

From the Pastor's Desk

Holy Trinity Kingsport will Continue Suspending Worship through May.

Remember that life truly is fragile so handle with prayer. I write to you again here at the end of April 2020. I am finding it difficult to even write this message. Our church council has made a decision to continue not opening our doors for worship at Holy Trinity for the month of May. Even though citizens of the United States are moving about more freely now, we believe it is in the best interest of our worshipping community to continue the same practice of not holding worship in May at Holy Trinity.

The United States government is opening the gates so to speak and thereby allowing more freedom to move about in these trying times while we continue living with this *Coronavirus Pandemic* for which there is still no vaccine. I know there are those who believe it is for the best interest of our economy that we begin reducing our restrictions which for many of us, began in the middle of March. Yet there are no consistent measures being taken from state to state in these United States. I pray folks will not go far although they will be free to cross state lines. So although there is more freedom now, remember these three words: Choices-Decisions-Consequences! Please continue to pray with me that God will give us wisdom for the days ahead.

Let me encourage you to remember the acronym I gave you last month for prayer. ACTS!

Acclamation (Praising God)
Confession (Confessing our sin)
Thanksgiving (Giving thanks to God)
Supplication (Our requests to God)

We will continue to pray God will give us wisdom and discernment in order that we make the best decisions for the safety and health of our church body. I pray that God will continue to strengthen us all in body, mind, and spirit as we navigate the days ahead.

In conclusion, let me remind you that we prayerfully considered everything our larger church body recommended as we made decisions for worship and also for Holy Communion. With many of our members being 65 and older, we would be a tremendous risk to gather together for worship at this time. We also believe that it is the best interest of our church body to wait until we are all together again to share in Holy Communion. Remember that Christ is fully present in both Word and Sacrament. Therefore, all of us have the opportunity to be connected to Christ and each other through God's Word even as we are physically separated.

So let's recap where we are...

- 1. We will not worship together in May. You will be notified should we make a change in this decision.
- 2. We will remain connected in Word and prayer.
- 3. Our website (holytrinitykingsport.org) includes weekly worship opportunities on video. Go to our website and click on our services to find a link to the videos.
- 4. Our website also includes an up-to-date calendar and other important information.
- 5. Weekly updates go out and sometimes include encouraging videos as well.
- 6. We will continue sending hard copies of our activities to those who are not connected with the Internet. (Please call the church office if there is anyone else who has no internet connection.)
- 7. I am always available to speak with you by telephone. You may call 423–247–9106 office or my cell, 864-561-5700.
- 8. Please continue to watch for email updates.
- 9. We will continue having ZOOM meetings as necessary.

I hope to have the opportunity to talk with many more of you in May. We will do everything we can to keep us connected in every way possible with your safety being at the center of our decisions. Keep the faith and we will keep moving forward together.

As Myra and I were walking in our neighborhood this morning, she said,

"I will be so happy when we can all be together at our church. I'm getting to know people at church and I want to be back together again."

I could not agree more with what Myra is saying. It will be a celebration for us all when we are back together again. As Myra also shared with me,

"We will truly celebrate Easter together."



SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES

April 13, 2020

Meeting held by Zoom, was opened with prayer led by Pastor Scottie.

Minutes of March meeting, Treasurer's report and Financial Secretary's report were all reviewed and approved as submitted.

Parish Nurse Sue's report had been distributed in advance. She reports no new illnesses that she is aware of in the congregation.

Pastor has been busy recording and delivering messages and worship services and connecting with congregation members using new communication and technology ways. He was especially busy during Holy Week and thanked Joy Wood and Susan Waters with their help in providing music for Easter Sunday.

A generous gift from the DeGreen family designated for Audio Visual use was recognized. A thank you from council for the congregation will be sent.

A recommendation was received to consider a constitutional change to reducing the size of our council membership from 12 to 8 elected members. Much discussion revealed that this is an item that has been discussed for several years. The size of our congregation and the many other ministries that members need to be involved in make it more difficult to fill 12 seats on council. After much deliberation on the pros and cons, it was an overwhelming and unanimous decision to move forward by calling a congregational meeting to recommend this change. Communication to the congregation will begin right away and will be carried out over the next 30 days prior to a vote. New ways to communicate and vote are being worked on in the event we are still in a restricted congregating in person mode.

Vision 2020 team has wrapped up their work on proposing a modification in our Vision and Mission for Holy Trinity in the years ahead. This will be proposed to Council in a special meeting and then to the congregation. This will move us along our roadmap to the place where we, with the Holy Spirit's guidance, will be ready to identify the mission fields and ministries where we are being called to focus our resources in the days and years ahead.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

This month Worship and Music Committee continues its series of Trumpet articles covering a variety of topics on symbols, colors, design/architecture, traditions, seasons, and festivals that many of us either don't think about very often or perhaps are not sure of the significance of these things. This month we share information about the seasonal and festival colors we see in worship.

The Meaning and Use of Liturgical Colors

In the Christian tradition colors are used for vestments and paraments, but a unified system of colors developed only gradually and haphazardly until and through the Middle Ages. Today, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America provides a system of colors for use by its congregations; for the most part, the same system is also used by Roman and Anglican churches, at least in the United States; and by many churches around the world, including the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada.

Many of the colors associated with the seasons are closely linked with the experience of Christians in the Northern hemisphere. Christians in the Southern hemisphere will experience the church year differently in that context, perhaps calling forth different color associations. It is also helpful to realize that colors have different associations across the globe, just as they have had different associations over the course of the church's history. For example, white is the color North American and European Christians typically associate with Christmas and Easter, the color white signifying the purity of Christ, light or joy. In many Eastern cultures, however, white connotes mourning. Red, associated with energy, blood or fire among other things in Western culture, is the color associated with purity in India.

The colors serve to adorn the worship space, and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. A brief summary of their usage, according to the church year, follows.

Advent: Blue is associated with Advent, suggesting hope. This association originated in Scandinavia, probably because purple dye was too expensive for churches to use. Some assemblies use purple in Advent, a color associated with royalty as the church awaits the newborn king. (note, this is a different meaning than when it is used in Lent; see below).

Christmas: White, calling to mind the purity of the newborn Christ, and to our light and joy in him. Some also use Gold.

Epiphany of Our Lord: White (see Christmas).

Baptism of Our Lord: White (see Christmas).

Time after Epiphany: Green is used for its symbolism of our growth in Christ. Green, in a sense, is a "neutral color," used when more festive or more somber color is not appointed.

Transfiguration of Our Lord: White (see Christmas).

Ash Wednesday: Purple is the preferred color as this is the first day of Lent. Historically, black has also been used on this day, since it is the color of the ashes to which we will all return.

Lent: Purple is typically associated with Lent, suggesting repentance and solemnity.

Sunday of the Passion: Scarlet is the preferred color of this first day of Holy Week, as it suggests the deep color of blood. (Scarlet is to be distinguished from the brighter color of red, which is appointed for the Day of

Pentecost, martyrs' days, and certain church celebrations). If a parish does not have scarlet vestments, purple may be used.

Days of Holy Week: Scarlet or purple may be used for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week.

Maundy Thursday: For this fourth day of Holy Week, celebrated as the institution of the Lord's Supper, scarlet or white is used.

Good Friday: No vestments or paraments are used on this day, after the stripping of the altar on Maundy Thursday night.

Vigil of Easter: White or Gold suggests of joy in the Resurrection is used on this night.

Easter Day: White or gold is suggested for this day. The gold color symbolizes that this day is the "queen of feasts," unique in the entire church year.

Sundays of Easter: White suggests the joy of the resurrection.

Day of Pentecost: Red as the color of fire is used on this day when we remember the tongues of fire descended on the crowd in Jerusalem. In contrast to the color of scarlet, Pentecost's red is a bright color.

The Holy Trinity: White is suggested, the expression of joy in the mystery of the Triune God.

Time after Pentecost: Green is used, to indicate our growth in faith as we follow the teachings and ministry of Christ. Some assemblies use differing shades of green throughout the Sundays after Pentecost, a lighter green in summer and a darker green in fall.

Christ the King: The final day of the church year uses white, a festive color suggesting light, joy, and the celebration of our Lord.

Lesser festivals and commemorations are white, unless a martyr is celebrated, in which case bright red is suggested.




