How different would Easter feel if it didn't happen in the Springtime?

I can't imagine what it would be like. While we focus on the Resurrection of

Jesus Christ, all the world around is also coming back to life. Daffodils and tulips rise
up from barren poking ground. The quiet of winter is replaced by the wonderful cacophony
of birdsong. Trees bud out before being covered in white and pink flowers. It's like a long,
slow display of fireworks all around us and it's full of life. What better representation of
resurrection can we imagine?

Yet while this season captures so wonderfully the feeling of life returning from death, there is still an important aspect of what we celebrate with Easter that is missing in the rebirth of Spring. When we look around our yards or parks at this time of year, while we see the contrast from the seeming lifelessness of winter, the scenery is more or less like it was last year at this time. The flowers and trees are still in the same place with their same colors as always. The birds are charming, but they're the same birds as previous years. It might be truly wonderful, especially in contrast to winter, but it's no more wonderful that any other Spring we remember. But imagine if your familiar patch of yellow daffodils opened up this year to reveal bright red blooms? Or what if your dogwood had long, flowing, golden chains of flowers this year instead of the simple white blooms it always has? Imagine your tulips growing to the size of palm trees.

I don't actually know if any of that would be an improvement, really, but it would be different, wouldn't it? And that's the point. While we are promised a resurrection to new life after our death, our gift of new life also starts already. Hopefully your life this Easter doesn't look exactly like your life at this time last year, or five or ten or twenty years ago. Hopefully it's way, way better. Hopefully it's more colorful and beautiful, more faithful and more joyful than ever before. Maybe it includes new elements of serving and caring that are new to you. Maybe it includes new relationships with people, even if they are the same people you're always known.

One way or the other, I pray that this Easter season, this Resurrection season will not only have all of the beauty and vitality of Spring, but also something new, something different than ever before. So may your daffodils be bright red, may your tulips grow like palm trees, and may your life be new and different, joyful and faithful as never before.


