Pastor's Letter

He's been in movies. He's at the mall.

He's part of tradition and family and holiday and Christmas.

He lives at the North Pole, drives reindeer, and brings presents to good girls and boys (and sometimes their moms and dads, too).

(SPOILER ALERT! Little kids stop reading here!... well, maybe not after all...)

But perhaps there's more to Santa than you thought. The "Jolly old St Nick" wasn't always what he is now. I'll share this snippet from Wikipedia, since it is such a good summary: "Saint Nicholas of Myra is the primary inspiration for the Christian figure of Sinterklaas. He was a 4th century Greek Christian bishop of Myra (now Demre) in Lycia, a province of the Byzantine Anatolia, now in Turkey. Nicholas was famous for his generous gifts to the poor, in particular presenting the three impoverished daughters of a pious Christian with dowries so that they would not have to become prostitutes. He was very religious from an early age and devoted his life entirely to Christianity. In continental Europe (more precisely the Netherlands, Belgium, Austria and Germany) he is usually portrayed as a bearded bishop in canonical robes."

Saint Nicholas of Myra. Think about that, a moment. "Saint" as in saint of the church, of the faith. Someone who wasn't just nice, but someone who really loved God, loved God's children, and lived a life that made a difference - much more than just giving out toys. 1700 years ago he was bishop, which then was often the clergy leader responsible for leading a city rather than the larger area that a bishop might lead today. He didn't just tell folks what to do, or how to do it, or send pastors and priests here and yonder. He really cared, and served, and gave. He gave more than just toys - he gave hope, especially to those three daughters. A chance to "be delivered" from prostitution to marriage, something that they would not have been able to do on their own in that time and place.

You know, I think that giving "hope" like that, serving like that, caring like that, is a great example to admire and try to emulate.

This year, why don't we all try and be a "Santa Claus" to someone in a way that perhaps you've never thought of before. Not just our kids, or grandkids. Others, with other needs.

November Council Meeting Notes

A reminder: Council meetings are normally open for all members to attend and detailed minutes are on record, if desired. Summary notes from the Council meeting of Nov. 19, 2017

- Treasurer's Report shared that balances in accounts are very good, with notable increases in October, and that Jan-June, 2017 audit is complete with minor items identified and resolved.
- Finance Committee recommended, and Council approved (1) guidelines for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund that is being started in 2018 and (2) using \$15,000 of funds from the Capital Campaign account (currently holding about \$45,000) to make a lump-sum payment on the mortgage loan.
- Social Ministry requested, and Council approved, collecting a love offering for medical-related expenses for an individual at one of the Christmas in the Mountains congregations that St. Luke's supports.
- Christian Education recommended and Council approved (1) placing job Descriptions for St. Luke's staff up in the reference section of the website, and (2) using a group-travel discount contract for the youth Houston trip. Christian Ed also completed review of a new Child Protection Policy, and forwards to Council for review/approval at later date.
- Fellowship hosted a wonderfully successful 2017 Ingathering
- Capital Campaign has received \$56,281 in contributions through end of October.
- Generator installation hopefully proceeding this week, and Council endorses having an Activity Building celebration and update event after the new year to share what all has been done, is or may be planned, etc.
- Council also (1) reviewed and approved official Fund Designations and Guidelines

(for general, restricted, special funds etc.), (2) asked Finance to explore and make recommendation on possible credit card(s) for the church staff to simplify purchases and accounting, (3) endorsed building a "Little Free Library" box.

For our Faith: Thomas Merton “About Results”

Thomas Merton (1915-1968) is considered one of the great theologians of the last century. A writer, a monk, a poet, a mystic, Merton wrote over 70 books. The bestselling *The Seven Storey Mountain* (1948) was listed as one of the 100 best non-fiction books of the century by National Review. Here is a short item Merton wrote that I find meaningful, and reminds me of Abraham and all of us that strive to be faithful, but don't always “see” the end or the success we were hoping for.

“About Results” Thomas Merton

Do not depend on the hope of results. When you are doing the sort of work you have taken on, essentially an apostolic work, you may have to face the fact that your work will be apparently worthless and even achieve no result at all, if not perhaps results opposite to what you expect. As you get used to this idea, you start more and more to concentrate not on the results but on the value, the rightness, the truth of the work itself. And there too a great deal has to be gone through, as gradually you struggle less and less for an idea and more and more for specific people. The range tends to narrow down, but it gets much more real. In the end, it is the reality of personal relationships that saves everything....

The big results are not in your hands or mine, but they suddenly happen, and we can share in them; but there is no point in building our lives on this personal satisfaction, which may be denied us and which after all is not that important.

You are probably striving to build yourself an identity in your work, out of your work and your witness. You are using it, so to speak, to protect yourself against nothingness and annihilation. That is not the right use of your work. All the good that you will do will come not from you but from the fact that you have allowed yourself, in the obedience of faith, to be used by God's love. Think of this more, and gradually you will be free from the need to prove yourself, and you can be more open to the power that will work through you without you knowing it.

... If you can get free from the domination of causes and just serve Christ's truth, you will be able to do more and will be less crushed by the inevitable disappointments.

The real hope, then, is not in something we think we can do, but in God who is making something good out of it in some way that we cannot see. If we can do His will, we will be helping out in this process. But we will not necessarily know all about it beforehand...
