IMAGINE

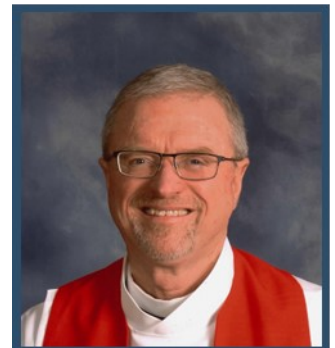
Imagine with me for a moment. We've just been through two years of Covid. Many people have been sick from Covid and some have died. The past two years have surely given cause for folks to stop and think...

Good Stewardship

What is good stewardship? We might often ask that of others; however, how about a bit of self-examination? Personally, this is something that I do not approach often or with relish. It's so much easier to convince myself that I'm doing my part without really examining what good stewardship is all about . . . especially in relationship to Scripture.



First, let's go to *Merriam-Webster*: When *stewardship* first appeared in English during the Middle Ages, it functioned as a job description, denoting the office of a *steward*, or manager of a large household. Over the centuries, its range of reference spread to the oversight of law courts, employee unions, college dining halls, Masonic lodges, and many other organizations. In recent years, the long-established "management" sense of *stewardship* has evolved a positive meaning, "**careful and responsible management.**" This sense is commonly found nowadays in contexts such as "*stewardship* of the environment, the family business," etc. It also occasionally appears as an adjective in phrases such as "*stewardship* fundraising" (that is, fundraising aimed at building good relationships with donors in order to keep them loyal).

How does all that translate to how we view stewardship in our church? It certainly expands how we *should* look at stewardship. It's not just about our giving in the autumn of the year — it covers so much more. I found some synonyms for stewardship: care, conduct, guidance, oversight, administration, handling, and management. There are also words relating to stewardship: custody, guardianship, safekeeping, trust, monitoring, shepherding, and trusteeship. All these words certainly fall into the definition described in the paragraph above, but do they also apply to Scripture?

God gives us all we have and He expects us to manage and take care of those gifts. Beginning in *Genesis*, God tells us to be in charge and take care of all He gives us.

Genesis 1:28: ²⁸ God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

Gen 2:15: ¹⁵ The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.

Adam and Eve were immediately put to work to take care of the Garden . . . **for God!!** Later in *Genesis* we see another story about good stewardship and how the Lord blesses those who take care of what's been given.

Gen 39:4-6: ⁴ Joseph found favor in his eyes and became his attendant. Potiphar put him in charge of his household, and he entrusted to his care everything he owned. ⁵ From the time he put him in charge of his household and of all that he owned,

the Lord blessed the household of the Egyptian because of Joseph. The blessing of the Lord was on everything Potiphar had, both in the house and in the field. ⁶ So Potiphar left everything he had in Joseph's care; with Joseph in charge, he did not concern himself with anything except the food he ate.

We all know the tale of Joseph and how his brothers sold him into slavery, how he rose to power in Egypt, and how he saved his people from starvation. As Joseph eventually told his brothers in Genesis 45:8 — ⁸ "So then, it was not you who sent me here, but God." God's plan fulfilled because Joseph was a great steward and obeyed the Lord. We see this same thread in the New Testament. In 1 Corinthians 4:2 it says,

² Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful.

Again, we are given the task to manage something as God would manage it . . . to take care of what's been entrusted as if it belonged to God (which, in fact, it does!!).

When it comes to money, we also are told:

Luke 16:11: ¹¹ So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches?

True riches? Riches beyond worldly wealth? We also see this idea of money in the Gospel parable of the bags of gold as described in Matthew 25:14-30. (You know, about the man going on a journey and entrusting wealth to his servants. How two gained wealth for the master by being responsible and good stewards. How one dug a hole in the ground to store the gold because he was afraid to lose the master's money. How the master was unhappy with that servant and took the gold from him and gave it to the one with the most.) God does reward those who are good and faithful servants . . . stewards!!

These Scripture passages add a different dimension when it comes to stewardship. No, it doesn't replace or supersede our giving of treasure, but expands it. It challenges us to look at our lives as being in charge of *all* the gifts God gives us — yes, our treasures, but also our gifts of talent and the responsibilities in our lives that affect those around us. As it is written in 1 Peter 4:10:

¹⁰ Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

It's really easy (at least, for me) to look outside and, at the same time, ignore my own shortcomings in this area. I feel it's time to look to the Lord and pray about how I can become a better steward of the gifts God has bestowed upon me. How can we all be better stewards of His gifts? How can we all walk a bit closer with our Lord? Next month will be about tithing as a part of stewardship.

STEPHEN MINISTRY TRAINING 2022

Stephen Ministry Training will be taking place at Holy Trinity from March – June. Training consists of 50 hours of class time including lecture, discussions and role play, plus pre-class reading assignments. Training topics include: feelings, listening, assertiveness, confidentiality, empathy, distinctive Christian caring, praying with others, boundaries, process based care, crisis theory, referring to mental health professionals, grief, depression, suicide and more. It is intensive, but life changing. Holy Trinity

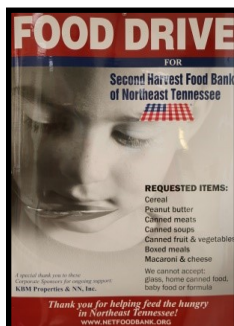
has been a Stephen Ministry Congregation for over 35 years. Stephen Ministers are trained to provide confidential Christian Caregiving one-on one care to persons in our congregation who are experiencing a crisis for as long as the care receiver needs (sometimes a year or more, sometimes a few months). It is NOT counseling, but rather a listening, caring Christian to walk through a crisis with the care receiver. The relationships are confidential, so it is not a ministry at HTLC that you hear a lot about. However, it is still a vital ministry that changes lives.

We ask HTLC members to keep the future Stephen Ministers and their Leaders/Teachers (Loretta Nitschke and Brenda Hrivnak) and the Stephen Ministry at HTLC in your prayers in the coming months. If we missed talking to someone who is interested, please contact Loretta or Brenda immediately and we will be happy to tell you more.

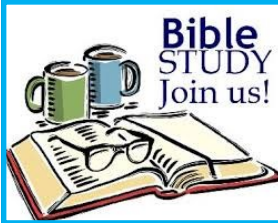


Altar Flowers

Authentic Christianity: How Lutheran Theology Speaks to a Postmodern World.

Burned-out believers and spiritual secularists have given up any hope that an engaging and meaningful spirituality can be found in a single Christian denomination. So rather than attending worship at a local church, they attend to their spiritual needs elsewhere. Instead of being fed by a single denomination, they feast upon a smorgasbord of spiritual beliefs.

To counter this trend, churches across America are constantly updating their culture to accord with the secular culture.

Authentic Christianity offers another idea—that the Lutheran tradition embodies a framework of Christianity that uniquely addresses the postmodern condition. It does so not by being “emergent” or by making up a new approach to church or to the Christian life. Rather, it does so in an unexpected way: by being confessional, sacramental, and vocational.

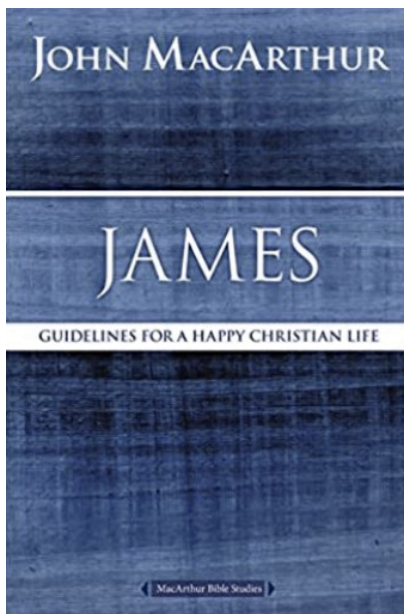
New Topic starting March 30

James. Guidelines for a Happy Christian Life.

The apostle James, the oldest half-brother of Jesus, was a key leader in the Jerusalem church. During the early days of the young church, the Jewish believers had been scattered by persecution. Out of compassion, James wrote this epistle to confront them and motivate them to test the quality and consistency of their faith.

In this short and powerful book, James gives us practical guidance on issues that also measure our true and living faith and our spiritual fruitfulness. He encourages us to “be doers of the word, and not hearers only,” to “draw near to God,” and “to be patient . . . until the coming of the Lord” (James 1:22; 4:8; 5:7). James calls all believers—then and now—to live a life that demonstrates saving faith marked by godly behavior.

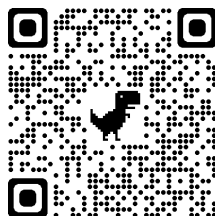
