Happy March, Happy St. Patrick's Day! The month when we are deep in Lent, the 40 days representing the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness. I encourage each of you to take a look at the passages in the synoptic gospels (Mark 1:13; Matthew 4:1–11; Luke 4:1–13) and read through the time Jesus spent in prayer and reflection, not to mention the temptations he had to deal with.

For those of us who have decided to fast from something through the Lenten season, I want you to focus on those temptations you might feel to break that fast. Bringing back the famous 90's saying, think about What Would Jesus Do (WWJD). How did Jesus handle that temptation? Pay a prayer whenever you encounter that thing you are trying to stay away from, or the time of day you might usually enjoy it. Thank God for the freedom and wholeness you have in him, and without that which you are abstaining from. Acknowledge the gifts we have

received from God.

For those of us who have decided to be in prayer through lent, pray for your spiritual renewal. If you are looking for resources there are several out on the internet. You might want to look for the Seven Last Words of Christ through Loyola Press (https://www.loyolapress.com/catholic-resources/liturgical-year/lent/seven-last-words/) as one of those options.

For those who have decided to spend time in the scripture. I invite you to do so through Lectio Divina, a type of holy reading of the scriptures in a way that follows:

- **Step One:** *Read* the passage and *Listen* and pull out what phrase, sentence, or word stands out to vou.
- **Step Two**: *Read* the passage again and *Reflect* on the Word of God. What touched you, what thought or reflection was meaningful. Allow for a moment of silence for reflection
- **Step Three**: *Read* the passage again and *Respond* spontaneously to the Word of God. Be aware of any prayer that rises up within that expresses the experience. Allow for a moment of silent response.
- **Step Four:** *Read* the passage a final time and *Rest* in the word, reflect or pray and allow God to speak in the silence. Allow a longer moment of silent rest.
- **To Go a bit further:** take the phrase, sentence or word that stood out to you into your daily activity and listen to it, reflect on it, pray over it, and rest in it as time allows during the day. Allow it to become part of you.

I wish you all a spirit filled, spiritual renewed, and blessed Lenten season. Let us continue to prepare for the glorious day of Jesus' resurrection.

On March 30th, Flower City will have a one-day conference for any youth in grades 7-12 that would like to register. It is Flower City Conference – Transform 2021! Flower City Work Camp is one practical way, but this life encompasses so much more.

- Home repairs, including painting, flooring, simple construction, cleaning, yard work, and repairing
 or replacing ceilings, windows and doors
- Sidewalk Clubs, at which children play games, sing songs, make crafts, eat snacks and, most importantly, hear the life-changing gospel of Jesus Christ
- Basketball camps where children and teens learn basketball skills, Bible verses and how much God loves them

There are many ways the church can help support the youth in that would like to participate one of them is volunteering for any of the things listed above. There is also a need to help provide lunch for the students and volunteers during the day. 
