"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever." Psalm 136:1

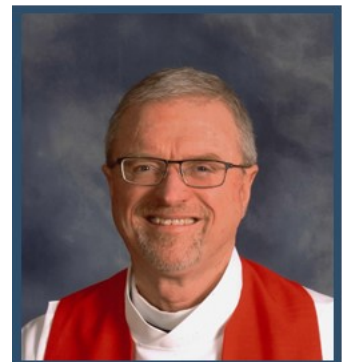

Church Council – Called Meeting – October 22, 2020

Council met via a called Zoom meeting to discuss our reopening guidelines in light if the COVID case increases in Sullivan County and NETN. The following guidelines were approved for immediate implementation. The situation will be reassessed at the November 9 Council meeting. Council members will call parishioners to check in on them as well as to answer any questions they have about the Council action.

SHORT-TERM PLAN FOR SERVICES AND BUILDING ACCESS

October 22, 2020

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Kingsport, TN

The following changes to our worship plans and for building access were agreed by Council on 10/22/2020. These changes are in response to the substantial upturn in COVID cases locally as well as to the advent of known cases within our congregation. While Council regrets having to make these changes, we feel that we have to be good stewards of the health and safety of our members and staff. The situation will be reassessed at our Council meeting, Monday November 9, 2020.

All members are asked to pray without ceasing for our church and its mission, our church family and their health and safety, and for our nation and our world with all its uncertainty, division, and tension.

- No Holy Communion for the next three weeks (October 25, November 1, November 8) at worship but drive-in worship will continue
- No live singing for the next three weeks
- Church staff will work from home
- Masks are required to enter the building
- Minimize visits to building and duration
- Maintain social distance with anyone you encounter in the building
- No one comes into the building on Thursday except Janet Thomas who will do printing and mailing
- Sunday Meals on Wheels will continue at present. HOWEVER, cooks are asked to take meals to the SEVIER STREET entrance and hand off to drivers there to minimize building entry. Sunday meals is also being asked to develop a contingency plan in case Council feels it necessary to suspend cooking for a time.
- Each person decides for themselves whether they feel safe to do activities at the church; err on the side of protecting yourself AND protecting others

A few additional comments:

- Council reaffirmed its commitment to our Red-Yellow-Green plan as its guiding document
- Adult Sunday School and Bible Studies will continue by Zoom
- Committee Meetings should continue with Zoom or by finding outdoor, socially distanced meeting options
- Recognizing that Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas are approaching, Council encourages Committees to look closely at how we can still make these special seasons meaningful and memorable for our members despite current limitations. Consider what we can do while still keeping members safe.

Property: High temperature sensors have been applied to freezers. The alarms are on the water cooler outside the music suite.

Stewardship: Abby Jantzi led the Creation Conservation event at Bays Mt Park. Pledge cards are being passed out to members

The reopening plan was reviewed and discussed. The council will meet via Zoom on October 26 to discuss further. (This date was changed to October 22).

The second Vision 2020 will be released October 13.

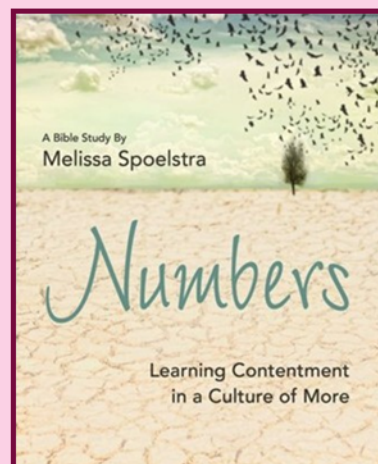

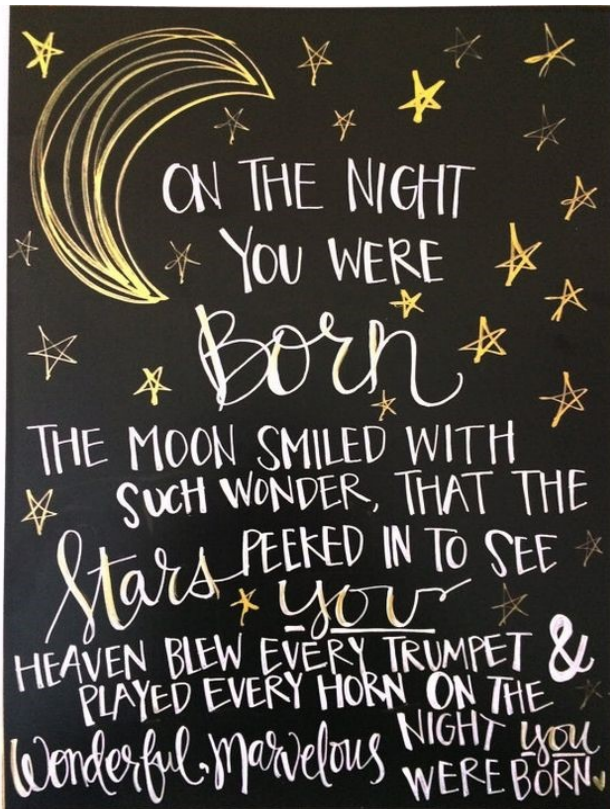

SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICY

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church

Date Approved: June 2020

Introduction:

Security of our property and financial assets, and safety for our people are paramount to providing a safe place to worship and work at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (HTLC). The church presents a unique and challenging situation when it comes to crime prevention, so this document attempts to provide guidance in the “hardening” of an open environment without interfering with HTLC’s mission in service and outreach. The church should be mindful however, that the more involved in community outreach it is, the more the potential risk of having an incident. A policy addressing security and safety is necessary and prudent.

One of the main obstacles in the mitigation of criminal intent in a house of worship is the belief that such places are immune to crime. However, this has always been a false belief, for even the Bible talks of “... gatekeepers...entrusted with the responsibility for the rooms and treasures the house of God.” (1 Chronicles, Chap. 9). The following procedural guidance on such internal issues as access control, opening and closing routines, cash management, property inventory, availability of church property (e.g. chairs and tables, AV equipment, etc.), along with an increased vigilance and awareness, shall be followed either on a routine basis or in the event of an emergency. External issues involve the parking lot, surrounding neighborhood, areas of concealment, and off-site activities (ministry trips, picnics, other outings, etc.).

Doors and Exits

For the purpose of these policies, exit doors are identified as primary or secondary. Security cameras are in place on all the primary exit doors and easy open “bump bars” are on all the doors. All exit doors are marked with lighted exit signs. The cameras and doors should be routinely inspected and maintained. Opening announcements for any large gatherings with visitors and new members should include notification of any exits to be used in case of emergency.

Primary doors are:

- Main exit (door from gathering room to the outside parking lot),
- Narthex exit (door leading from the narthex to the outside nearest to Broad Street), and
- Sevier Street exit (Door on lower level that opens onto Sevier Street).

Secondary doors are

1. Prayer Chapel door (Door through prayer chapel / Columbarium area),
2. Choir Room door (door from choir room on lower level to outside, and
3. Storage room door (door on lower level leading outside toward the basketball court. The secondary doors should be used only in event of extreme emergency when they are obviously the only or best way out.



PLEASE if you use the building please make sure the door is locked behind you when you leave. This is easy to miss if the door closes but does not fully catch. So please double check, especially if you do not leave via a main door. If you have any questions please contact Cal Churn or Dave Hrivnak. **Thank you**
