From the (Interim) Pastor....

You may wonder why I keep using and emphasizing the word Interim. It simply refers to the time in between. In our case, it is time in between two full-time pastors serving every day at Holy Trinity. I know you have missed the daily presence of a pastor among you, but my being interim should be reassurance that this time is temporary. What is *not* temporary, however, is the life of the congregation. It just keeps on going because God is always with us. Remember this as we proceed in the process of identifying and calling a pastor.

Now, for what I really want to say. Ash Wednesday is March 6, and with it comes the season of Lent. The traditional emphasis of this time for Christians has been introspection, confession, and self-denial. When I was growing up, we were encouraged to give something up for Lent – to do without something – to make us more reflective. Usually it had to do with food. I've got many stories of how this worked out in my young life.

This year my challenge is that you give up something more difficult and less superficial. Why not give up fear, or negativity, or anxiety, or gossip? These are things we probably would not miss. Imagine a world in their absence.

Recently, we have started to repeat our motto at the close of the Sunday Service as a reminder of who we are, as we go back into the community. I like it. This can also be a way of focusing our words and actions. Before we speak or act, we might ask, Does what I am about to say or do "help transform lives in Christ"? If not, why am I saying or doing it?!

And the commercial: Lenten worship services will begin with Ash Wednesday and the imposition of ashes. The next five Wednesdays will feature soup suppers and meditations on "Five Critical Bible Verses."

News from our ... Church Council

Summary of Minutes Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting February 11, 2019

Pastor Bangle's report indicated that the Call Committee is on schedule, attendance at worship is good, and the congregation continues to actively participating in ministry. He emphasized the importance of communication of members and the merit of the Healthy Congregations Workshop on March 2 from 9:30-3:30 and asked that we encourage those who are not signed up.

A Joint Recommendation of the Worship and Music Committee and the Mutual Ministry Committee was made to hire Susan Waters, Ph.D. (in Communications, BA in Music) as a part-time musician, i.e., organist/pianist following standard background check and approval of Dr. Waters. Council approved the recommendation unanimously.

The Finance Committee presented a recommendation of a continuing resolution to use the Trailer Bequest as a contingency fund. The continuing resolution passed unanimously and a copy placed with the HTLC Constitution and Bylaws.

The Call Committee presented a document describing the results of the 71 surveys regarding pastoral gifts and skills needed that will be shared with the congregation in the bulletin, update and Trumpet. A draft of the MSP has been sent to Synod and a preliminary review will be completed by Pastor Moravitz and possible revisions suggested. A final MSP will then be submitted and posted for review by potential pastors interested in a call.

Worship and Music Committee recommended a schedule of Lenten and Holy Week services. The Ash Wednesday service will take place on March 6 at 7:00 but no Soup Supper that night. Lenten services will follow on Wednesdays with Soup Supper at 6:00 and Service at 7:00. The recommendation was approved by Council unanimously.

Edna Kinner reported that an offer to repurchase the three crypts at the Tri-Cities Funeral Home has been made for \$1500. Council approved the sale since no buyers or interested parties had appeared over the past year.

<u>Call Committee Update: Thank you for your valuable input into the HTLC Ministry Site Profile (MSP).</u>

The Call Committee compiled the input received from the Congregation for our Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Ministry Site Profile Survey. There was good participation in the input process. The detailed summaries below represent <u>71 surveys.</u>

Here are a few general reminders and comments...

- 1. The content in the two forms the Congregation completed was taken DIRECTLY from the required ELCA Ministry Site Profile format it was not developed by the Call Committee. The ELCA developed this broad set of capabilities which have proven to be elements of a successful pastor. And, as a part of the formal Call Process, the ELCA encourages churches to customize capability preferences within these strong elements to support their unique mission, programs, goals and purpose.
- 2. The Call Committee has excellent input from the Congregation to insert into the Ministry Site Profile. The Call Committee recognizes that some of the capability survey results are close to the Top 5 highlighted; therefore, the full list of results will be shared with candidates during the interview process so they will have a complete view of HTLC's preferences.
- 3. The next key step includes submitting the Ministry Site Profile to the Synod in March.
- 4. After the Synod studies the customized HTLC Ministry Site Profile, the Bishop will facilitate the process to begin *confidentially* sharing potential candidates with the Call Committee. This phase is likely to begin in April.



This month Worship and Music Committee continues its series of <u>Trumpet</u> articles covering a variety of topics on symbols, colors, design/architecture, traditions, seasons, and festivals that many of us either don't think about very often or perhaps are not sure of the significance of these things. In the March article, we will repeat the comments on Ash Wednesday shared last time to refresh your memory before this year's Ash Wednesday, March 6) and discuss the season of Lent.

Ash Wednesday Lent

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is the day the Lenten season begins. It occurs forty days before Good Friday. The "official" name for this day is actually the "Day of Ashes" but because, being forty days before Good Friday it always falls on a Wednesday, it has become known as Ash Wednesday.



Why ashes? Ashes are a biblical symbol of mourning and penance. In Bible times, the custom was to fast, wear sackcloth, sit in dust and ashes and put dust and ashes on one's head. Sackcloth is no longer a part of our remembrance of Ash Wednesday, but the customs of fasting and putting ashes on one's forehead as a sign of mourning and penance have survived to this day. The ashes remind us that we are indeed mortal and are saved only by the grace of God.

<u>Lent</u>



The Season of Lent is one of repentance, which is reflected in the color purple (or violet) in the paraments, banners and drapes on the crosses. Lent is also a season of reflection, when believers focus on the sacrifices Christ made for us and on our need for a Savior. The reflection and self-examination are often aided through special devotional materials and scripture readings for this season. Some practice self-denial by giving up something from their normal life or routine such as a food item (chocolate,

coffee, sweets, etc.) or some practice (such as eating out, watching television, going to movies, etc.). These actions are intended to make us focus less on things and more on our need for the saving act upcoming at the end of Lent. Some of the actions are symbolic, but others can be more tangible – such as avoiding eating out and giving the money that would have been spent as an offering for some cause such as feeding the hungry.

Lent lasts forty days (not counting Sundays - Sundays are not counted because, even during Lent, Sunday celebrates the resurrection). Numbers often have special significance in scripture, and a given number often occurs repeated. Forty appears many times:

Moses spent 40 days with God on Mount Sinai

Elijah spent 40 days walking to Mount Horeb

God sent 40 days of rain in the great flood

The Hebrew people wandered 40 years on the way to the Promised Land

Jonah's prophecy gave Nineveh 40 days to repent or be destroyed

Jesus was alone in the wilderness for 40 days, facing temptation from the devil followed by ministry from angels



And, although it is not precisely Biblical, there is a traditional belief that Jesus lay in tomb for 40 hours (from late Friday till Sunday morning). Lent's 40 days are most often suggested as a parallel to Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness.

In addition to the use of purple paraments as already described, other changes are often made in worship during Lent. Musical selections traditionally do not include "Alleluia" or "Halleluiah" during Lent because these joyful words are not in keeping with the somber, meditative season. (Rather, they are reserved for Easter.)

While the mood of Lent is somber, it leads us to Easter, a season of unbridled joy. Christians experience the full cycle beginning with the joy of Advent that slowly fades into the acknowledgement of our sinful nature and our sin that results in the need for the Savior so that the terrible reality of Good Friday can have its full impact. That realization opens our hearts and minds to the Good News on Resurrection Sunday!



Explore how true wisdom is not merely intellectual but also moral, and how it gives us insight into the character of God, and how God gives wisdom to anyone who asks.





To make it easier to do this service, the following dates are all on Saturdays.


