I want to thank the whole church for providing me a chance to go to our denomination's General Assembly in Des Moines, Iowa last month. It was an experience of a lifetime which I will always remember. It provided me with

some rest and recreation, but also filled me up with new ideas for our congregation, filled me up with excitement of the Spirit, and gave me a chance to represent Canfield Christian in the wider Church.

While I know some of you have attended assemblies before, many of you probably don't know what this is all about. So let me tell you a bit. Every two years, members and pastors from Disciples of Christ congregations from all across the United States and Canada get together somewhere in North America for a long weekend. There are business meetings for different reports from groups within the denomination. This time, for example, we heard reports from the Division of Overseas Ministries, Disciples Women, the Disciples of Christ Historical Society, and the Christian Board of Publication/Chalice Press, to name a few. Also at these business sessions we voted on several resolutions as a denomination. Some of the more notable this year included Addressing the State of Forced Global Migration, A Call to See and Respond to the Crisis of Domestic and Intimate Partner Violence, Full Communion with the United Church of Canada, and Declaring that Impartially Providing for the Basic Human Needs If Others is a Virtue Consistent with Disciples Tradition, (all of which passed, by the way).



There was a large exhibit hall where different organizations, colleges, seminaries, and ministry partners had set up displays to let folks know more about what they were doing and how they could help folks in the congregations. It was like being at the fair except it was all church related.





I also had many opportunities to get together with old friends from seminary, from my former congregation, or other colleagues I haven't seen for a while. Not only did we enjoy catching up on our families and congregations, but we also got to share about the work we are doing and the different ways we have met challenges or taken advantage

of opportunities. Beyond that, it was a good chance to recognize that I am part of a very large community of ministers and lay leaders, all of us doing the same work, just in different places.



We also had big, wonderful worship services every day together with some of the best preachers in the denomination. We heard from our General Minister and President, Rev. Terri Hord Owens, the first African-American woman to preside over a large denomination. On the last day of the convention we were



lead by Rev. Dr. William Barber II in what I have to describe as the most inspiring sermon I have ever heard in my entire life. Oh, and the music! (All of the worship services are available for streaming on the denomination's website, if you'd like to hear/see some of them for yourself.)

All combined, it made me feel like a sponge that was so entirely saturated with the Holy Spirit that I couldn't take any more. I am so eager and excited to share these things with all of you. Look for ways that we will be branching out in some new directions. Get together with me for coffee or lunch and let's talk about some of the stories and new possibilities we can be inspired by and can share to inspire others.



So, again, thank you for generously providing me a chance to go and share in this experience. It was amazingly good for me and I think it will be very good for the rest of us here, too. Hopefully we will have more of us go next year to our Regional Assembly, here in Ohio. It's like a small version of the General Assembly. Then, in two years, maybe a whole bunch of us can go down to Louisville, Kentucky for General Assembly, 2021!

Canned meat: tuna, Spam, Vienna sausage, ham, chicken, turkey, salmon

Fruit: peaches, fruit cocktail, pears, applesauce, pineapple

Soup: all kinds

Condiments: peanut butter, spaghetti sauce, pancake syrup, jelly, apple butter, preserves

Lunch/Dinner: potatoes, spaghetti, noodles, macaroni & cheese dinner, rice, dry beans, beef stew,
