December 14, 2020

The meeting was called to order by David Reames.

Devotions and prayer were presented by Pastor Scottie.

Minutes of the November council meeting were approved with 2021 budget amended. John moved/ Jo second, one abstention

Financial reports were presented by Paul Castille. John moved / Detra second. Reports approved

The 2021 budget was reviewed for second pass. Carry over funds from 2020 will be added to the income section. Jim moved/ Dave H second. Budget passed.

Capital budget reviewed. Motion was made to recommend to the congregation that HVAC replacement be funded from capital with a "not to exceed" cost of \$15K. John moved/ Flo second. HVAC section passed. Council recommends that electronic sign request will be moved to "under advisement until 2021" with no spending at the current time. Detra/John. Passed

### Staff Reports:

Pastor Scottie and Sue Morgan's reports were reviewed. Detra/ John Reports approved.

### Committee Reports:

AV reported that 77 video messages have been recorded since March 5, 2020.

Evangelism will Zoom meet in January

Outreach: The Family Promise, MOW skills and service needs reports are now complete. Jon Peters, Jim and Carolyn Chandler, and Judy Harper will appear in a video after the first of the year concerning Family Promise and the need for more support from the congregation. Currently, families are continuing to be housed in a motel.

Property: Lights on outside of church have been replaced and extra lights added to parking lot. Picnic tables need to be replaced.

Stewardship: Tom Bulle is resigning as chairman. He will continue to serve until a replacement is found.



### Old Business:

### Church reopening:

The survey results listed 3:1 to continue as we are now. We will continue with parking lot services with drive through communion. There will not be any live singing. There was discussion about when to move back to services in the Nave and how these would be held. There would also be options for continuing in the parking lot and for video viewing.

Sunday meals will continue to prepare meals and have them picked up at the Sevier St. door. If we need to close, an option for MOW would be to buy catered meals to deliver.

Vision 2020 roll out is deferred until after the first of the year.

Advent boxes- the council recommended they be divided between Oasis and Hope Haven. Flo/ Dave H. Motion passed. Jo will contact Laura Mitchell about delivery to Oasis.

### Congregational meeting:

The meeting will be held January 31, 2021 in the parking lot. Handouts concerning constitutional changes must be delivered to members within 30 days of meeting. Jo will copy the information and include a letter of explanation. These will be handed out at services on December 20 and 27.

A 2/3 vote is required to ratify changes in the constitution

Bob and Leigh Bergman were recommended as delegates to the annual ELCA Synod meeting. The meeting will be virtual on June 5, 2021. D Hrivnak/John. Motion passed.

Nominating committee members are being "hunted" by Dave H and Paul Castille.

Communication to Council: Sue Rasmussen and Sue Morgan have requested funds to provide a meal to the Holston Valley ED staff in recognition of their contribution to the community. D Hrivnak recommended a budget of \$400 to cover 30 meals for each of two shifts. A flyer about our drive through services will be included. D Hrivnak/ John. Motion passed. Dave H will contact Sue about the budget.

### Happy New Year!

As we begin a new year may God's grace, mercy and peace be with you. Often times at the beginning of a new year our thoughts go toward becoming more organized on a variety of fronts.

The following is a list of terms you have most likely have heard in the past and some of you have in all probability taken action on these topics. My hope in presenting these terms is that you will have a better understanding of the topics and can therefore make informed decisions about future medical care.

### Power of Attorney for Healthcare:

Is a <u>legal document</u> that allows an individual (you) to empower another person to make decisions about your medical care.

Commonly a Power of Attorney for Healthcare becomes active when you are no longer capable of expressing your preferences regarding your medical care. The Power of Attorney for Healthcare <u>does not</u> address issues around property or finances.

### **Living Will or Advance Directive:**

Is a <u>legal document</u> that specifies the type of medical care an individual (you) want or do not want in the event they (you) are unable to communicate their (your) wishes.

Hint: If you choose to complete a Living Will or Advance Directive document, make copies of it and place in sites to where you or your family members can easily access. Do not lock in storage or bank deposit boxes. And you should consider sharing the document information with your Primary Care Provider.

### **Medical Ombudsman:**

Is an impartial, independent <u>individual</u> who investigates and resolves complaints between parties. For example issues that arise between families and Long Term Care facilities.

Information on to how to contact your local ombudsman is most often posted near the main entrance of the Long Term Care Facility.

### Parking:



Park in the main lot - facing the building.

Do not park in the few spaces directly along the sidewalk by the sign.

**Additional parking** is in the grassy lot across Broad Street from the sign.

### **Holy Communion Process:**

Cars will be routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the playground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and Pastor will extend a tray to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distribute communion to passengers. Pastor will be wearing gloves and mask, and

the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, turn right toward the Urology building and exit by that building. Music will be playing on our station throughout the Holy Communion process.

With drive-thru Holy Communion after brief service.






