FROM THE PASTOR

From the (Interim) Pastor...

We are now in the depths of the Lenten season of the church year. The Sunday scripture texts remind us that Jesus is on a journey to the cross. It is a serious time as we contemplate the sacrifice of our Savior and the meaning of this sacrifice in our lives.

Of course, as I walk through the store aisles it appears the season is about candy, bunnies, and eggs. Go figure! While we have managed as a society to corrupt just about every Christian holy day...(oops, sorry, I didn't mean to go off on a predictable rant).

Okay, so let's focus instead on the one Holy Day that is still completely Christian – Good Friday. This most significant of observances is mostly overlooked, however. I have said for many years that if it were up to me, in order to get in to the Easter Service we would first have to be present at the Good Friday service. Sure, this is a radical idea, but it is Biblical. Within each individual Gospel account, the persons who were at the empty tomb on Easter were all present at the foot of the cross on Good Friday. The good news of the Resurrection must be received in the context of the Crucifixion! To simply jump from Palm Sunday “Hosanna” to Easter “Christ is Risen” is to deny the cross.

On Good Friday, April 19, we will observe the service of Tenebrae to remind us of the seven sayings of Jesus from the cross. The form of our worship will be the Swedish Litany. Please reserve the evening for this time of reflection.

News from our ... **Church Council**

Summary of Council Meeting Minutes March 11, 2019 (Page 1 of 2)

Call committee: Edna Kinner reported the final copy of our Ministry Site Profile (MSP) has been submitted to Synod and the Call Committee is now in the “Quiet Phase” of the Call Process. Pastor Moravitz will review potential candidates. Pastor Bangle said that the MSP has been posted online so it can be viewed by any pastor in the ELCA.

Christian Education: Council reviewed the proposed revision (as of March 2019) of HTLC Policy to Prevent the Abuse of Children and the HTLC Participation Covenant Statement. Discussion noted the importance of these policies for children but also for the protection of volunteers and Holy Trinity. A training schedule will need to be implemented along with the background check payment policy. Council determined that Holy Trinity would pay for the necessary background checks. A few minor edits noted. These changes will be reviewed by Outreach (Family Promise), Christian Education and Youth committees and suggestions regarding the noted training implementation schedule and background check policy. Return of a recommendation by these committees to Council in April for final approval is anticipated as Family Promise is scheduled for April 21-28.

Worship & Music: Susan Waters, our new part-time musician played organ on Sunday. Worship & Music committee recommended a “Funeral Policy for Compensation of Musician Policy” that includes a fee for our musician to play at funerals and to a substitute if our musician is not available. The policy will be on file.

- Building use approval submitted by Jeannie Fortier for:
 1. **Planning of the Family Promise Fundraiser on Saturday, August 10, 2019 from 10 AM – 2 PM using the Kitchen and Fellowship Hall**
 2. **Family Promise Fundraiser on Saturday, November 9, 2019 from 9 AM – 3 PM using the Gathering Room** were both approved by Council.
- Building use approval form submitted by Justin Bruegemann to use the **Sanctuary on April 13, 2019 from 10 AM – 5 PM for Joby Bell Master Class and Practice** in conjunction with AGO for young organists was approved by Council.
- Building use approval form submitted by Laura Mitchell of Christian Education to use the **Fellowship Hall and the Kitchen on April 13, 2019 from 8:30 AM – 3:30 PM for a Women’s Retreat** was approved by Council. It was noted that both groups knew they would be using the church on the same date but in different areas and they agreed that this would not be a conflict. Justin has agreed to make sure all doors were locked when his group leaves.

News from our ... **Church Council**

Summary of Council Meeting Minutes March 11, 2019 (Page 2 of 2)

- Property committee recommendations
 1. Replacement of the Fellowship Hall HVAC by AAA-1 Heating & Cooling for \$25,043.00. After much discussion Council requested that the Property committee obtain another quote, if possible. Council does agree that this is a necessary capital improvement that should be done with funding from the DeBusk Bequest. This will be addressed again at the April meeting.
 2. Replacement of the Sanctuary doors with new glass doors with panic bars and to install a panic bar on the chapel door as a capital expenditure with funding from the De Busk Bequest. The motion was made to approve this recommendation by Amy Louthan, seconded by Lynn Bulle, and unanimously approved by Council.

- 86.4 percent of the U.S. population 18 years or older have reported they have drank alcohol at some point in their lifetime.

 - Those who take medications that interacts with alcohol
 - Those that have a medical condition that alcohol can aggravate
 - Pregnancy or those trying to become pregnant
 - Anyone younger than 21
 - Persons recovering from alcoholism or those unable to control the amount they drink

Call Committee Update - Phase III: Evaluation and Interviews “Quiet Phase”

Thank you for your continued prayers as the Call Committee seeks God’s direction. The Synod has approved our HTLC Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The Bishop’s office is evaluating candidates who align with our needs and desires summarized in our MSP.

We are now in Phase III: Evaluation and Interviews phase... the “Quiet Phase”. Profiles of potential candidates will be shared confidentially with the Call Committee in upcoming weeks. Pastor Ben Moravitz will guide the Call Committee through the next confidential phases of the Call Process. As we progress through future phases of the Call Process, the Call Committee will maintain open communication with HTLC members as permitted by the formal Process.

- Phase V: Congregational Meeting to Vote on a Call**

The More You Know...

This month Worship and Music Committee continues its series of Trumpet articles covering a variety of topics on symbols, colors, design/architecture, traditions, seasons, and festivals that many of us either don't think about very often or perhaps are not sure of the significance of these things. In the April article, we will reflect on Holy Week and Easter.

Holy Week: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday

Easter Day

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and ends on Good Friday. **Palm Sunday** (or Sunday of the Passion) is the sixth and last Sunday of Lent. In addition to celebrating Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, Palm Sunday also looks at the story of the passion and death of Christ. The day begins as Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a colt where He fulfills the prophecy in Zechariah 9:9: *"Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."* The people greeted him as though He were an earthly king. Their shouts of "Hosanna" ("save us") is proof that they were sure He would end the Roman occupation and that Jerusalem would be a Jewish city again. They spread their coats on the road which, in those days, was an act of respect to royalty. They also laid branches from nearby trees and palm branches on the road before Him. Today, because of this, palm branches are used by many nations as an emblem of joy and victory over enemies and, in Christianity, as a sign of victory over the flesh and the world. Purple remains the color of the season throughout the week until Good Friday.



In the days following Palm Sunday, Jesus preached, taught, was betrayed, presided over the Passover supper, prayed, was arrested and denied by Peter. He was taunted, slapped, spit upon and beaten. He stood trial, was condemned to death, suffered terribly and died. The three days from Maundy Thursday until Easter are known as the "Triduum" which means "Three Days". These days are revered by Christians because they commemorate the events surrounding the death and resurrection of Jesus, and thus, the very nature of our own redemption.



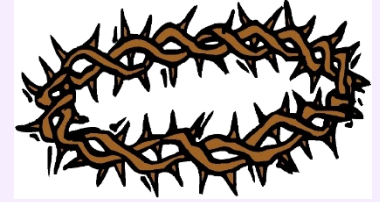
Maundy Thursday is also known as "Holy Thursday". "Maundy" comes from the old Latin name for the day, "Dies Mandatum" which means "the day of the new commandment". The "new commandment" is the one given by Jesus at the Last Supper: *"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another"* (John 13:34). The evening's service begins with the confession and absolution of sins. Holy Communion is celebrated on this night in memory of Jesus' last meal with his disciples. The Last Supper was the Passover Supper (or Feast of the Unleavened Bread) eaten by Jesus and His disciples in the upper room. The Passover was a Jewish festival in remembrance of the way God saved His people when they were enslaved in Egypt. An unblemished lamb was used in the Passover meal, which was sacrificed to be eaten. The blood of the lamb was put on the sides and

tops of the doorframes of the houses where the lambs were eaten. Jesus said that He eagerly desired to eat the Passover meal with the disciples before He suffered. He explained to them that He would not eat the Passover meal again until the Passover finds its fulfillment in the kingdom of God. Jesus is known as the Paschal Lamb, Lamb of God, or Agnus Dei because He was the ultimate sacrifice to redeem all people.

The More You Know...

At the close of the Maundy Thursday service, the altar and chancel area are stripped symbolizing the moment in the Passion of Christ when He was stripped of His garments by the Jews. Worshippers depart in contemplative silence.

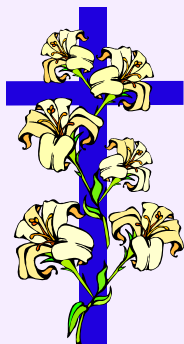
Good Friday is the day that our Lord suffered horribly. He was ridiculed, beaten, whipped and later forced to carry His own cross on the walk towards Golgotha. Those punishments alone were brutal and often fatal to most who endured them yet Jesus still lived and was then forced to suffer crucifixion – the Romans' means of execution usually intended only for slaves and the most malicious of criminals and offenders who were not Roman citizens. It was a death meant to cause the criminal severe agony and disgrace. So, *why* the name "Good"? Some say the term evolved from "God" or "God's Friday". Others believe "good" represents the good gift of salvation brought forth by Christ's martyrdom. Regardless, this day commemorates Christ's sacrifice on the cross with both somber reflection and with hope and triumph. It is truly a holy day throughout the Christian world. Good Friday not only marks the crucifixion of Christ but also reveals the mystery of the Christian faith. We are witness to what man did to Christ and the sacrifice that Christ made for us.



Our Lord's last words on the cross are recorded in scripture. These "Seven Words" provide our Savior's sacred parting instructions for the crowd that day and for all generations. The "Seven Words" are:

- *"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."* (Luke 23:34)
- *"Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."* (Luke 23:43)
- *"Woman, behold your son!" "Behold your mother!"* (John 19:26-27)
- *"My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?"* (Matthew. 27:46)
- *"I thirst."* (John 19:28)
- *"It is finished!"* (John 19:30)
- *"Father, into thy hands I commit my spirit."* (Luke 23:46)

When worshippers arrive for the Good Friday service, the altar and chancel area are bare (with the exception of the candles to be used during the service), and the cross is draped in black. The church is quiet, and the hymns are soft and mournful. It's intended to be a service of darkness to recreate the emotional aspects of the passion story. There is no benediction and worshippers leave in silence and darkness.



Easter (The Resurrection of Our Lord). Christ is risen! And the faithful respond "He is Risen indeed!" For as dark a day as Good Friday is in the life of a Christian, could any other day be more vibrant and glorious than this one? This day celebrates *Christ's* victory as *our* victory, it proclaims that, in Christ, believers too shall be made alive! The empty tomb testifies to the truth of Christ's promises and to the trustworthiness of His Word. Hallelujah! Alleluia! Easter Day begins the **Easter season**. This is a season of great joy and celebrates the resurrection of Christ and man's salvation from death. Easter is the *central event* of the Christian faith. The color of Easter is pure, joyous white. This season lasts for fifty days or six weeks until the day of Pentecost.

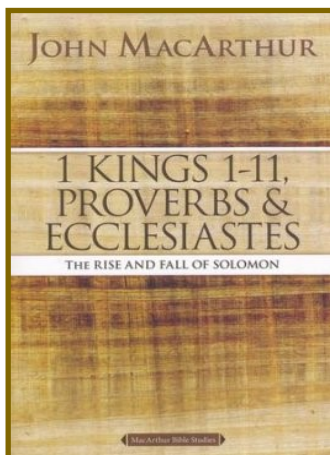

Explore how true wisdom is not merely intellectual but also moral, and how it gives us insight into the character of God, and how God gives wisdom to anyone who asks.

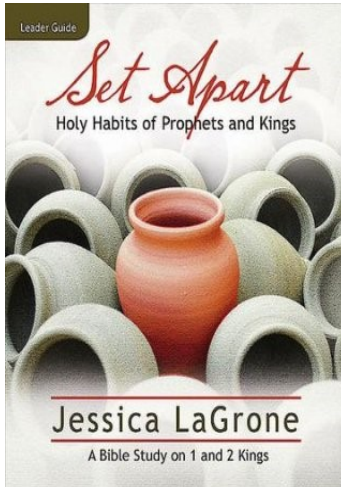
