From the Pastor's Desk

Lent, one of the seasons of our church year, is often thought of as a penitential season. For some, focus on sorrow for sins is helpful as we look towards celebrating Jesus' victory over death. And if you are interested in talking about baptism, please call me and let's talk about this free gift of grace God offers to us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And together, may we all remember our baptism and the promise we have of new life in Christ. Amen

Committee Reports: W/M reported on plans for Ash Wednesday drive through service and on-line video Lenten services.

Old Business:

Church reopening:

We will continue with parking lot services with drive through communion. There will not be any live singing. There was discussion about when to move back to services in the Nave and how these would be held. There would also be options for continuing in the parking lot and for video viewing.

Ash Wednesday services were outlined in the W/M report.

Sunday meals will continue to prepare meals and have them picked up at the Sevier St. door. If we need to close, an option for MOW would be to buy catered meals to deliver.

Yes! Spring is near!

Yes! We can see a “glimmer of light at the end” of this long dark pandemic.

Yes! We want to see and hold our distant love ones and to socialize with those dear and near to us.

Yes! We want to experience a different view other than the one outside our kitchen window.

And Yes! We want to worship in our beautiful Nave.

But we must be careful. As of this date the CDC Guidelines for travel have not changed.

The statement from the CDC, “*Travel increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19.*”

“If you must travel” take precautions, steps to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.

- 1.) If eligible get fully vaccinated and wait 2 weeks after your second dose before you travel.
- 2.) Get tested with a viral test 1-3 days before you travel and keep a copy of your test results with you when traveling.
- 3.) Check for travel restrictions before you go.
- 4.) Wear a mask in public settings and on public transportation.
- 5.) Avoid crowds in and outside of buildings and stay 2 arm lengths apart.
- 6.) Wash your hands often and use hand sanitizer.
- 7.) Carry your own supply of masks, sanitizing wipes, hand sanitizer.
- 8.) Avoid contact with anyone who is sick.
- 9.) Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Don't travel if you or your traveling companion is sick, or positive for COVID or has had a known exposure.

Again, if you feel you must travel at this time go to the CDC web site and become informed of Travel Risk and learn how you can protect yourself and others.

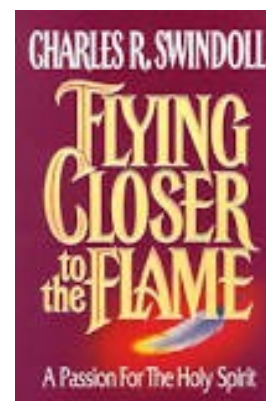
What do you know about the Holy Spirit?

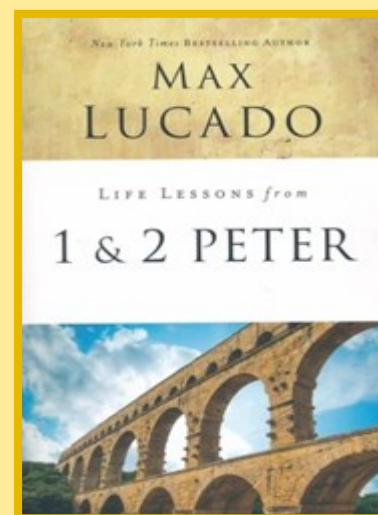

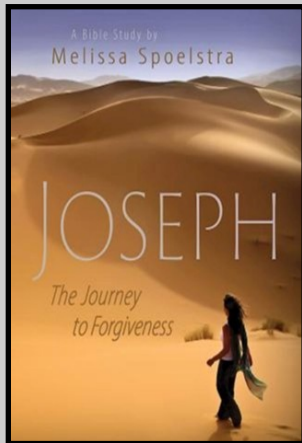

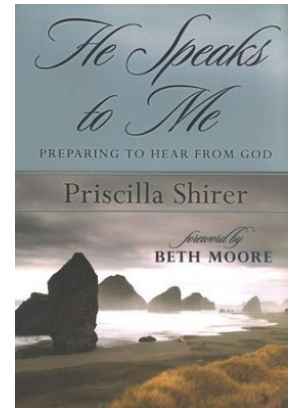

Outreach Update



Sunday Meals - With the help of many volunteers in the congregation, we are cooking and delivering around 25 meals each

Sunday. We are given the recipients list from Kingsport Meals-On-Wheels of folks in need of weekend meals. Kingsport MOW delivers about 220 meals/day during the week, but doesn't deliver on weekends. We used to deliver in years past around 35 meals on Sunday, but due to normal attrition the number has dwindled, and due to COVID, Kingsport MOW hasn't been able to interview for more needed weekend meals. This year we have lost some drivers and cooks so we need some more. If you would like to volunteer, let Betty & Jim Dickert know.

KCMC - Kingsport Community Ministry Center provides certain specific financial assistance to folks in need. During the pandemic KCMC is operating by appointment only. Bob Bergemann is president of the board and an interviewer.



School Backpacks & Sox & Undies Sundies - Last year our congregation was outstanding in responding to these needs. Our times for these activities this year will start in July with backpacks, and two weeks before Thanksgiving for sox & undies.

Food Bags - These are the small bags of non-perishable food kept in the gathering room closet. So far this year Pastor Scottie has given 17 bags out to hungry folks at Shades of Grace UMC downtown.

Family Promise - Since the pandemic, Family Promise has not been able to keep families in host churches. However, this agency is still working diligently to provide shelter and assistance to homeless families with minor children. Families initially were kept in leased apartments, but are now being kept in a motel due to the requirement of a government grant. Starting off 2021 there were two families in the program who have now found jobs, places to live, and moved out on their own. Currently there are three families in the program: father, mother, 11 month old child; father, mother, 3 year old child; and a single dad with 12 and 15 year old daughters. Host churches are still playing a role in this important ministry by supplying food to the families during their normal host week. HTLC's week was the week of January 24, and our members who supplied food or gift cards are very much appreciated. Our next time to host will be the week of April 18.

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year and thank you for your gift of \$300.00 to Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee (SHFBNT). I would like to share our recently updated food and distribution information that I hope will affirm what a difference you are making with your much needed gift.

Before the pandemic affected our region we were serving on average 40,000 neighbors in need each month. After the virus negatively impacted our economy the number grew to 45,000. It is stunning to report that after our most recent tabulations, that number is now 55,000 needing help each month.

During the month of November alone, we distributed a record high 2.1 million pounds of food. This is an increase of 124% since before the pandemic. An average of 100 pounds of food were distributed to each household per month.

We were able to expand mobile food distribution sites from 60 to 70 locations as well as "pop-up" distribution sites held in communities with greater need. We also provided distributions at the warehouse during the months of June through December. This increased service could not have been done without financial support and without the help of individuals, business and service organization volunteers willing to help distribute food at these outdoor locations following strict safety protocol.

Our Food for Kids program and school distributions continued even though how these programs were implemented were revised due to COVID restrictions. We were able to serve students in thirteen school districts enabling approximately five thousand children and their families to be helped each month. SHFBNT also continued providing food to approximately 140 partner agencies like food pantries and soup kitchens while 95% of these partners remained open since COVID-19 affected our region.

In closing, I'd like to tell you about a gentleman I talked with at our December warehouse distribution. While I visited with him as his car was being loaded with food he looked at me with shock and immense sadness on his face and said, "I have never needed help before." We have heard this heartbreaking statement from so many neighbors who have come to the food bank for help. One middle aged woman also said in bewilderment, "My whole life I have never needed help until now".

On behalf of the Board of Directors and Staff, thank you again for helping neighbors like these two and so many more. You truly are making a difference and we are deeply grateful. With a heart full of hope that 2021 will be easier for everyone and that our vision of a hunger-free Northeast Tennessee will come to pass.

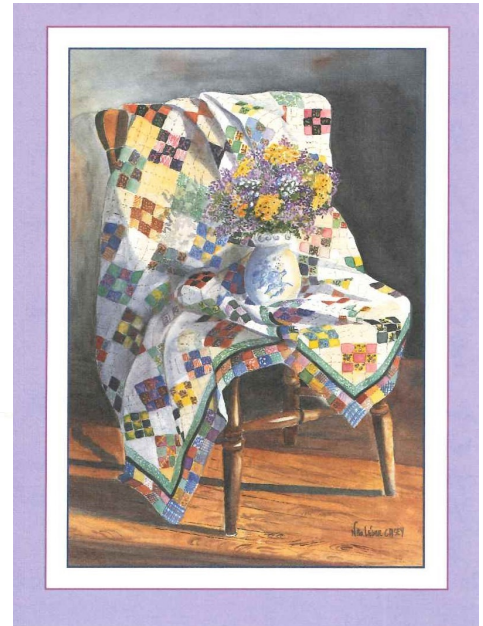

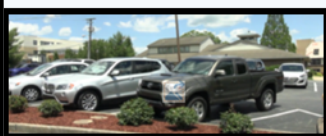

Parking:



Park in the main lot - facing the building.

Do not park in the few spaces directly along the sidewalk by the sign.



Additional parking is in the grassy lot across Broad Street from the sign.

Words of Institution



Holy Communion Process:

Cars will be routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the playground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and Pastor will extend a tray to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distribute communion to passengers. Pastor will be wearing gloves and mask, and the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, turn right toward the Urology building and exit by that building. **Music will be playing on our station throughout the Holy Communion process.**
