The meeting was called to order by David Reames.

Devotions and prayer were presented by Pastor Scottie.

Minutes of the October council meeting and called October meeting were approved. Detra moved/ Dave Hrivnak second.

Financial reports were presented by Paul Castille. Dave Hrivnak moved / Jim Louthan second. Reports approved

The 2021 budget was reviewed. There is a 10% shortfall. Property has asked for an additional \$20K for projects. This money will probably come from capital funds. The finance committee will meet December 7, 2020 to finalize the budget and present to council at the December meeting.

#### **Staff Reports:**

Pastor Scottie and Sue Morgan's reports were reviewed. Pastor reported that he and Janet are continuing to work on updating the website and review seconded. Reports approved.

#### Committee Reports:

Outreach: The Family Promise coordinators are working on a job description. We are still looking for someone to take over the duties. MOW is also working on a job description. Council needs to identify individual(s) to fill the Family Promise Coordinator role (action item).

#### Old Business:

#### Church reopening:

Drive through communion was reinstated last Sunday. Worship and Music is looking at outdoor decorations and music for the Christmas season.

For now, we will continue with parking lot services with drive through communion. There will not be any live singing. There was discussion about when to move back to services in the Nave and how these would be held. A survey of the congregation is planned to gather input for the Council decision. There would also be options for continuing in the parking lot and for video viewing.

Committee chairs need to complete 2020 reports by December 7 for the annual report.

Prayer committee has recommended that we continue to contact church members, perhaps share this duty with council members. Sue Morgan has volunteered to suggest someone (s) for each council meeting for special prayers. She will include these persons in her monthly report.

Jo McMurray presented a challenge to committees to prepare an Advent food box for distribution to needy families. She will send the information and suggestions for the box to committee chairs with recommendation for a deadline and delivery to church. Jo McMurray moved/ Nikki Huff seconded. Motion approved.

09/16/06 reflection by Charlie Nitschke was reviewed.

The December meeting will focus on approving the 2010 budget and discussion of church reopening.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by David Reames.

#### Parking:



Park in the main lot - facing the building.

**Additional parking** is in the grassy lot across Broad Street from the sign.

#### **Holy Communion Process:**

Cars will be routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the playground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and Pastor will extend a tray to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distribute communion to passengers. Pastor will be wearing gloves and mask, and

the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, turn right toward the Urology building and exit by that building. Music will be playing on our station throughout the Holy Communion process.

With drive-thru Holy Communion after brief service.







#### SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICY

#### **Holy Trinity Lutheran Church**

Date Approved: June 2020

#### **Emergency Evacuations:**

In the event of a fire or person who gains entry and threatens the people with bodily harm, exit during worship or other services in our sanctuary should be through the main door or the narthex exit if possible, otherwise people should flee the area by any egress routes available. The usher(s) should call 911 if using a cell phone or 9-911 if using a church phone, and people should gather at the Evacuation Assembly Area across the parking lot near the doctor's office. If people exit the sanctuary through the door by the pulpit and down the stairs and out the Sevier Street exit, they should gather across the street at a second Evacuation Assembly Area in the medical building lot. The same Sevier Evacuation Assembly Area would be used by people leaving through the Prayer Chapel exit. In order to see that all our people have reached safety, it is important that you take note of people sitting around you. We should all leave as orderly as possible and should be aware of helping those with special needs. Security personnel and emergency workers will check on both Assembly Areas.

In order to keep this fresh in people's minds, periodic publications of this and other policies should appear in the various newsletters and at least two trial evacuations should be held during each year. During the week, people in the choir room, the youth room, the kitchen, and the Fellowship Hall would normally exit through the Sevier Street door or in an extreme emergency could exit through the secondary choir room exit. People in an event in the downstairs fellowship hall would normally exit through the Sevier Street exit. People gathering for various events on the third floor, would exit using the regularly used stairs or the stairs nearer to Broad street to either the main floor and out the main exit or to the lower floor and out the Sevier Street exit. Elevators should not be used in these instances.

#### Medical Emergency:

- 1. First Aid Kits should be placed in places of easy access such as the kitchen, the office area, the Nursery, the hallway near upstairs classrooms, and Gathering Room. Locations should be marked so as to be easily identified. Contents are to be periodically reviewed and restocked, especially during and after public visitations, e.g. Family Promise. The kits should include 2x2 and 4x4 gauze, antiseptics, band aids and tape. No medications should be stored in the kits. If inventories show frequent use, then consideration should be given to having a single locked first-aid kit located near the AED.
- 2. In the event that the victim is in cardio-pulmonary arrest (without pulse or breathing) Bystander initiated Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) should be initiated by trained personnel according to Basic Life Support guidelines (see below).

- 3. Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) is located in the hallway between the Sanctuary and Gathering Room. An alarm is sounded if the enclosure is opened. The AED should be periodically checked and training for the device should be offered to all interested congregational members and staff.
- 4. Basic Life Support training should be offered periodically and made available to interested individuals and staff.
- 5. Hygiene and disease prevention of communicable diseases should be encouraged. Periodic education should be offered for members and staff. Periodic re-evaluation of communion and fellowship practices should be made. Individuals with medical background training should be invited to participate.
- 6. NO MEDICATIONS should be administered by congregants and staff.

#### In the event of a medical emergency:

- If the medical situation does not require a medical professional (e.g. a skinned knee), act appropriately using the material available in one of the first aid kits.
- If the medical situation requires a medical professional, do the following:
  - o Call 911 if using a cell phone or 9-911 if using a church phone; and provide as much information as possible; be sure to look for a Medical Alert bracelet or necklace; do not move the victim unless their life is in jeopardy;
  - o Assist and comfort as able;
  - o Identify someone to stand by the church entrance to guide Emergency Medical Responders to the needed site.
  - o An accident report should be filed in the Church office for any accident that occurs on the premises. Any material used out of a first aid kit should be noted to the Church office so that the kit can be replenished.

#### Fire Emergency:

Inspections of both the kitchen hood and fire suppression system should be made on a regular basis by an approved agency. Likewise, all fire extinguishers should be inspected/tested by the fire department. Documentation of these inspections should be kept in the Church office.

#### If a fire is discovered:

- 1. Activate the nearest fire alarm; the alarm will alert the people in the building of a fire; always proceed to the next step;
- 2. Call 911 if using a cell phone or 9-911 if using a church phone; obtain first-aid kits;
- 3. If the fire alarm does not sound for some reason, alert all the occupants of the church building of the fire and need to evacuate;
- 4. After pulling the fire alarm and calling 911 if using a cell phone, or 9-911 if using a church phone, an attempt to put out the fire if it is small may be made; however, if the fire is large or there is an unfamiliarity with the proper use of the fire extinguisher, then close the door, if there is one, to the room the fire is in and evacuate the building.
- 5. When the fire alarm sounds all occupants should leave the building immediately, closing all doors behind the last person out of each area.
- 6. Evacuate using the closest exit unless egress is blocked by the fire;
- 7. Do not block exit doors in an open position;
- 8. Go to the Evacuation Assembly Area which is the area around the dumpster in the main parking lot; Congregants should help visitors and the disabled find their way out of the building and to the Evacuation Assembly Area.
- 9. No one should leave until an official has accounted for all persons who were in the building at the time of the fire.
