

Week 3: God Made People Genesis 1:26-31; 2:7,15-24; 3:20

God had made a wonderful world. He created day and night, the sky and water and dry land. He made plants and trees and grass to grow on the land. He made the sun to shine during the day and the moon and stars to shine at night. He made all the animals in the water, in the sky, and on land. After God made all the animals on the sixth day, He made a man to live in the world. The man, named Adam, lived in the garden of Eden. God told Adam to take care of the garden. God brought all the animals to Adam and told him to give each animal a name. God decided the man should not be alone, so He made a woman. Adam named the woman Eve. She was Adam's helper. Adam and Eve were the first people. God made them different from the animals. They were able to think and make choices.

LIVE IT OUT

God made everything-especially us! He made the first humans, Adam and Eve! Read Genesis 1:26-27, " Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness. They will rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, all the earth, and the creatures that crawl on the earth.' So God created man in His own image; He created him in the image of God; He created them male and female. " People are made in God's image! Gather a few pipe cleaners and do a craft with your child. Help your child to create two stick people out of the pipe cleaners. Tell them to pretend their pipe cleaner people are Adam and Eve! God makes people in His image!

Week 3: Adam and Eve Sinned Genesis 3

In the garden, the serpent came to Eve. The serpent was very tricky and evil. He asked Eve, "Did God really say you can't eat from any tree in the garden?" Eve answered, "We can eat from any of the trees except the tree in the middle. If we do, we will die." The serpent said, "You won't die. You will be like God." Eve ate the fruit. She gave some to Adam. He ate the fruit, too. Then Adam and Eve knew they had done something wrong. God found them hiding in the garden. God said, "Did you eat from the tree that I told you not to?" Adam said, "Eve gave me some and I ate it." Eve said, "The serpent tricked me and I ate the fruit." God cursed the serpent. He punished Adam and Eve. God still loved Adam and Eve, but He made them leave the garden.

LIVE IT OUT

Have you ever chosen your way over God's way? This is called sin. Adam and Eve were the first people to sin, and their sin broke their relationship with God. God did not stop loving Adam and Eve when they sinned, but He could no longer allow them to be in His presence. He devised a rescue plan to bring Adam and Eve back into relationship with Him. Get a sheet of paper and a marker. Your family has two minutes to brainstorm about 10 choices your child might make every day at school, home, or church, such as when to work on homework, what to wear, or who to play with. Choose two members of your family to be the Encourager and Recorder. Explain to your family that the Encourager will urge group members to think of ideas and the Recorder will write ideas on the paper. After your family has listed some choices ask these questions: What were some choices that you could make at school? What choices could you make at home? What happens if we make a wrong choice? When we make a wrong choice, we have to accept the consequences of that choice. If you choose not to do your math homework, you might not get a passing grade in math. Often our wrong choices lead to sin. But no matter how often we sin, we can ask God to forgive us, because He sent Jesus His Son as the rescue plan!
