

TOUCHING LIVES WITH COMPASSION, UNDERSTANDING AND HOPE

One of the things I enjoyed most at the General Assembly in Des Moines this year was having a chance to attend several workshops. One of them was about the importance of telling the stories of our church and our members. It not only made a lot of sense; it also inspired new ideas and ways we could grow in depth as well as number.

When folks look at a congregation's website or information flyer, they'll often find things about the history of the congregation or its building. They might find a schedule for events or group meetings. They'll see the times for worship or maybe even a place to give money. While all of that can be helpful, it really doesn't tell them what this particular congregation is like, what makes it unique or special. It doesn't tell them why people come to that church or what they might find there.

By telling our stories and sharing them with others, we can let people really know who we are. We can let them get to know us, both as individuals and as a church family. Those are the things prospective visitors want to know. Those stories will paint a much more faithful picture of just who it is that worships here and what they love about this place and its people. It lets new folk know what they can expect to find here.

A few weeks ago I announced in a sermon my intention to start doing interviews with church members. (If you weren't here for that, now you know!) We have some incredible people here. You, reading this right now, are one of them!

Each of us brings a unique insight into the nature of God and how the Lord has worked in our life's story. That's good news that others want to hear. That's the kind of thing that separated us from other groups or communities. Each of us is here for a reason, and the reason is always going to go back to some way that God has entered our lives and led us here.

Those are the same kind of stories we read in the Bible. Those are the stories that make up our church history. Those are the stories that we still have to share today. We are part of the ongoing story of Jesus Christ and people are hungry for that story.

To help you think about your story, consider these questions: What is your earliest experience you can recall where you learned something about the Lord? What stories or passages from the Bible have helped shape who you are? When was a time that you felt the presence of God most clearly? What are some of your biggest doubts or worries? What message would you most want other people to know?

Hebrews 12:1 talks about how we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, those who have come before us and are all around us that have provided us with a rich story of faith. Each one of you is part of that cloud for others. Just as you have been touched and inspired by the stories of incredible people from Scripture and throughout the ages, your story can do the same for others.

Please consider these questions. Maybe write them down. Consider sharing them with others or providing them for The Clarion or the church's website. I'd love to help you with that. I want to hear your stories, and so do other people. Because your story is part of the same, ongoing story of Jesus Christ. And we love to tell that old, old story.

Disciples Heritage Corner

Sarah Lue Bostick was among the first African American women ordained to the Christian ministry in the late 19th century. She labored as a field worker from Tennessee to Texas for the Christian Woman's Board of Missions and the National Christian Missionary Society. She carried on her successful work for over 40 years, until her retirement in 1938.

A devoted worker for the Christian Woman's Board of Missions, Sarah Lue Bostick worked tirelessly on behalf of African-American ministers and congregations. She made bonnets by hand and donated the proceeds to a host of missions.

As she worked to established CWBM auxiliaries across Arkansas she amassed a spectacular collection of missions' literature, which, upon her death in 1948 were preserved and donated to Disciples of Christ Historical Society. Her materials open an unparalleled window into women's and African-American studies in the Stone-Campbell movement from the close of the nineteenth to the middle of the twentieth centuries.

Milton is thankful to the church for letting him serve and we are thankful to have such an inspired and eager servant of the Lord to work with our children and youth.


