"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."—1 Corinthians 12:4-7

During this time after Epiphany, our second lessons come from 1 Corinthians When Paul writes this letter, the major controversy is about spiritual gifts. February 6—Men's Bible Study at Apparently there are some superstars in the church who claim to have special knowledge or spiritual insights into who God is and/or can speak in special tongues or languages that no one else can understand. Everyone else's gifts are seen as unimportant or unnecessary. A huge part of Paul's project in this letter is to convince everyone that they have their own spiritual gifts and that they need each other.

I have been reflecting on this a lot lately. As many of you have heard by now, my last Sunday at Resurrection will be March 3. While I look forward to serving two new congregations (St. John Lutheran and Trinity Episcopal, both in Three Rivers, MI), I will grieve. I will grieve most of all because I will miss you all who have been such a warm part of my life the last few years. And I will also February 14—Holy Whine at grieve because things will not be the same. We will not be in weekly, sometimes Rembrant's @ 5:30 pm more than weekly, contact with each other. We will not worship together. Things will be different, and there's no denying it: different can be hard.

But one thing I will not grieve is this: ministry as the body of Christ in Madison will continue at Resurrection. While I am grateful for and proud of the work I have been able to do alongside all of you, 3.5 years has been more than enough for me to appreciate many of the spiritual gifts that you all bring to the table: love, hospitality, generosity, community, faithfulness, empathy, resourcefulness, stick-to-it-ive-ness, and, of course, the best knifflies in the state, bar none. Those won't change because they are gifts that the Holy Spirit has given all of you. And this is the Spirit of Jesus Christ, the one who promises us, "I am with you always (Mt 28:20)," and, "I will not leave you orphaned (Jn 14:18)."

As I prepare for my final month here, I am especially excited about one thing, and it is this: Since I have been dating, engaged to, and married to Nikki Smith, I have discovered the amazing spiritual gifts that she has for ministry. After several long years of delays, of false starts, of putting things on hold, I am just so excited to get to see her use her gifts when she is finally called to be an ordained minister of Word and Sacrament in Kalamazoo, MI.

Her ordination will be on Feb. 17 at 2pm at Resurrection. We chose this location because you are our church family, and we love you from the bottom of our hearts. If you can make it on that afternoon, please consider this your personal invitation. We are grateful for all you have done for us, and it would mean the world to both of us for you to join us in this celebration of what the Spirit is doing in her life and in the life of Christ's Church that is united across all times and places.

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry had a very busy year in 2018 as the number of individuals served soared versus the prior year. Individuals served during the year rose 44% versus 2017 and is up 139% from 2015.

The Food Pantry was able to provide food to 1,278 family members during 2018 compared to 890 in the prior year. Additionally, 357 families were fed versus 261 in 2017. (Note: Some families visit multiple months and therefore are counted multiple times).

Increases were even more dramatic in the last quarter of 2018. In the fourth quarter of the year, families served rose by 66% compared to 2017 and 419 individuals were provided food. During 2018, the pantry expanded by offering fresh produce most months. Additionally, in November and December the needy were given the components for special holiday meals including canned turkey in November and ham in December.

The increase in community need did stress the pantry's resources in the year. However, the Pantry was fortunate to have many different church members volunteer throughout the year. In the final months of the year, between 8 and 12 volunteers helped each month completing various tasks including checking-in visitors, helping guests make food selections, providing hospitality to guests as they wait and carrying food packages out to visitor cars. More volunteers are always welcomed. Additionally, the generosity of congregation members with both special financial gifts and food donations allowed us to have adequate resources despite the significant increase in those served.

The officers for 2018 were Gayle Podczerwinski (President), Sue Fairchild (Vice-President), Melissa Dunn (Secretary), Susan Graham (Treasurer) and Anne Fisse (Food Czar).

WELCA's checking account balance at 2018 year end was \$1843.55. The largest expenditures for the year were \$1000 toward kitchen updating and \$450 toward window repair.
