Pastor's Message

mmanuel is a powerful word for a strange season! As I prepare this newsletter article, our church has recently returned to online worship out of an abundance of caution. Reading through the news shows a nation and a people that are preparing for difficult days after an already strange season.

In the midst of this, Christ takes on the name "Emmanuel." Emmanuel translates from Biblical Hebrew to "God with us." In a season where the world can seem far off, God comes near. When we share the story of how God came close in Bethlehem, we recall how Jesus' story has warmed hearts throughout history. Christ did not come for the people of Bethlehem or Nazareth alone. Jesus did not draw near to shepherds or wisemen alone. People have found comfort in a child born for all of us for centuries even though they themselves never saw the star over Bethlehem.

How can this Christmas be a season of hope when we cannot sing the same songs in the same way? How can this season be a season of light when everything is strange? God is with us! The word Emmanuel is as much a call to actions as it is a theological statement. In his letter to the church in Ephesus, Paul encouraged the church to embrace their place in the world as he wrote "...we are what [God] has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life." (Ephesians 2:10, NRSV)

The season ahead appears to be another season of isolation for many people in this world. In the midst of such a challenging time, we are still called to a life of good works! If we were farmers, we might see our calling as a calling to cast seeds of hope into the world. If we were bakers, we might see our role as one of spreading yeast into the world's flour. A note from the Trustees....

After canceling meetings during the COVID lockdown, the Trustees are getting back to work. We recently had a fall work bee to spruce up the property around the church. A good group of workers turned out on Saturday, October 31st and accomplished a lot of work trimming, mowing, leaf collecting, weed-eating and mulching. Thank you to everyone who joined the bee on a day when they surely had work to do at home. You all are a blessing to our church.



Generally, the church has survived over the past several months, but we hate to go through a year without some major issue popping up. A few weeks ago we had a powerful rainstorm. Heavy rains lashed the church from multiple directions. The storm was over quickly, but a lot of rain came down. The cleaning folks from Jay's Cleaning were doing a deep clean in the church to prepare for our safe reopening on November 1st. Jean Jay called me to say a significant quantity of water came into the basement hallway at the base of the stairway leading up to the parking lot. They mopped up the water, and it stopped coming in. However, we knew we had a problem. Bill Grove contacted Midstate Basement Authority, because we knew we had water seeping in through the deep foundation after certain types of rainfall. The short answer is that we have to do something about the issue. Midstate Basement Authority is a local firm with a solid reputation. We asked for a proposal, and the work will involve digging out the foundation around the stairway and along the church wall between the two exterior entrance stairs. The cost estimate is about \$10,000 - \$11,000, which does not include resurfacing the wall of the basement stairwell and replacing excavated blacktop that has to be removed as access to the foundation is established. The Trustees will discuss this at our November 18th meeting. The repairs can wait until Spring, since we don't want to get into excavation during winter weather. We will fill you in as we determine how we will proceed. We will get through this as we always do. I could insert a Forrest Gump quote, but I will spare you.

A new refrigerator had to be purchased for the parsonage. I want to thank Cal Organ and his son for helping with the in and out move of refrigerators. As always seems to happen, the old unit door had to be removed to fit through a doorway. The delivery folks couldn't help with that. Thanks, Cal.

Another thank you goes to Bill Grove for replacing the mechanical innards of the toilet in the small church bathroom. Never a fun job, Bill did it with a smile.

Another thank you goes out to Kelly Brower and Spencer for spending many hours finishing up the audio improvements for Zoom services. A lot of time and effort went into that, and the results are excellent.

Finance Update...



Whether it was from your checkbook, time, or service, it has and is enabling the work started over two centuries ago to proceed. We have lived through some challenging events in the past several years, and it is not over yet. We remain stable financially and socially connected in our service to the Lord because you have given in faith to His service.

Your financial statement, which summarizes the monetary contribution you made from January 1, 2020 to November 15, 2020 is being mailed to you this week. Keep an eye out for it. Please look it over carefully to see if it agrees with your records. Let us know if there are any discrepancies. Also, please submit any other donations which you would like to appear on your statement for 2020 before December 31, 2020. That will

give us time to enter the data and print out your final copy in the most expeditious manner.

The stewardship letter along with a self-addressed/stamped envelope and pledge cards should be in the mail near the time you receive this newsletter.
