Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

I hope you all had a Merry Christmas and I pray you all have a safe and Happy New Year! We are beginning a new year, 2016 to be exact. It has been the norm for several years now that the January edition of The Evangelist contains an extended calendar of events so you can jot events down, in pencil, in your shiny new 2016 calendars; or plug them into your smart electronic device calendars. January sets the tone, and the agenda, for the rest of the year. A lot of the committee meetings that take place in January and the Vestry Retreat in early February are designed to plan out or rough draft the entire year of ministry. Looking into 2016, I was a little hesitant to plan much past February and I took a chance at writing in event dates into April.

We knew going into last year, 2015, that we were not going to have a "normal" year because of the 160th Anniversary Celebration and our respective Renewal Grant activities. Despite the uniqueness of the year, the various event planning committees had a pretty good handle on what was taking place and when it would take place; so creating a long-term calendar of events was practically done going into January 2015. That is not necessarily the case for 2016. I told anyone who would listen that after I got back from my Sabbatical, and the dust settled, that I wanted this congregation to be thinking ahead to the future and what the ministries of this parish would look like. We have changed as a congregation over the last few years, and it is time to be adapting to those changes. Moving forward together and taking into consideration our new reality, I ask us to consider a few questions. Where do we want to go together in ministry? Can we think three years down the line or even five years? Of utmost importance we need to be asking, Where is the Holy Spirit guiding us and leading us?

It will be important for us to balance Mission-mindedness with Maintenance-mindedness. We have a church building made of brick and motar and wood. We have a physical presence on the corner of 6th and Mulberry Street in which to call our command center for worshipping and serving Christ in our community. The privilege and responsibility of having this holy space requires us to be maintenanceminded. On Page 4 of this newsletter is a list of projects that the next Junior Warden and Vestry will need to address. Some tasks on the list need to be tackled soon and others could fall into the three to five year planning range. How will we budget and prioritize those projects. The Vestry and I have been assured by our Treasurer, Susan Harrison, that there is money available to finance some of these projects. Believe it or not, in another five years, we may be discussing the roof of the church again. We talked about the roof back in 2008 when we replaced the cupola, but we tabled the discussions because it was not yet time.

To be balanced, we must be equally mission-minded. On Page 7 of this newsletter is an article entitled, What ministries are you still excited about? I am asking the leadership of the parish and the entire congregation to help re-evaluate our mission priorities. I restate a saying I wrote in a recent newsletter. "How can we work smarter, not harder, to serve Christ?" Where do we want to put our energy and resources to keep our parish ministries lively and, dare I use the word, "fun"? What do we do best? Is our "best ministry" what we are currently know for by the community we live in and serve?

Finally, we are reminded in Christmas that the shepherds were led to Christ by the urging of the heavenly angels; and in Epiphany that the wise men were led to Christ by the shining of a star. What do we have at St. John's that we can use to lead others to find Christ among us in this new year of 2016 and beyond? Allen+




