Call Committee Update: Congregational Visit with Candidate

The Call Committee has worked faithfully to evaluate and interview candidates following God's Word and God's timing to find God's choice for Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (HTLC)! The Call Committee **unanimously** voted to recommend **Pastor Scottie Burkhalter** as our primary candidate to Church Council.

Church Council shared time with Pastor Scottie (his preferred name...) and his wife Myra. The Church Council has also **unanimously** voted to recommend Pastor Scottie to our HTLC Congregational members.

Who is Pastor Scottie?

Pastor Scottie has spent much of his life in South Carolina and Tennessee. He graduated from the University of South Carolina. He is quite familiar with East Tennessee, having served a congregation in Maryville, TN. Before he was called by God to the ministry, he worked for several years as a marketing executive in the textile industry.

Pastor Scottie's personal ministry statement: "My personal mission is to love God by serving others with compassion, encouragement, and enthusiasm. I am EVANGELICAL, a bearer of "good news". I am enthusiastic, confident that God is within me. God calls me to GO-BE-DO; GO make disciples, BE the light of Christ, and DO God's will."

He received his Master of Divinity from Lutheran Theological Seminary of Gettysburg in 1998. His broad experience includes: 1) Senior Pastor of three Lutheran churches, 2) Intense 12-month Chaplain Residency at Spartanburg Regional Hospital, 3) Intentional Interim Pastor appointed by South Carolina Bishop and 4) Hospice Chaplain.

His areas of expertise are: 1) Pastoral Care and Visitation, 2) Building a Sense of Community, 3) Participant in the Larger Church, 4) Ministry in Daily Life, 5) Evangelism / Mission

His strengths are: 1) Preaching / Worship Leadership, 2) Self-Care / Family Life, 3) Small Group Ministry, 4) Chaplaincy, 5) Music / Worship / Art

Pastor Scottie's reflection on his calling into the ministry: "I am a Child of God who understands whole-life stewardship as being all we are and all we have belongs to God. For me, whole-life stewardship is about understanding that I am the caretaker of all God has entrusted to me. As a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 3:16), God calls me to glorify God with my thoughts, words, and actions. We love God by serving others (Mark 10:45). By asking the question, "What does love require that I do?" this question becomes a focus for me while praying God will guide me by the Holy Spirit. When I fall, God will be there. Therefore, I will continue praying that my life be a witness to God's grace and love every day."

Summary of Council Minutes July 8, 2019

Corporate Meeting: Election of officers for 2019 – 20

New Council Orientation:

Copies of constitution and by-laws sent in advance to all members to read Pastor Bangle gave an excellent orientation on council duties and how council fit between the congregation and the ministry teams and the purpose of short term task forces.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor received approval for several prospective new members. He is working with the Evangelism Committee to see what we can do to get new members and visitors to become engaged as active participants in our church body. Pastor Bangle has met with new Rector at St. Paul's Episcopal to start a dialogue on ways we might work together.

Ministry Team Reports:

Minutes from teams that met past month had been forwarded to members to read prior to meeting. There were no action items. Balance of time was spent selecting council members to be liaison person with our teams. That has been completed and listing will be sent to committee chairs. Chairs are reminded to send any minutes of their activities to council prior to meeting time, especially if there is action they need from council.

New Business:

Two groups requested use of parts of our facilities. One is a meeting of the Kingsport Diversified Study Group, hosted by Laura Mitchell and Joy Wood. The other the use of our downstairs fellowship hall for quilting lessons hosted by Jenny Trumbo and JoRita McMurray. Both were approved and placed on the church calendar. Discussion followed about possible ways to improve our building use process. A task group will be appointed to look into this.

Website: Several of our ministry teams are listed on the web site but many are not. They are reminded to consider listing themselves on the site. The web site calendar is also the one official calendar now and Google calendar is no longer maintained in the office. Again, committees are asked to consider listing their meeting dates and times on the calendar to avoid possible overlaps. Council Meeting time is being moved to 7PM on the second Monday of each month to accommodate all our members.

August is National Immunization Awareness Month

Adult Vaccination

We are very much aware of the importance of getting our children vaccinated. It is equally as important as adults to be vaccinated against serious and potentially lethal diseases. Vaccines you received as a child can wear off over time. Plus new vaccines specifically aimed at older adults are now available.

Vaccinations Every Adult Needs

Influenza Vaccine Need once a year

All adults need no matter what their age. Exception unless you have experienced a severe reaction in the past.

Pneumonia Vaccine Recommended for healthy adults 65 years

and older and recommended for high risk adults (smokers, individuals with chronic lung or heart disease,leukemia, lymphoma, or alcoholism) 19-64 years old.

The CDC recommends two vaccines. The first, PCV13 and the second, PPSV23. They should not be taken at the same time. Should be taken a year apart unless you are considered to be high risk and should be taken 8 weeks apart.

Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis /whooping cough)Vaccine and or Td (tetanus, diphtheria) Booster

Tdap came out in 2005.

The <u>1</u> time Tdap vaccine can serve as a booster for the required every 10 year booster vaccine for tetanus.

The recommendation for the every 10 year Td booster continues.

Shingles VaccineThe CDC recommends everyone 50 years or older take the new Shingles vaccine even if they have taken the original vaccine .

Shingrix is given in 2doses, two to six months apart.

Hepatitis A VaccineThe vaccine is recommended for people 50 years and older who are at risk for hepatitis A. Hepatitis A primarily results from travel to another country where the virus is common or being in close contact with a hepatitis A infected individual.

The vaccine is given in 2 doses within six months.

Hepatitis B Vaccine It is recommended for adults 50 years and older who are at risk of contracting hepatitis B.

The vaccine consist of 3 doses given within a five month period.

If you are allergic to wheat consult with your physician before taking the vaccine.

The More You Know...

This month Worship and Music Committee continues its series of <u>Trumpet</u> articles covering a variety of topics on symbols, colors, design/architecture, traditions, seasons, and festivals that many of us either don't think about very often or perhaps are not sure of the significance of these things. In the August article, we will explore a worship resource in our pews every week – the "ELW."

Evangelical Lutheran Worship

<u>Evangelical Lutheran Worship</u> sounds like something Lutherans do every week (at least!), and it is. But that is also the title of the current version of the ELCA "hymnal" (in quotes for reasons to be explained). The title is often shortened to just "ELW."

The ELW replaced the <u>Lutheran Book of Worship</u> (LBW) in 2006. Worshippers can find copies of the ELW in our pew racks. This book is used in our traditional services as well as in many special services such as weddings, funerals, and Lenten services. It is often referred to as the "hymnal" but it is much more than that. It is quite the resource, and Lutherans may find it useful at times other than Sunday morning. Take some time to explore it! This article will provide some insight into its contents.

After the Introduction, there is a section titled "The Church Year." This provides a listing of the Sundays and festivals of the year. It also includes a section called "Propers." This is a Sunday-by-Sunday listing with the appointed scripture readings. And that is a frequently asked question – what will the readings be this Sunday? So here is a place to find the answer. Each Sunday has 3 appointed sets of readings – A, B, and C. Lutherans (and other denominations) follow a 3-year rotation in the readings to cover more of the Bible in worship. 2019 uses the "C" series. Next comes a series of prayers that are provided for specific seasons and also for specific circumstances. While these are useful to worship planners, they may also be useful guides or starters for individuals' prayer lives – there are prayers for church unity, for times of disaster, for teachers and schools, and many other topics faced daily.

The next section is titled "Holy Communion" and it contains the "settings" or liturgy choices available for services. However, at the beginning of the section (pages 92 and 93), there is a brief outline or structure of the worship service, highlighting the 4 major sections – Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. Review that sometime; it may provide some additional insight in the elements of Lutheran worship.

Several sections with special services are provided next. These range from baptism to funerals and Lenten services to daily prayer services. There is then a transition section on "Psalms" (page 335), which speaks to the history of psalms in worship and introduces the Psalm Tones that are often used in responsive singing of the psalms. This concludes on page 338.

And this leads to a major point of confusion about the ELW. Page numbering. Up through page 338, pages are numbered as in any book – one number to one page. After page 338, numbering starts over at 1, with Psalms 1 through 150 being the first 150 entries. Psalms vary in length, so there may be multiple Psalms on a page or a Psalm may span multiple pages! When the Psalms conclude, a section of Service Music begins, with versions of the Kyrie beginning at 151. Service Music continues through entry 238, the Great Litany.

Hymns begin with entry 239 and are provided first in church year order and then in topical order (healing, community, witness, stewardship, and so on). This is the largest portion of the ELW, ending with entry 886. Next comes a short section of National Hymns.

ELW ends with some resources – the Lectionary is repeated, for example. Also included is Luther's "Small Catechism" just in case a worshipper wants to brush up on how Luther described and elaborated on the Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, etc. And that's another often heard question – where can I get a copy of the Catechism? In the ELW!

Prayer Ministry Needs Your Help!

We are happy to pray for your loved ones, just please communicate with the new pew cards. PLACE THE CARD IN THE OFFERING PLATE, or PUT IT IN THE FOLDER MARKED CHURCH OFFICE WITH THE MAILBOXES (even if you shared it during joys and concerns). If it is midweek, e-mail the church office if possible, so names will be spelled correctly, etc. If none of the above is possible, call the church office and give the information. Prayer concerns are forwarded to Prayer Ministry and Pastor.

The church office keeps the prayer list current using the pew cards turned in. The blue prayer concerns/update cards are in each pew (and extra in a basket by the prayer bulletin board outside the sanctuary).

We want to be able to post on the bulletin board ANSWERS TO PRAYER or need for continued prayer. If you list someone on the list, would you please turn in an update on the blue pew card in offering plate every month or 6 weeks? This includes letting us know when to remove someone from the list. Prayer Ministry members calling all the people who placed names is very time consuming. In the case of chronic or serious illness, it is likely best to ask they be put on list at acute times. This will ensure that our members notice their name more than if name remains for months or years. It does not mean they no longer need prayers! It's perfectly fine to take someone off and add them back two weeks or months later because of a new concern.

Always remember to get permission from the individual before sharing their name in the service or in writing.

We very much appreciate your help! We are excited that we continue to grow as a congregation that prays for others. There are many in our community and across the USA who are thankful for our prayers.


Altar Flowers





Our own Brady Nussman was a St. Jude patient, and each year many of you participate in and/or contribute to *Brady's Bunch*, the team bearing his name in annual **St. Jude Walk/Run to End Childhood Cancer**. The event is coming up in September, so it is time now to sign up.

Follow this link and then choose if you wish to join the team and become a fund raiser ("Register and Join Team") or just make a donation ("Donate to Team Goal").
