

I fully understand that people want to focus their attention on the liturgy and not be distracted by noises in the church, however, let's consider what Jesus had to say on the subject of children when adults began to push them away so that the "adult" interactions could take place:

"And they were bringing children to Him that He might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, He was indignant and said to them, 'Let the children come to Me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it.' And He took them in His arms and blessed them, laying His hands on them." – Mark 10:13-16

This account was so important that it is included in Matthew's, Mark's and Luke's Gospels. Turning toward someone with a noisy baby or child and giving them an angry glare might successfully convince them to take the child out of the church, but it also might mean that family won't want to return for a long time, if at all. Is that really the message we want to send? Friends, we have no idea what is going on in peoples' lives, and this short period of time in church may just be the difference in their life that will help them to believe that God is at work and that there is hope. As the church continue to grow and impact new lives, let us all be mindful of the words of Jesus. We know that children are a gift to the church, so we should do our best to welcome, smile, encourage, help and bless all. Pastor John
