

HEARERS AND DOERS

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Greetings to everyone. September 2020 is an amazing time for us to be doing ministry together. God has filled my mind and my heart with many

thoughts and possibilities. Please allow me to share some of these thoughts with you.

I wonder if our experience of ministry here at HTLC might be somewhat similar to what the pioneers of this ministry experienced as disciples of Jesus Christ when it began in 1917. I believe we are also pioneers in God's ministry as disciples of Jesus Christ in the year 2020 AD. Mutual Ministry: Working on annual member replacement.

Outreach: The church has purchased backpacks for distribution to Kingsport city schools and Dickenson county. Family promise has received a grant to rent two apartments for short term use for families during the pandemic. We still need coordinators for Family Promise. James and Carolyn Chandler will retire from this position in January.

Old Business:

Bob Bergman has agreed to serve as Synod Disaster liaison. This position will allow better flow of information during the COVID pandemic.

The facility reopening policy was reviewed. We will follow the Sullivan County green/yellow/red plan for services with a one to two-week ongoing plan. Pastor will announce at Sunday service for the next week. For now, we will continue our outside services.

Finding cures. Saving children.

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is well known to most Holy Trinity members. Our own Brady Nussman was a St. Jude patient, and each year many of you participate with and/or contribute to *Brady's Bunch*, the team bearing his name in annual **St. Jude Walk/Run to End Childhood Cancer**. This year, the Walk/Run in the TriCities will be VIRTUAL, but your support is still needed and appreciated.

Follow this link and then choose if you wish to join the team and become a fund raiser ("Join Whitney's Team") or just make a donation ("Donate"). Either choice is fine – there are some who join the team, make a donation, and encourage others to donate while others choose simply to donate. Either way, you are honoring Brady's memory and helping in the fight against these deadly diseases. And we appreciate your support!

This year, the VIRTUAL walk will be Saturday, September 26. More information will be shared from St. Jude about the plans for the day. But that date at least serves as a target date for you to join the team and/or make a donation. The big event that day will be the announcement of funds raised – and TriCities is well on the way with about \$72,000 already raised toward a goal of \$180,000. You can help push TriCities over the top – and help kids along the way!

In so many ways St. Jude is unlike any other medical facility. It is the global leader in research for cures to many childhood diseases, and all its findings are freely shared globally with other treatment facilities. St. Jude treats patients in Memphis and in 8 affiliate clinics, including The St. Jude Tri-Cities Affiliate Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City. No family EVER pays St. Jude for treatment, travel, or lodging. The medical staff is absolutely unbelievable in their compassion and care for their patients and their families. The work must continue – not only to treat the cancers that can now be cured because of prior research but also to find cures for the tougher diseases. All that patient care and treatment as well as the research is costly – it costs St. Jude about \$1 billion a



year to operate (that's just under \$3 million a day!). The majority of that money comes from individual donors who give what they can to continue this fight. You can contribute at any time, but the Walk/Run is a nationwide focus event promoting the search for cures. Danny Thomas, the entertainer the older ones of you may remember, founded St. Jude in 1962. He said at that time "No child should die in the dawn of life." Sadly that is not yet reality, but your gift could help make it so.

Continuing on Sundays 10:00 AM


Join us in the parking lot for worship this week. The service will begin at 10AM and will last about 30 minutes. Then, for those who wish to participate, 'contactless' drive thru communion will be offered.



As you approach the church, tune your FM radio to 99.7. Beginning about 9:45AM there will be a broadcast with more detailed instructions on parking, the service, the communion, etc. That information will repeat until time for the ser-

vice. Basically park in the main lot, facing the building, but please do not park in the few spaces directly along the sidewalk by the sign. You may also park in the grassy lot across Broad Street from the sign.





The service will be heard on that same frequency (99.7) beginning at 10AM. At the conclusion, Holy Communion will be offered, with cars routed from the Broad Street entrance by the sign toward the playground. Stop by the Gathering Room doors and Pastor will extend a tray to the driver with enough communion (wafers and wine in individual glasses) for each person in the car. The driver will distrib-

ute communion to passengers. Pastor will be wearing gloves and mask,

and the napkin under the elements will be discarded each time in case the communicant touches the napkin. When finished communing, turn right toward the Urology building and exit by that building. Music will be playing on our station throughout the Holy Communion process.

Vaccines

Vaccination against disease has been present in human society for a very long time. We are most familiar with the story surrounding the development of the smallpox vaccine in the 1700's and most recently the development of the polio vaccine in the 1950's.

What is a vaccine? A vaccine is defined as a substance used to stimulate the production of antibodies to provide immunity against one or several diseases. The vaccine substance is prepared from the causing agent/germ/pathogen of the disease.

Vaccines are not agents that cure disease nor are they medications. They are substances taken by mouth, nasally, or by injection to prevent disease.

A vaccine works by training the immune system to recognize and combat pathogens/germs either virus or bacteria that can sicken and kill.

Immunization works well. Sometimes it does not provide complete protection against the disease but the vaccinated is likely to get the disease less severely. Those that have been vaccinated can respond more rapidly to combat the disease.

We have been created and wonderfully made and let us help our bodies to stay well and free of disease by being vaccinated.




Altar flowers enhance the beauty of the worship


