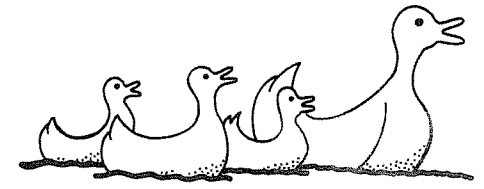

Council and Leadership

Council Retreat: Our congregation council is gathering for a leadership retreat on Saturday, March 2. Please hold them in your prayers.

Activity Building Flooring Plan

Council has reviewed the selection of activity building flooring choices (wood, tiles, poly, etc) and voted to recommend a multi-purpose pad & poured polyurethane surface to the congregation. Discussion, vote for approval are tentatively scheduled for the annual December congregational meeting. An information display is being prepared to be shared with the congregation and at Fish Fry events.

Council Meeting Notes

Detailed minutes are available on request.

Notes from Jan. 27 Council Meeting:

- Treasurers report accepted.
- Mortgage loan for Fellowship Hall/Activity Building is down to \$61,679, with approx. \$32,000 held in the Capital Campaign account. Net to be raised/paid less than \$30,000. Great goal to have it paid off by 150th anniversary.
- Lutheran Men in Mission shared plan for wider engagement with congregation, including youth, and near term plan to invite everyone to some breakfasts for special speakers/sharing times, etc.
- Sanctuary doors project almost complete. Will be keyed to be same as Fellowship Hall to reduce total number of different keys needed.
- Blessed to hear that sanctuary building entry ramps & stairs railings materials and skilled labor being donated, with a workday needed to help with installation.
- Thyatira Pres. has requested assistance with their tutoring ministry. St. Luke's will encourage our members to help
- Council approved 2019 Pastoral Compensation as per congregation approved budget, as required by IRS regulations.
- Council engaged in a conversation regarding baptismal requests and expectations.

--Council heard and endorsed 150th anniversary plans

Notes from Feb. 17 Council Meeting:

- Treasurer's report accepted. Current Fund balance is a bit low due to slightly lower giving in late 2018 and major payment of additional principle on the mortgage.
 - Christian Education announced that Marian Lytle has tendered her resignation as Youth Director, effective May 31, due to time and other limitations. She desires to move to serve in volunteer role as youth Confirmation leader. Christian Ed and St. Luke's council accept the resignation with sadness, and with appreciation for Marian's leadership. Christian Ed is beginning review of job description and needs.
 - Evangelism is preparing a spring Lent/Easter mailer, and hosting a Usher/Greeter lunch & training discussion on March 3.
 - Property announced (1) that the sanctuary doors are almost done, needing adjustments to locking mechanisms (2) A proposal has been received for HVAC maintenance, (3) Narthex roof replacement will begin soon, (4) Parsonage condition and maintenance needs are being reviewed and addressed.
 - Council reviewed Activity Building choices, and voted to recommend a pad & poured polyurethane surface to the congregation, for future vote and approval (probably at Dec congregational meeting) An info/display will be prepared for the Fish Fry.
 - Council reviewed and approved two community recipients for spring Fish Fry community assistance grants, Deborah Williams (handicap van mods) and Cindy Morgan (cancer medical expenses). Other submissions to be considered again in the fall.
 - Council approved Shrove Tues. offering to go to the Lutheran Southern Seminary, and Lent Wed. food contributions to be gathered for Rowan Helping Ministries West food pantry.
- Next meeting Sunday March 17, 7:30 am.*

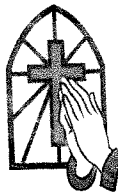

“Grieving Heals”

“When you cry, have you ever noticed how your vision becomes so distorted as the tears form and then your vision becomes so clear the moment the tears begin to flow down your cheeks?”

Recently, someone made this comment during a self-reflective moment regarding the many tears she had shed over the last few weeks. At first I didn't really get it, but, with some thought, I realized that indeed our vision is completely distorted when tears well up in our eyes, and the moment they begin to flow our vision actually becomes remarkably clear.

It is a good metaphor for how grieving works. The purpose of grieving is actually to help us adjust to loss and see the world around us with a new clarity and acceptance. Like the tears, we hold back the pain of grieving as much as we can, but when we let it flow, we understand with our heart and mind the truth of the loss we are experiencing. The biology of crying even reveals that tears contain proteins and hormones that are possibly “waste products” created by pain and stress that need to be released. There is something cleansing and healing about grieving both psychologically and biologically.

In whatever way one approaches the meaning of grieving, it seems that we are created to have this capacity to grieve so we can be close, love one another and invest ourselves fully in relationships. With the God-given capacity to grieve, we can adapt to the inevitability of experiencing loss and therefore take the risk of being close. People who do not allow themselves to grieve can become severely depressed, isolated and relationally paralyzed. Grieving can take a long time when losses are great, so patience and understanding are very important as the tears and the grief flow.

The annual NC Synod Assembly will be held on May 31 – June 1 in Greensboro. Commutable from St Luke's, no hotel overnights away from home required. 1) Catholic \kath-uh-lihk\ or \kath-lihk\ adjective

A word meaning “universal” and therefore often used to describe one part of the Christian family

2) Catholic noun “A Christian who belongs to the Roman Catholic Church”

First of all, forget everything you think you know about the word *catholic*. Forget about Mass every Sunday, priests who can't marry, praying to the Virgin Mary, the sweetly clad old dude who lives at the Vatican, clad-in-plaid children going to private schools, fish on Fridays, and so on. Just forget it.

The word *catholic* actually means “universal.” From very early in the history of the church, the term referred to the believe that even though the church is made of many, many congregations, in many, many, many cities, in many, many, many countries, the church is still *universal*.

Every Christian may belong to a local congregation, but every Christian also shares in a fellowship with every other Christian in the universe. The church is a miracle that is made possible by the power of the Holy Spirit. Our catholicity (now there is a word to impress your friends and relatives) is a gift from God, not something that we do achieve, can achieve, or are expected to achieve.

The church is not limited by geography, race, language, culture, style or worship, or gender (see Galatians 3:28). The church is open to all and includes all who follow Christ.

So what about those Christians who claim the name Catholic for themselves? Yep, they are part of the universal church. And so are you.

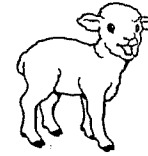
