#### Making the Most of Holy Week

Palm Sunday is the start of what Christians refer to as "Holy Week." It is a week full of emotional highs and lows with the celebration of Palm Sunday to the face to face encounter with the Old Rugged Cross.

Many denominations observe Holy Week with different traditions and practices. However, what draws us altogether as Christians is the most unifying element of the Church's belief: Jesus laid down His life for us and then was resurrected three days later.

Beginning on the evening of Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday morning, the entire church year focuses like a laser beam on the center point of agreement in the Gospels and in the Christian community: the passion and resurrection of Jesus.

As we remember the events of that first Holy Thursday, the scriptures focuses on the Last Supper as recounted in John's gospel. Here we listen to the words spoken at the last supper, and then witness the



humble act of Jesus washing of the feet of the disciples. The resounding note of the Last Supper is Jesus' saying, "Do this in memory of me," making it clear that no one can escape the message that all those who follow Jesus are called to be servants.



Then on Good Friday, around 3:00 p.m., we should take a moment and reflect and thank Jesus for the suffering He endured for us on that cross. I would also suggest that you make time in the morning to read the account

of Good Friday in the book of Luke. Yes, it is a story that you have heard many times, however, there is tremendous power in reading the account of what occurred that fateful day on Good Friday itself. This will help to bring to life these events and prepare us for Easter Sunday.


