Note from the pastor...

I wanted to just offer a few words of clarity regarding the Long Ridge church and our relationship with Gaylordsville. At the present time, Long Ridge is considered to be a sister church, we have not moved onto a campus status of Bethel at the moment. I expect that to happen in 2020. Some are under the impression that this is a temporary arrangement. The way the conference works is that a pastor is assigned for one year from June to July. So technically, I'm serving Bethel and Long Ridge until June 30 of 2020. However, I believe that I will of course stay in Bethel, and probably stay on for another year or more in Long Ridge. With that being said, our relationship with Gaylordsville has changed. Because we are now connected to Long Ridge, it would be impossible for me to continue offering leadership at Gaylordsville. One of the challenges we faced with our north campus was distance. Long Ridge is less than 9 minutes from Bethel, Gaylordsville is over 30. The conference made the decision to allow Gaylordsville to stand on their own and no longer be a campus of Bethel. I just wanted to offer some clear direction of what is happening and what we can expect going forward. This is a very exciting time for Bethel and Long Ridge. 
# **Brotherhood or Sisterhood of Christ?**

**Ushers**: Serve once per month or be a backup. Arrive 15 minutes before start of service. Assist folks in finding seats, restrooms, classrooms, etc. Collect offering. Clean up sanctuary after service. **Leader: Alan Brown** 

**Greeters:** Serve once per month or be a backup. Arrive 15 minutes before start of service. Greet guests and congregation members as they arrive for worship. Provide bulletins.

**Leader: Alan Brown** 

**Safety Committee:** This committee is a sub-committee of the Trustee board. This committee works with the Trustee board to evaluate, create and help implement plans to make our sanctuary as safe as possible. This includes plan of response to emergencies, evacuations and safety protocols. **Leader: Victor Holomakoff** 

**Communion Stewards**: Serve once per month or be a backup. Arrive 15 minutes before start of service. Help serve communion and then clean up after service. **Leader: Pastor John** 

**Readers:** Serve once per month or be a backup. Arrive 15 minutes before start of service. Read Call to Worship or Scripture for message. Can also serve communion if desired.

**Leader: Pastor John** 

**Trustees**: Meetings are once per month on a Tuesday night. Meetings are typically 90 minutes. Trustees major charge is to make decisions that impact the use and upkeep of our church buildings. **Leader: Deb Albin** 

**Recycling Committee:** This committee is a sub-committee of the Trustee board. Meetings are held after church on Sundays as needed. This committee works with the Trustee board to offer suggestions on how we can make our church more environmentally friendly.

**Leader: Alan Durnin** 

**Finance:** Meetings are once per month on a Tuesday night. Meetings are typically 90 minutes. Finance major charge is to make decisions that impact the funds that are donated and generated from rental incomes and fundraisers. Finance also handles our annual stewardship campaign. **Leader: Dave Morey** 

**Outreach**: Meetings are typically every other month. Meetings are typically 90 minutes. Outreach major charge is to create, plan and execute any Outreach activities we have in our community. These include backpacks for children and gifts for families during the holidays. Outreach job is to help spread the gospel of Christ outside of the church. **Leader: Carol Morey** 

**Music Ministry:** This includes, Choir, Bell Choir and Praise Team. The Music Ministry provides music for our worship services and other events as needed. Time requirements vary upon position. **Leader: Jessica Bardelli** 

**Education:** Meetings are quarterly and when needed. Meetings are typically 60 minutes. This includes oversight of Sunday School, Youth Programming and Adult Education. A Youth Coordinator and Adult Coordinator are needed, as well as others to make decisions concerning Christian Education. **Leader: Ann McLellan**
