SE Synod does a lot of work (with member-church benevolence money) that we need to be more aware of – pandemic relief, malaria prevention/treatment, East Africa missions, ethnic-specific ministries. Synod has decreased their support of ELCA this year to focus on these ministries more. There is a video available to get word out on this.
 - v. Dealing with diversity is an issue across our nation at this time. Pastor has raised the diversity issue in a sermon a few weeks ago, and more discussion will be coming (forum to be announced soon). We need to pray for guidance on how to move forward, holding hands and remembering that we are in this together. We to prayerfully consider how we can address the issue, determine our path forward, and avoid divisiveness. Pastor encouraged us all to maintain a "non-anxious presence" as we walk together; we need to hear one another and continue to walk together in faith.
 - vi. Pastor also highlighted his membership with the Kingsport Homeless Ministry. At a later date, HTLC should consider having a speaker to share information on this ministry, perhaps Don Royston.

God's Abundance

I believe God's abundance is all around us — in every aspect of our lives. He gives us the food we eat, the air we breathe, the water we drink, and the life we live. This characteristic of our God has been evident since creation. He gave Adam and Eve the Garden of Eden with an abundance of all they needed. Not only does God provide, He created us in His image and gave us a position above all in His creation. Psalm 8:3-9 points this out:

³ When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, ⁴ what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? ⁵ You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor. ⁶ You made them rulers over the works of your hands; you put everything under their feet:⁷ all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild,⁸ the birds in the sky, and the fish in the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas. ⁹ Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

When we look at our lives, do we see the gifts He has given each of us? I have personally lived in several parts of the world where the local people have almost nothing in terms of "stuff" but are very happy and thankful to the Lord for their lives and all that's been given them. Be it the Far East, the Middle East or, closer to home, the Americas, people outside our country usually have much less. We've heard from our members how they were awestruck on mission trips in other countries where many people live in houses made of scraps of material, often open to the elements. I've seen people with almost nothing give food to those even less fortunate. When I encounter this, I have to take a serious look at myself. Have I been that blessed and have also been that self-centered — that greedy — that wanting? Perhaps . . . or maybe closed to the abundance and blessings God has bestowed upon me and my family.

As human beings succeed in life, we often forget that the talents we have and the make-up of our being comes from God. When Moses took God's chosen people out of Egypt and led them to the Promised Land, it was a land God had already prepared for them. It was full of vineyards, date palms, pastures, and most importantly, water. So, at the end of his life, Moses warned the people (Deuteronomy 8:11-18) to:

¹¹ Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws and his decrees that I am giving you this day. ¹² Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, ¹³ and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all you have is multiplied, ¹⁴ then your heart will become proud and you will forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. ¹⁵ He led you through the vast and dreadful wilderness, that thirsty and waterless land, with its venomous snakes and scorpions. He brought you water out of hard rock. ¹⁶ He gave you manna to eat in the wilderness, something your ancestors had never known, to humble and test you so that in the end it might go well with you. ¹⁷ You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." ¹⁸ But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your ancestors, as it is today.

We often tend to look at our lives in a different way: that of scarcity. Do we have enough? Can we pay the bills? The car needs repair. Tuition is coming due. Food costs more. All these types of issues constantly arise in our lives and we tend to look at them with a view that they cause pain (in other words, we have to forego something) in order to accomplish them. In this age of consumerism, we (and I'm using a generic we) tend to want things that really are excesses in most people's lives. A new phone. A bigger television. New clothes. Another pair of shoes. The list goes on and on. If I stand back and see all that God has already given me, I often feel ashamed of wanting more — I stand convicted for not being thankful. Most people in this country fall into the category of not seeing the abundance that God has already put in their lives. Added to that is our feeling that we are entitled to things (and by that, I mean stuff). Money is one topic Jesus talks about a lot (over 30 times and in 11 of 27 parables). He warned his disciples in Luke 12:16-21 about wealth:

¹⁶ And he [Jesus] told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. ¹⁷ He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' ¹⁸ "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. ¹⁹ And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."' ²⁰ "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?' ²¹ "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

Trusting in God's abundance makes us \dots NO — drives us, to be more generous. It allows us to live a life God wanted. So many of our fellow congregants give of themselves. Just look at what we at Holy Trinity have done and continue to do:

- 1) Meals on Wheels (cooking and delivering and managing)
- 2) Family Promise (cooking meals, chaperoning, a board member)
- 3) Support of Kingsport Community Ministry Center (answering the phone; interviewing)
- 4) Altar Guild (setting up/tearing down communion each week)
- 5) Assistant Ministers/Communion Assistants/Acolytes
- 6) Stephen Ministry (caring for our church family in need)
- 7) Committees/Ministries at HTLC
- 8) Choir
- 9) Vacation Bible School
- 10)Quilts & Prayer Shawls
- 11) WELCA
- 12) Many, many more.

This is stewardship at its best — taking care of others (and others also includes our church family) and of God's gifts to us. Living in the abundance the Lord continues to bestow upon us is shown by our actions and lifestyles; therefore, we should be forever grateful for the blessings and gifts we have received from him — and never forget the abundance He provides to us all.




Adult Sunday School starts September 12


What about Romans. Well, MacArthur says:
