Sunday meals recipient numbers are down; MoW of KPT says there may be more needs identified as pandemic subsides. Still looking for a Family Promise coordinator. Jon Peters has asked that we identify a new chair for Outreach. Undies Sundays are coming up – plans are in place and work is underway
 - h. Prayer (B. Hrivnak/D. Hrivnak – Advent devotional material distributed
 - i. Property (Cooper/Reames)
 - j. Stewardship (B. Bergemann/L. Bergemann) – another Trumpet piece forthcoming
 - k. Worship and Music (Wood/Louthan) – Minutes provided
 - l. Youth (___/___)
7. Old Business

- a. COVID precautions for worship
 - i. Latest data – Still seeing people in hospital even though counts are lower than a few months ago. Three congregational deaths now, but none linked to exposure at HTLC to best of our knowledge. Winter with more indoor gathering may bring a spike. Discussed discontinuing mask requirement for Advent. Consensus was that data and trends and outlook do not support this at present. Drugs to treat COVID are coming out – should help us transition to dealing with this like we do with flu (it is not going away). But that is not yet.
 - b. Parish nurse position – see comments under Parish Nurse staff report item
 - c. Follow-up plans – congregational meeting on social issues
 - i. Have people received any pushback on our statement?
 - 1. Four notes/comments expressing disappointment that we are not leaving ELCA have been received.
 - ii. Major concern is that pushing to a vote will drive further division without a clear constitutional majority needed for action. Consensus to take no further action.
8. New Business
- a. Meal cards for Hospital Chaplains – Meal gift cards and thank you letters sent to the 3 chaplains
 - b. 2022 Budget review
 - i. Budget recommended by Finance is a deficit budget – or a faith budget. 2022 projection of expenses is greater than projected income. However, history says HTLC does not spend its budget. Further, HTLC has cash reserves that can help offset the shortfall (as was done in 2021). Finance chose not to take the action of asking for budget reductions from committees but rather chose to leave committee requests intact (with the exception of segregating capital from expense). Dipping into reserves is not acceptable for the long haul but it is certainly feasible for a few years. The big issue for 2022 is not so much this budget but the fact that our income is declining for 2022 and in fact has been declining for several years. The same is true for our attendance. As a congregation we need to have some discussion about these matters – what can we do?
 - ii. Synod/ELCA support was discussed. Our dollars to the Synod/ELCA are budgeted down for 2022 because our income (new contributions, not including money from reserve) is down. (Our contribution is a percentage of the income. The percentage is 5%.) The Finance did not feel it had responsibility to recommend a different figure. Note that our local Outreach budget is already far more than our benevolence line item (Outreach is \$22,750; Synod is \$13,740). It was also noted that while certain Synod/ELCA decisions and activities are not to the liking of some/many of our members, there is much good work and worthy causes that are supported – pastoral training, disaster relief, mission congregations, etc.
 - iii. Motion to accept budget came as a recommendation from Finance; approved.
 - c. Evangelism recommendation to provide a “phone tree” service to quickly get messages to entire congregation was discussed. Price would be about \$350/year. Pastor would manage the content. Do need to make sure our phone number list won’t be “sold” by the provider. Motion/second by Nitschke/Perry to explore this and set up if desired after further investigation; approved.

- d. Annual meeting date – Sunday, January 23, 2022 – set by consensus. Will ask Congregational Life to consider options for a meal, subject to potential COVID revisions (in either direction) that may need to be made in early January.
- e. Idea from Pastor – TV ministry opportunity on WKPT - \$225/week for 6:30AM slot on Sunday morning – referred to Evangelism
- 9. Additional Communications to Council
 - a. Joy Wood has asked for use of building for a study group in February – Motion/second by Hrivnak/Nitschke to allow was approved, with caveat that group must abide by HTLC COVID guidelines at the time of the event.
- 10. Review of Action Items/Pending issues
 - a. New action items
 - i. Reames – notify Janet of annual meeting date
 - ii. Grady – notify Congregational Life of annual meeting date and desire for a meal if COVID restrictions allow
 - iii. Hrivnak – notify Joy Wood of building use decision
- 11. Plan for Next meeting – Non-routine topics
 - a. Final look at 2022 budget
 - b. Annual meeting plans
- 12. Adjournment moved by Cleven, seconded and approved unanimously and with prayer.

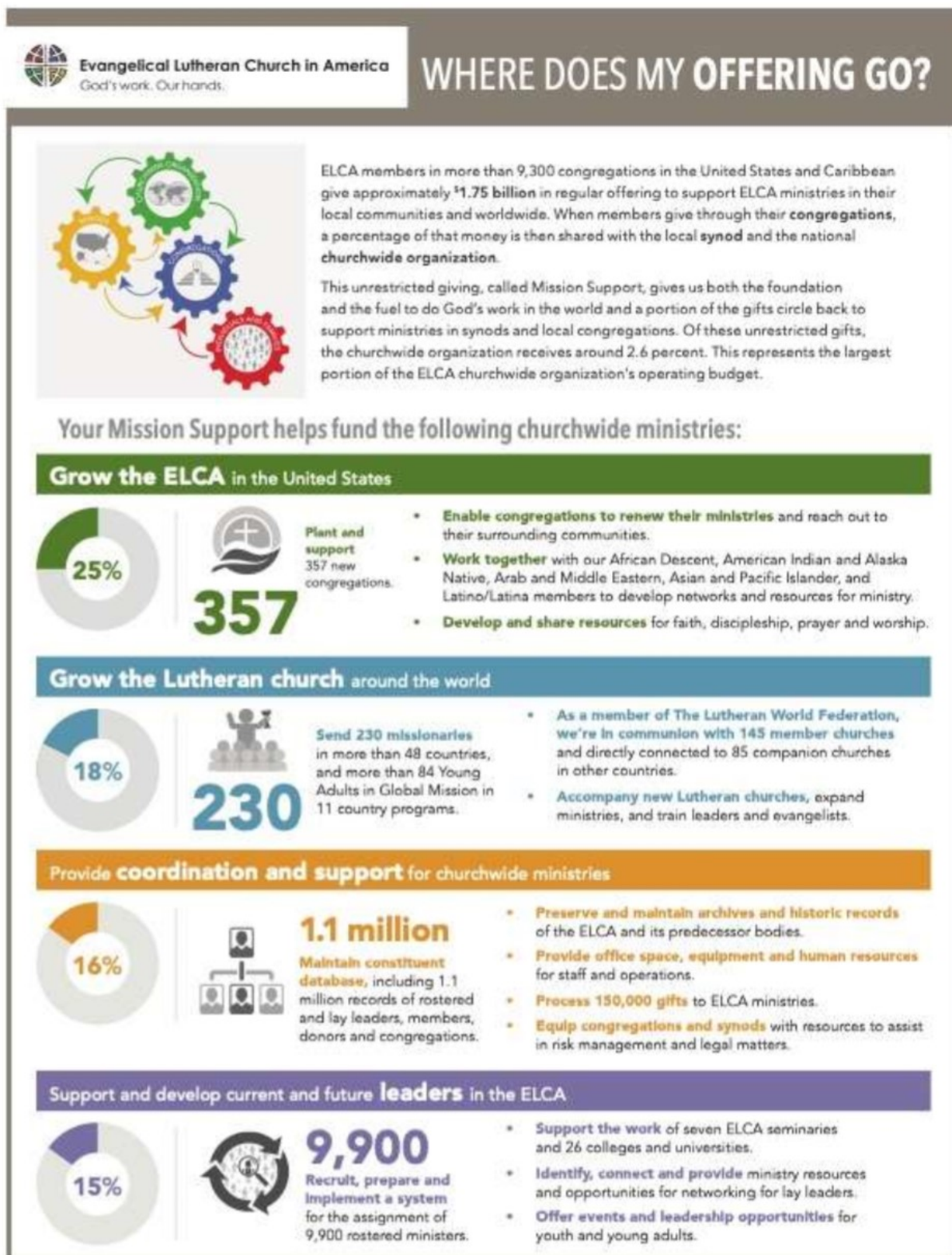
MISSION STATEMENT
