

Reopening Plan Revision - Good News!

Council had committed to reviewing the reopening plan and making changes if able/necessary based on public health conditions in our area. At the June 21 meeting, Council reviewed the current situation and decided to accelerate the reopening as listed in the revised plan below. At a high level, this removes all restrictions by July 25, two weeks earlier than previously planned. The removal of social distancing in seating is now being removed at the same time as the mask requirement, and other steps are being moved forward by two weeks.

There was discussion about both sticking with the earlier plan and removing all remaining restrictions even more quickly. The decision was for an intermediate path, given our previously stated plan to be conservative and to allow enough time for proper plans to be made for the return to more "regular" worship. There are still some details to be worked out, such as, when we move away from contactless communion, exactly what our communion practice will be. Worship and Music is being asked to work through that and make a recommendation. Details such as that will be communicated in due time.

Even with these changes, we want to be very clear that individuals who wish to wear masks, social distance in seating, etc. are still very welcome to do so. We recognize that individuals vary in their comfort level with returning to pre-COVID conditions.

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church UPDATED Plan for continued removal of COVID restrictions Revised by Council on June 21, 2021 but subject to change if conditions change

- May 2 Return to worship in nave with masks and social distancing but no singing COMPLETE
- May 10 Return to in person meetings/classes/nursery for vaccinated* individuals with social distancing and other restrictions COMPLETE
- June 6 Remove singing restriction (but still with masks) COMPLETE
- June 27 Remove masking requirement for vaccinated* individuals and reinstitute use of choir Remove social distancing seating and building single entry point requirements
- July 11 Remove contactless communion requirement
- July 25 Discontinue all remaining COVID practices and restrictions, including drive-thru communion and all masking for services as well as discontinue all meeting and coffee hour restrictions

*Those who have had COVID and recovered are considered to have been "vaccinated" for our purposes.

To be determined: The future of local FM broadcast. Council presently sees this as in issue for Worship and Music and Outreach apart from COVID requirements.

Church reopening:

The council reviewed a letter from Cal Churn and a report from worship/music with suggestions for reopening. Council voted adopt the following, accelerated schedule, giving full reopening 2 weeks earlier than previously approved:

June 27: Remove masks and reinstitute choir, remove social distancing seating and building single entry point requirements.

July 11: Remove contactless communion requirement.

July 25: Discontinue all remaining COVID practices and restrictions, including drive-thru communion and all masking for services as well as discontinue all meeting and coffee hour restrictions.

Worship/Music to reconsider how to offer communion after full reopening.

Sunday meals will continue to prepare meals and have them picked up at the Sevier St. door



Vision 2020 roll out is on hold.

Constitution changes have been emailed for review to Rev Delmer Chilton at Synod.

Installation of new council members was held on June 20.

New Business:

July council meeting will be hybrid with Zoom option.

David expressed his thanks to the outgoing council members.

The annual corporate meeting will be held in conjunction with the July council meeting to elect new officers. Minutes of last year's corporate meeting will be included in the prereads for approval.

Communication to council:

Jon Peters has written to council about his concerns for the ELCA views on abortion and homosexuality. Pastor and the Bergemanns (our Synod Assembly delegates) will discuss how to address questions and concerns about the ELCA views.

Action Items:

Paul Castille- continue to work on the "Donate Now" button

Detra/Flo moved to adjourn. The meeting was closed with prayer by David Reames.

Heat Exhaustion

Heat exhaustion is a condition that results from your body overheating. Heat exhaustion is caused by exposure to high temperatures often combined with high humidity and strenuous exercise. Heat exhaustion can lead to heatstroke, a life threatening condition.

Anyone can develop heat exhaustion, but certain factors can increase your risk.

Risk Factors

Age Infants and children 4 years and younger, adults older than 65 years of age.

Certain Drugs Some medications to treat high blood pressure and heart problems

(beta blockers. diuretics), antihistamines, tranquilizers, anti-psychotics, and some illegal drugs such as cocaine.

<u>Obesity</u> <u>Sudden Temperature Changes</u> <u>High Heat Index</u>

Symptoms

Cool moist skin with goose bumps
Heavy sweating
Faintness, dizziness
Fatigue
Weak rapid pulse, low blood pressure
Muscle cramps
Nausea
Headache

If you think you are experiencing heat exhaustion:

- Stop all activity and rest.
- Move to a cool place.
- Drink cool water or sports drinks.
- Seek medical attention if your symptoms worsen or don't improve in 1 hour.

If you are with someone showing signs of heat exhaustion and they become confused, agitated or signs of inability to think, seek immediate medical attention.

Stay cool and be safe.



How to Scan a QR Code on an iPhone

To scan a QR code on your iPhone, all you have to do is open the Camera app and point your phone at the QR code. Make sure the QR code is inside the box on your screen and then tap the pop-up notification.

- 1. **Open the Camera app on your iPhone.** You can find the Camera app by swiping left on your Lock Screen, selecting it from the Control Center, or opening the app directly from the Home screen.
- 2. Then point your iPhone at the QR code to scan it. You don't have to fill the entire screen, but make sure that all four corners of the QR code are in view. One you correctly scan the QR code, a pop-up notification will appear on top of your screen.
- 3. **Finally, tap the pop-up notification at the top of your screen.** This will run the action contained in the QR code, such as sending you to a website or opening the App Store.

Note: If you do not see a notification pop up, make sure that you have the Scan QR Codes feature enabled. You can do this by going to Settings > Camera and tapping the slider next to Scan QR Codes. You will know it is turned on when it is green.

How to Scan a QR code on an Android Phone

If you're running Android 8 or later, you can scan a QR code by long-pressing the home button and selecting *Lens*. Then point your camera at the QR code, tap the magnifying glass icon, and tap the pop-up notification.

- 1. Press and hold the home button.
- 2. **Then tap** *Lens***.** This is the circle surrounded by lines to the left of the four colored buttons at the bottom of your screen.

Note: A prompt will appear if it's your first time to use this feature. If it does, simply choose Allow. If you don't have Google Assistant on your Android, you can download the Google Lens app from the Google Play Store.

- 3. **Point your camera at the QR code.** You don't have to fill the entire screen, but make sure that all four corners of the QR code are in view.
- 4. Then tap the magnifying glass icon to scan the QR code. You can find this at the bottom of your screen.
- 5. **Finally, tap the pop-up notification.** You will then be directed to the information or action embedded in the QR code. This could open a webpage, open the Google Play Store, save a contact, and more.



With Drive-thru Holy Communion



Holy Communion Process for Parking Lot Worshipers:

Parking lot worshippers will receive communion at the same time as the inside worshippers as shown in the bulletin. Cars will be routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the playground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and a tray will be extended to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distribute communion to passengers. All assistants will be wearing gloves and mask, and the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, you are encouraged to remain for the closing of the service.

HTLC is scheduled to "host" Family Promise again the week of June 27.

"Hosting" now means that the only thing we do is supply food for the week and with families now staying in a motel. Family Promise seems to prefer food gift cards or money with which to buy food rather than actual cooked food. For the week of June 27 we will be supplying food gift cards which will be charged to one of our Outreach accounts.

Our next time to host after that this year will be the week of **September 26** and that will happen inside our church just like we used to do.



AV Update

Setting Up Conference Room for Zoom Meetings

Testers Needed



We are at the point of being ready to test that capability in the upstairs or Sunday School conference room. Zoom participants will be visible on the wall mounted TV just as in a Zoom meeting where all are separated. At-home participants will see an overview of the room and will be able to see all participants in a group setting. They will also see other at-home participants on their screen. Audio will be through the TV for those at home to be heard in the conference room. The audio system can not handle multiple speakers, just as is the case with traditional Zoom, so participants will need to take turns speaking. Those attending in the conference room will NOT log in via their own computers.

The equipment is ready for a "beta test" – the equipment is available and ready to work. Not all the cables are concealed yet, and the instructions for solo use are not yet ready. However, if some committee or class wants to try a meeting, AV will help set it up and get it going. That would actually be helpful in testing and pulling together clear documentation. We are pretty confident this will work satisfactorily.

For this meeting and for those going forward, the meeting or class leader will need to schedule the Zoom meeting and send meeting notices to all participants (well, at least those who will be at home) PLUS send one to <a href="https://htt

This Sunday is the 6th Sunday after Pentecost

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:1-5

In 597 BCE, the priest Ezekiel was removed into exile in Babylon. While there, he received a vision of God appearing majestically on a chariot throne. Today's reading recounts God's commissioning of Ezekiel during this vision. The prophet is to speak God's word to a people unwilling to hear.

¹[A voice] said to me: O mortal, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you. ²And when he spoke to me, a spirit entered into me and set me on my feet; and I heard him speaking to me. ³He said to me, Mortal, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to a nation of rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have transgressed against me to this very day. ⁴The descendants are impudent and stubborn. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, "Thus says the Lord God." ⁵Whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house), they shall know that there has been a prophet among them.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

Christians do not boast of their own accomplishments. Rather, Christian boasting focuses attention on how the power of Christ is present in our lives, especially in times of weakness and vulnerability. No matter what our circumstances in life, Christ's grace is sufficient for us.

²I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. ³And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows—⁴was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. ⁵On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, ⁷even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, ⁹but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

Gospel: Mark 6:1-13

At home and abroad, Jesus and his disciples encounter resistance as they seek to proclaim God's word and relieve affliction.

¹[Jesus] came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him.²On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! ³Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. ⁴Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house." ⁵And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. ⁶And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. ⁷He called the twelve and began to send them

out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. ⁸He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; ⁹but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. ¹⁰He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. ¹¹If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." ¹²So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. ¹³They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.
