MOVING FORWARD WITH FAITH, HOPE, AND LOVE

"And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 13:13

Greetings to all of you with love from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Well... We are finally here! After one year and 1 1/2 months, we hope and pray that we will be able to restore weekly worship in the Sanctuary and gather around the altar for the celebration of Holy Communion once again. You may recall that we moved worship from the worship space at Holy Trinity to the parking lot on March 15, 2020. And now here we are over a year later. With faith, hope, and love we re-enter our worship space on May 2, 2021.

You may also remember that we tried to re-enter our inside worship space on June 21st 2020 and after seeing Covid Counts quickly rise again, we returned to the parking lot for worship after only 2 weeks back inside. You may remember, we re-entered the sanctuary very cautiously on June 21. There was so much we did not know about COVID-19 at this point. Keep in mind that we had only been dealing with Covid for three months at this point. After returning to the parking lot again on July 5, who could have known that it would be May 2, 2021 before we decided it was safe to worship inside the church building again.

As I look back at last month's Trumpet article I wrote for the Pastor's article, **GRACE AFTER THE RAIN STORM**, I'm reminded that we have been through what seems like a continuing rainstorm (COVID-19) for an unprecedented time. I can imagine the questions that have been raised. Some may have even wondered where God has been through all of these months of fear and challenge and sacrifice.

Consider stopping for a moment and identifying God's grace along the way over these past 14 months. Where have you seen God active since March 13, 2020 at which time we first began learning about COVID-19? How has God's presence helped you through this difficult time?

I talked about the grace we all experience after the big rain storm. But think with me for a moment about the goodness of rain. Water provides nourishment. Water is sometimes a cleansing agent. Think about it. Water brings new life. COVID-19 has been like an ongoing rainstorm. But now I see *Grace. Now I see New Life*.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthian's, he writes about the Christian life and how love must govern the exercise of all the gifts of the Spirit. Love is not just a matter of feelings and many of us have been blessed to witness love in action during these Covid times. We have specially witnessed this from the manifestation of love from the medical community. We truly saw faith, hope, and love by people blessing people. And healing continues to manifest itself in new ways every day.

May your days ahead be brighter as we get a better handle on COVID-19. May you experience grace from God. May you also fine peace as you prayerfully consider new ways to worship and celebrate Holy Communion in the days ahead. And I pray that you will be open to the Holy Spirit's guidance all the days of your life as we continue **MOVING FORWARD WITH FAITH, HOPE, AND LOVE.**

Holy Trinity Council Election Information

Council election will be held during the month of May. We will be electing 4 persons to Council for two-year terms. The candidates are Leigh Bergemann, Kristi Grady, Abby Jantzi, Charlie Nitschke, Tim Perry, John Pollak, and Flo Weierbach. These persons have agreed to serve if elected. We thank them for their willingness to serve us all as Council members.

Each confirmed member of Holy Trinity is eligible to cast a ballot for 4 of these 7 individuals.

The process and time line is as follows:

Not later than May 3: Bios of the candidates will be e-mailed to members.

<u>Week of May 10</u>: Ballots will be mailed (US mail) to members. (Voting is being done by US mail again this year as was done last year due to the pandemic conditions. The intent is to ensure that all members can cast a ballot if desired.)

Not later than May 25: Mail completed ballots for your household to the church office in the stamped, pre-addressed envelope provided. As a convenience in preparing the mailing, 3 ballots will be mailed to each address. One ballot is to be completed by each confirmed member. Discard un-need copies or make additional copies as needed (on the honor system – this is, after all, a church election!). Ballots must be received in the church office by Monday, May 31, to be counted.

<u>Early June</u>: Results will be announced in the weekly update after all candidates are notified of results.

<u>Late June</u>: Newly elected members will be installed during a worship service.

<u>July 1</u>: Newly elected members begin their service.

Church reopening:

We will continue with parking lot services with drive through communion until May 2, 2021. We will follow the previous guidelines for services. There will not be any live singing. There will also be continuing FM broadcast of service in the parking lot and video viewing. We will continue to not have meetings for now. The reopening task force will look at options and present recommendations for other meetings/gatherings at the May Council meeting.

Sue Morgan reported that 82% of those who usually attend services are vaccinated. This does not include youth or those in nursing homes/assisted living.

Sunday meals will continue to prepare meals and have them picked up at the Sevier St. door

Vision 2020 roll out is on hold.

Safety and security updates are completed.

Bob Bergman has agreed to chair the Stewardship committee.

Outreach projects such as pizza for the ED staff were discussed. Flo W will discuss options with Sue Morgan and Sue Rasmussen.


What do you know about the Holy Spirit?

Romans gives us the opportunity to catch insightful glimpses into the nature and character of the first-century church and its members.



Parking for parking lot worshippers:

Park in the grass lot - in the grassy lot across Broad Street from the sign.

Holy Communion Process for Parking Lot Worshippers:

Parking lot worshippers will receive communion at the same time as the inside worshippers as shown in the bulletin. Cars will be routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the play-



ground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and a tray will be extended to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distribute communion to passengers. All assistants will be wearing gloves and mask, and the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, you are encouraged to remain for the closing of the service.

Remember, 10AM service, FM 99.7, "WHTL"!
