



I bid you grace and peace in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord! We have now entered into our second month of social distancing and for many it has been a challenge. Yet, I praise God for the many places and spaces where I have seen God at work in the midst of this thing called social distancing.

At Mount Olivet there has been a Sunday school class meeting via phone conferencing. It has been a blessing to take part in these moments of community, fellowship and learning. Meanwhile at Floral Hills, I am constantly impressed by the love you have for each other. Each time I call someone from our congregation I hear a report of how other members have been checking in on each other. – It is truly a blessing to serve both churches and to see God at work in different ways based upon the individual context of each congregation.

I know that all of us miss seeing each other in person. Some have asked when we might be able to gather together again. Bishop Lewis in a letter to the conference wrote "Governor Northam's statewide stay-at-home order is in effect until June 10. As such, in-person worship cannot take place until June 11. If the Governor's executive order is rescinded or revised before June 10, we will re-evaluate the status of in-person worship."

I know June 10th seems far away, but I want you to know that I am here for you. If you have any ideas on how I can facilitate conversation/fellowship or if you'd like to see me try something different please let me know. I will continue to record sermons and post them on the website along with Facebook and/or YouTube. I will also continue to mail out manuscripts to those who do not have access to the internet, and I will continue to call and check in on you.

Before I close this letter, I wanted to share some thoughts that came to me after reading an article. This week as I was scrolling through Facebook an article I read said "Stewardship is a person's responsibility to manage God's property. During this time of "no church" we still have the responsibility to take care of the church. Let's become "Good Stewards" during this pandemic. Let's take care of God's church and make sure the church will be ready to proclaim the Word of God in the future. Jesus gave us 2350 verses about money and possessions. 15% of everything Jesus said – has to do with money."[1]

Our tithes not only keep the doors open, and pay the salaries of staff, our tithes also become a means of sharing Christ to the world as it helps pay for education, chaplains, clean water and other vital embodiments of Christ through our apportionment's dollars and our missional giving as a church.

FROM DS DENISE:

"To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul. O my God, in you I trust." -Psalm 25:1a

It seems like we are living in "dog years" doesn't it? It will be May 1st tomorrow, and we have been "staying at home" since March 15. I remember the date, because I came back from the Farmville District on Sat, March 14th, and had a full week ahead of me in Danville, beginning on March 15. I haven't been out much in my car. One or two trips to Kroger to pick up the "click-list", with a side-trip to Starbucks and a Target pick-up, that's it. I still have the same tank of gas in my car that I had on Mar. 14, and I typically fill-up multiple times each week. Seems a lot longer than 6 weeks though.

Those first 2 weeks were filled with a flurry of activity, figuring out how to do this. Watching the reports like a hawk, making sure we had enough toilet paper (thankfully, my son-in-law has taken over that duty) and keeping an open Kroger pick-up time, just in case we ran out of anything. Now, though it feels like we have been in this state *forever*. But, every time I feel impatient or frustrated with the state of COVID, I remember those who are going to work each day, inundated by contagious sick and dying people; those who are going into Kroger each day and all night to be sure my click-list gets filled; those who aren't able to work at home and have no wages, or those who must work in potentially infectious environments.

The news continues to be tough. With over 1,000,000 cases and 60,000 deaths, we are not clear of this yet. We are starting to look to the future, and I just pray we will be appropriately cautious and careful not to make things worse. We miss being together, but we know that being apart now, and for a while longer, means that we are caring for our neighbor, even if it means personal sacrifice. We can feel weighed down by all of this. However, when I let the words of this psalm pour over me, I feel calm restored in my soul. These words from the psalmist give us direction as we sort through what it all means. If we continue to lift our souls, our worries, our questions, our loved ones and our lives to the Lord, we will find peace. We can trust in God, to guide and direct us as we move through this space and whatever lies ahead. Even though life is different now, the work of the church continues as you connect in new ways, feed those who are hungry, pray for those who are sick, and cry with those who mourn. Life may well be a bit different even when we can be together, but we will adapt and keep our eyes and hearts fixed on Jesus. We will keep **BEING** the church, just as we have been, are now, and ever more will be. We can trust God to make that so, through us.
