

Sue Rasmussen welcomed new council members and thanked them for their service. A plan to hold future meetings in the Conference Room on the basement level was discussed.

Council Orientation: Pastor Bangle described responsibilities and actions of Council as a governance board to:

- Represent the whole congregation
- Make decisions
- Provide continuity
- Have Vision "Vision beyond our grasp"
- Serve the congregation

As a Board, Council's task is to make **policy** for the congregation and policies should reflect our Mission Statement. A committee's job is to gather information and do the **work** of the church with reports reflecting decisions made by the committee or request for policy consideration. A task group should be formed to do one particular task and disbanded when that task is done – "One and Done."

- Operating Principles consist of:
  - Responsibility Whose job is this to do whatever it is?
  - Authority What does it take to get the job done?
  - Accountability Did you do it?

### Old Business:

General HTLC Update – Pastor Bangle reviewed the Call Committee selection process. The call committee will be appointed by Council. The individuals chosen should be a group that is representative of the whole congregation with the committee's goal to be unified behind one candidate. Council members were asked to prayerfully consider members of this important group.



## **Dental Care....FYI**

In the past people used a variety of mixtures to clean their teeth; powders made of eggshells, ground chalk, ashes, or charcoal mixed with soap.

Most Americans didn't adopt good brushing habits until after W.W.II!

47 percent of adults aged 30 years and older have some form of gum disease. An even higher 70 percent of adults 65 years and older suffer from gum disease.

Researchers are studying a link between gum diseases and heart diseases. Another area of study is an association between gum disease and early labor and low birth weights.

## **Good Dental Care Practices:**

- Use a brush with soft bristles to prevent harm to your gums. Brush for 30 seconds in each quadrant of your mouth for a total of two minutes.
- Brush at least twice per day, especially before you go to bed.
- Use a toothpaste with fluoride.
- Remember to brush your tongue, bacteria lives on your tongue as well as your teeth.
- Floss! It is just as important as brushing and it is best if done before you go to bed.
- Change your toothbrush every two to three months.
- Visit the Dentist regularly.
- Try to eat and drink fewer sugary foods.



# Tri-Cities Memory Gardens Mausoleum Properties Available for Sale to HTLC Members

In August 1978, three mausoleum properties located at Tri-Cities Memory Gardens were donated to HTLC with a current total value estimate at \$15,480.00 (one single unit = \$6,490 and one double unit = \$8,990). The HTLC Council was recently made aware of this donation and unanimously agreed to pursue the following options in the order listed:

Option 1. Offer to sell the properties to HTLC members (Timeline: July-December 2018),
Option 2. If no HTLC members are interested in purchasing the properties, we will offer to sell them to the public (Timeline: January-June 2019),

Funds from the sale of these properties will be placed in the HTLC General Fund and used as designated by Council.

## Finding cures. Saving children.

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is well known to most Holy Trinity members. Our own Brady Nussman was a St. Jude patient, and each year many of you participate in and/or contribute to Brady's Bunch, the team bearing his name in annual St. Jude Walk/Run to End Childhood Cancer. The Run is coming up in September, so it is time now to sign up.

Follow this link and then choose if you wish to join the team and become a fund raiser or just make a donation. Either choice is fine – there are some who join the team, make a donation, and participate in the walk while others choose simply to donate. Either way, you are honoring Brady's memory and helping in the fight against these deadly diseases. And we appreciate your support!

This year, the walk will be Saturday, September 15 at the Pinnacle in Bristol. Registration/ check in begins at 7AM, with the walk beginning at 8AM. If you want more information, you can go to the St. Jude website and click "Get Involved" and then "Walk/Run to End Childhood Cancer". In addition to the website information, there will also be a Walk/Run Kickoff Party for Kingsport at the Farmer's Market on Friday, August 10 from 5 to 7PM. There will be lots of information about St. Jude, opportunities to form or join a team, and a host of other treats and surprises – including FREE carousel rides! (Of course, you do not have to attend the Kickoff to participate in the team and the Walk/Run!)

St. Jude is unlike any other medical facility. It is the global leader in research for cures to many childhood diseases, and all its findings are freely shared globally with other treatment facilities. St. Jude treats patients from around the globe in Memphis and in 8 affiliate clinics, including The St. Jude Tri-Cities Affiliate Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City. No family ever pays St. Jude for treatment, travel, or lodging. The medical staff is absolutely unbelievable in their compassion and care for their patients and their families. The work must continue – not only to treat the cancers that can now be cured because of prior research but also to find cures for the tougher diseases. All that patient care and treatment as well as the research is costly – it costs St. Jude about \$1 billion a year to operate (that's just under \$3 million a day!). The majority of that money comes from individual donors who give what they can to continue this fight. You can contribute at any time, but the Walk/Run is a nationwide focus event promoting the search for cures.




