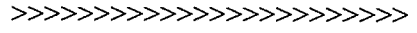

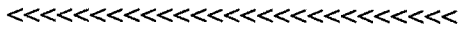
150th Birthday Team

38 presented and 33 pints were collected. Next blood drive will be on Dec. 16.



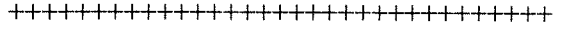
Pastor's Thursday Morning Study Group at 10 am

Pastor's Message

August Council Meeting Notes

A reminder: Council meetings are normally open for all members to attend and detailed minutes are on record, if desired. . Notable actions and decisions of the Aug. 19 meeting include:

--Treasurer's report accepted, including notice that 3 different bank accounts holding different parts of Capital Campaign funds are being consolidated into one account. A special \$5,000 gift was received, to be dedicated to adding projection capability to the sanctuary. --Stewardship reported they are working to finalize plans for the Sept. 9 God's Work Our Hands day.

--Evangelism and Christian Ed will be meeting together to discuss possible tutoring ministry ideas.

--Worship and Music presented a motion to Council to use recently donated funds and 2017 Ingathering funds to purchase and install projection system in the sanctuary. Council approved.

--Council celebrated the Capital Campaign progress – contributions now exceed original pledge, good balance in the Capital Campaign fund, mortgage balance is dropping, and looking forward to being out of debt.

--Received reports that organ has been fixed, sanctuary window work is complete, and sanctuary doors are expected to be installed in late September.

--Council endorsed Stewardship proposal that the donated playground equipment be moved, installed, and repainted as part of the God's Work Our Hands day event. New safety ground cover is needed.

--Council has started to receive requests for Fish Fry Community Support, and will make decisions in September meeting.

--Misc: Staff annual coaching/planning sessions will begin soon, the preparation of a mailable flyer covering holiday events was

endorsed, and Jay Snover's request to join St. Luke's was approved.

Update: Sanctuary Windows and Doors

Stained Glass window caulking/sealing process is done. Total cost of \$3,552.73 was under budget. Locking double doors from narthex to sanctuary have been ordered and expected delivery date is Sept. 22.

Sanctuary Projection Project

A special donation was received, dedicated to projection equipment in the sanctuary. Council approved a motion from Worship & Music to combine those funds with remaining 2017 Ingathering funds to proceed with the project that was endorsed last year. A single long-range projector will be installed in the balcony area. Additional equipment may be considered in the future.

Capital Campaign update

2017 "Mortgage Free & A Blessing Be" Cap Campaign had an original goal of raising \$150,000.

We were blessed to receive pledges totaling \$87,988. And now, as of Aug 31, 2018, St Luke's has received a total of \$88,256 in contributions (pledged and unpledged). Hallelujah! We have passed the pledge mark! The current Mortgage balance is \$86,489, and the Capital Campaign account has a balance of \$27,091, which is being used to make double payments on the loan and occasional lump-sum principal payments in order to reduce the interest expense.

We thank you all for your generous gifts, and look forward to each new milestone as the outstanding debt gets closer and closer to being paid-off!

Ministry I Love Moments

We're back to the fall, and some things we look to restart and continue. I'd really like to schedule some more "Ministry I Love" moments for worship. We try to have one, of some kind, about once a month. Ministries here at St. Luke's, Maybe a ministry that serves outside of St. Luke's.

St. Luke's Youth and Kingdom Kids

Regular Youth meetings resume on September 9th, with meal to be served at 6:00 pm, followed by meeting from 6:30-7:30 pm.

Youth Gathering in Houston was BIG

Just a few little stats about a really big event:

- 22,500 youth participants and 7,500 adult participants
- 1,200 team members and volunteers planned, hosted and coordinated the event. At least 350 of those were young adults (under 30).
- Over the three Service Learning days (1/3 of participants each day) our youth and adults gave more than 90,000 volunteers hours helping 213 projects across 147 organizations in Houston
- Speakers and Artist: 30
- 58 hotels were contracted for about 11,000 rooms a night.
- Economic impact is estimated around \$30 million (includes flights, hotel, food, etc.).
