Church Guidelines for Worship Services

If you are "Fully" Vaccinated

"Fully" meaning you have had both shots of either Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna or 1 shot of Johnson & Johnson and 2 weeks has passed since your last vaccination.



You may worship with or without a mask as you feel comfortable

Entering in and out of the church

Singing of songs and hymns

No need for social distancing

Participate in Fellowship if offered

Walking on church property

If you are NOT "Fully" Vaccinated

"Fully" meaning you have <u>NOT</u> had both shots of either Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna or 1 shot of Johnson & Johnson and 2 weeks has <u>NOT</u> passed since your last vaccination.



You may worship with a mask with the following restrictions

Mask must be worn at all times including entering in and out of the church

Mask must be worn at all times including when singing of songs and hymns

Social distancing is encouraged

Participate in Fellowship if offered with mask on

Mask must be worn at all times including when walking on church grounds

How To Call In & Hear Messages:


How to Listen to Services by Phone
