Holy Trinity Lutheran Church
Plan for continued removal of COVID restrictions
Approved by Council on May 17, 2021 but subject to change if conditions change

May 2	Return to worship in nave with masks and social distancing but no singing – PREVIOUSLY APPROVED AND COMPLETE
May 10	Return to in person meetings/classes/nursery for vaccinated* individuals with social distancing and other restrictions – PREVIOUSLY APPROVED AND COMMUNICATED
June 6	Remove singing restriction (but still with masks) – PREVIOUSLY APPROVED AND COMMUNICATED for this date
June 27	Remove masking requirement for vaccinated* individuals and reinstitute use of choir
July 11	Remove social distancing seating and building single entry point requirements
July 25	Remove contactless communion requirement
August 8	Discontinue all remaining COVID practices and restrictions, including drive-thru communion and all masking for services as well as discontinue all meeting and coffee hour restrictions

Changes in public health in the congregation and/or community or additional guidance from the CDC, Synod, etc. may necessitate or allow changes to this plan (**including removing restrictions more rapidly or more slowly or reinstituting restrictions**). But, barring any changes, this is how Holy Trinity will move forward with removing COVID restrictions based on information available to Council at this time.

How can you help ensure this plan becomes reality? Get vaccinated if you are not. Encourage others to get vaccinated. As masks now come off in the community, we run the risk of seeing case increases in the community that could derail this plan without wider vaccination.

*Those who have had COVID and recovered are considered to have been “vaccinated” for our purposes.

To be determined: The future of local FM broadcast. Council presently sees this as in issue for Worship and Music and Outreach apart from COVID requirements.

The meeting was called to order by David Reames.

Devotions and prayer were presented by Pastor Scottie.

Minutes of the April council meeting were approved. David H/John P

Financial reports were presented by Paul Castille. The "Donate Now" site is ready for use. It will be added to the website and instructions sent to the congregation when ready to begin using. We can also add special appeals, such as backpacks, when needed.

Jeff Bedford has agreed to audit the 2020 financials. Report to be completed by June 30.

Pastor Scottie and Sue Morgan's reports were reviewed. Reports approved Jo M/Detra C

Committee Reports: Reports received.

Old Business:

Church reopening: Recommendations passed John P / Jim L

Bob Bergemann reported on recommendations from the reopening task force. We will still be following the CDC recommendations. Changes include:

1. Committees, Bible study, Sunday School may meet in person. The nursery will be open during Sunday service.
2. Masks are required, attendees at meetings must be vaccinated - host of the meeting will ask attendees on the honor system.
3. Worship books will be returned to the pews. No special cleaning will be needed, there will be a week between uses.
4. No meal functions or coffee hour for now, except MOW
5. Singing during the service WITH MASK will resume on June 6 if there are no adverse changes in the COVID numbers but still with no choir David H / John P. Passed
6. Sunday meals will continue to be prepared and picked up at the Sevier St. door.

One problem noted was that people are not skipping rows for Sunday seating. David H suggested taping the vacant rows to make them more visible. He will discuss this with Joy Wood. Pastor suggested green tape to follow Pentecost season.

Vision 2020 roll out is on hold.

Family Promise video is completed, will be released soon.

Outreach projects such as pizza for the ED staff were discussed. Flo W will discuss options with Sue Morgan and Sue Rasmussen.

New Business:

Council election ballots were mailed today (May 10). They need to be returned by end of May. Installation of new council members tentatively set for June 13 or June 27.

Communication to council: Family Promise fundraiser would like permission to post items for sale on the HTLC website and Facebook page. More discussion will follow.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

An Epidemic That No Vaccine Can Fix Mass Shootings / Gun Violence

This is an extremely difficult topic to address, but we must be aware for no one and no place is immune. We hear and read daily of gun violence occurring in our society. When you are out in public you are at risk. Be alert and have a plan.

- Be aware of individual behavior, if it appears suspicious, report it. “ See Something Say Something “
- Be familiar with your location when inside a building, identify entrance and exit sites.
- When choosing seating, choose aisle seating close to exits.
- At restaurants sit with your back to the wall, facing the entrance.
- Become aware of the normalcy of the environment you are in, for example, the sights and sounds in a restaurant are people laughing and talking, eating and staff moving about. The sounds of a gunshot are not normal nor is screaming.
- When inside a building identify rooms such as bathrooms where you can hide, lock or barricade yourself.
- If ever in an active shooter situation, RUN, HIDE, FIGHT.
- Run to safety, leave your belongings behind, encourage others to run with you. Don't stay behind if others won't run.
- Call 911 once you are safe.
- If you can't run or evacuate the area. Hide from view of attacker. Put a solid barrier between you and the threat.
- Avoid hiding under tables or desks, they offer little protection.
- Get to rooms with doors you can lock or barricade, turn the lights off, silence phones. Be quiet.
- If outside hide behind buildings, walls, large trees.
- Defend, Disrupt, Fight as last resort.
- Use makeshift items such as chairs, scissors, fire extinguishers as weapon.

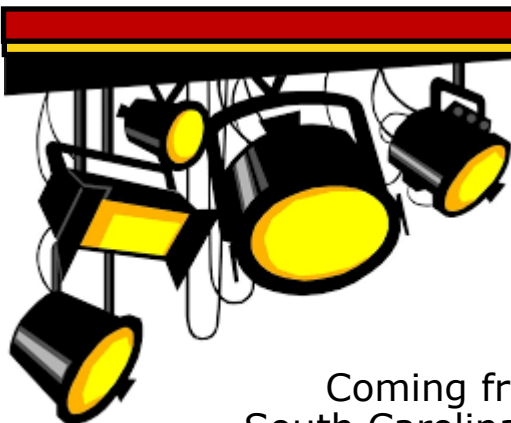

Spotlight on Members

The Reames & Nussmans

Coming from the roots of strong Lutheran country of South Carolina are two of our long-standing leaders in Holy Trinity, David & Laura Reames. They are the first of our two-generation Holy Trinity family to be spotlighted.

First things first. David was born in Newberry, SC and grew up in that area. Not surprisingly, highlights of his high school years were Luther League, school newspaper and yearbook photographer. From high school, David attended Newberry College for his BS degree and then Duke University where he obtained a PhD in Organic Chemistry.

Not spending all his time studying chemistry, David met a young lady, Laura Lake. They were both part of an interdenominational youth choir. (Guess who the group's sound man was!) They were married on June 15, 1975 and almost immediately moved to Durham, NC, and then moved again in 4 years when David took a job with Eastman Chemical which brought the young couple to Kingsport in 1979. David first retired in 2016 but was asked to come back to help with special projects in 2018. All told, he worked almost 40 years at Eastman in many different executive leadership roles in manufacturing, technology, and business management.

Laura was also born in Newberry, growing up with much involvement in church and school projects. She was one of her home church's organists before she was out of high school. She attended Piedmont Technical College in Greenwood, SC, where she graduated in 1974 with a degree in Surgical Technology. That training was a blessing because she has spent the next 46 years as a Certified Surgical Technologist. She started out at Newberry County Memorial Hospital, then Duke Medical Center (while David was in graduate school), finally on to Kingsport (in succession, she was first at Indian Path Medical center, then Kingsport Day Surgery from opening day till closing day, and currently Holston Valley Surgery Center). Her specialization has been ear/nose/throat surgery, so you can consult with her on your sinus problems!

Holy Trinity has benefited immensely from their membership and contribution of leadership. Their leadership has touched just about every aspect of our church – council, choir, Altar Guild, Worship & Music committee, bell choir, MoW, Sunday School teachers, youth group leader, call committees, vision team, audio visual committee, and on and on. One of their key contributions to Holy Trinity was that of the second Reames generation – their children, Allison (1980) and Whitney (1983). These two young ladies just carried right on with church activity in the footsteps of their parents. Both Allison and Whitney grew up in the church. They were in the youth group, youth choir, and volunteering in the nursery. They were actively involved in the life of Sullivan South High School.

Allison attended ETSU and then graduated from MTSU with a Mass Comm degree. She earned a Masters in Television Production at Boston University and then moved to Los Angeles/Hollywood, first for an internship and then for a series of jobs in television, working on The Young and the Restless, Boston Legal, All My Children, and General Hospital, where she has worked now for almost 16 years. She has had a number of responsibilities, including Associate Director, Editor, and now Director at General Hospital. She has accumulated 6 Daytime Television Emmy Awards for her work at GH.

Allison and Craig Smith were married in 2017. Craig is a native New Englander, having moved to LA to work in the movie industry. He is a special effects editor who has worked a number of movies, most recently Black Widow (not yet released due to COVID) and the last two Spider Man movies (one to be released later this year). They reside in Valley Village outside of LA. They share their home with two rescues, Roco and Lucy.

Whitney learned to deal with the general public at an early age by working at Boomerang Pizza in high school, then CVS Pharmacy, and finally Marcum's Pharmacy. She is a Certified Pharmacy Technician, and she has been with Marcum for 17 years, dealing every day with hard-to-read doctors' writing, insurance companies, and keeping the shelves stocked with the needed meds. With Marcum's, she has always thought of her church and has arranged shot clinics where Holy Trinity members can obtain flu shots on Sunday morning. They hope to (finally) move into their newly renovated building later this year (at the corner of Broad and Ravine – still neighbors with Holy Trinity).

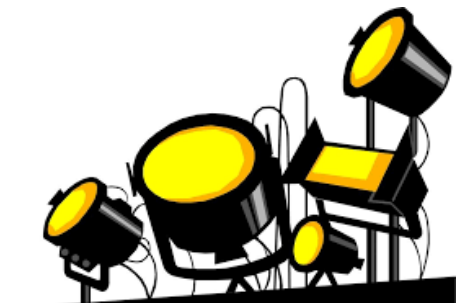

Stewardship — A Word with a Deeper Meaning

Stewardship . . . a word we tend to shy away from, especially in our churches. However, the definition of stewardship does NOT focus on dipping into our pockets for money. Here's a dictionary definition according to Merriam-Webster: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something . . . especially the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care.

Wow! It is exactly a phrase on how we should (and usually do) live our lives. At home, we take care of our possessions. With our children, we look after them, ensure their well-being, and guide them through life. At work, we do our best to achieve goals enhancing the business. In our Christian life, it's taking care of this wonderful world God has given us.

Why then, do we often shy away when we hear the word stewardship at "that time of the year"? How is it that the word stewardship makes us think of donating . . . of money? Is it that we focus only on our giving? What does that mean to you? Well, that time is over . . . not eliminated, but not the central focus on the word stewardship.

We at Holy Trinity are called to be good stewards in all we do . . . and we've made inroads such as LED lighting in the building, using our facilities to temporarily house those in need, and provide weekly meals to the less fortunate, to name but a few. In Scripture, there are many, many references to being a good steward. Here are some:

- 1) Genesis 1:28 And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."
- 2) Romans 12:6-8 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

- 3) Proverbs 16:3 Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.
- 4) 1 Timothy 6:17-19 As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life.
- 5) 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So, glorify God in your body.
- 6) Matthew 6:19-21 "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
- 7) Proverbs 3:9 Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce;
- 8) 1 Peter 4:10 As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace:
- 9) Malachi 3:10 Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need.
- 10) Luke 21:1-4 Jesus looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the offering box, ² and he saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. ³ And he said, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them. ⁴ For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."
- 11) Matthew 25:21 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'

There are many, many more references in the Bible. Still, notice that many do not focus on monetary giving, but giving of yourself . . . of your talents or your time as

we say, and we at Holy Trinity have been blessed with many who do give of themselves.

Yes, we will still be asking for pledges every year, but let's not limit ourselves to that one facet of stewardship. Let's broaden our outlook and search for things we can do within our church to better strive toward that definition of stewardship that makes our God smile down on us. I will try and write a small (yes, a SMALL) blurb in the Trumpet each month to look at our accomplishments and possibly new areas where we can be better stewards. Your input is welcomed! We would all love to hear our Lord say to us (as in Matthew 25:21) "Well done, good and faithful servant."

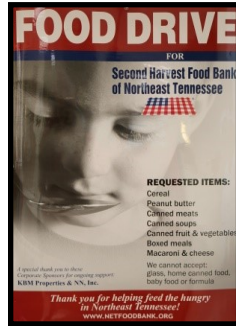

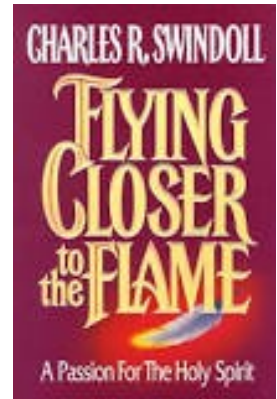
What do you know about the Holy Spirit?

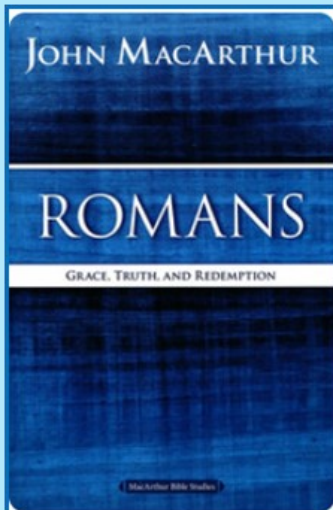
Men's Bible Study — Wednesdays 7:30 AM
