Message from the Minister

You Are Not Enslaved to Your Past Ephesians 4:32-5:2

The Bible assumes that God is the decisive factor in making us what we should be. With wonderful bluntness the Bible says, "Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamor, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: And be ye kind one to another, tender-hearted..." (Eph. 4:31-32). It does not say, "If you can..." Or: "If your parents were tender-hearted to you..." Or: "If you weren't terribly wronged or abused..." It says, "Be...tender-hearted." This is wonderfully freeing. It frees us from the terrible fatalism that says change is impossible. It frees us from mechanistic views that make our backgrounds our destinies. God's commands always come with freeing, life-changing truth to believe. For example: "And be ye kind one to another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another [that's the command], even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you [that's the life-changing truth]. Be ye therefore followers of God [command], as dear children [life-changing truth]; And walk in love [command], as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savor [life-changing truth] (Eph. 4:32-5:2).

There is life-changing power in the truths of this text. Let's consider them, as we pray for that power to change us.

- 1. God adopted us as His children. We have a new Father and a new family. This breaks the fatalistic forces of our "family of origin." Hebrews 12:10-11 reminds us that our Heavenly Father disciplines us for our good, so that we can share in His holiness. In contrasting our earthly fathers with our Heavenly Father, one might say, "They did this…but He does that." This is a life-changing truth. We can know it, believe it, and be changed by it, no matter what kind of earthly fathers we have. God reveals Himself in His word to revolutionize our thinking about His fatherhood.
- 2. God loves us as His children. We are loved as "dear children." The command to imitate the love of God does not hang in the air; it comes with power: "Be ye therefore followers [imitators] of God, as dear children" (Eph. 5:1). "Love!" is the command and "being loved" is the power.
- **3.** God has forgiven us in Christ. Be tender-hearted and forgiving just as God in Christ forgave you. What God did for us becomes the power to change. He forgave us. That opens a relationship of love and a future of hope. And does not tender-heartedness flow from a heart overwhelmed with being loved undeservedly? The command to be tender-hearted has more to do with what God has done for us than what our mother or father did to us. We are not enslaved to our past.
- 4. Christ loved you and gave Himself up for you. "And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us" (Eph. 5:2). The command to walk in love comes with life-changing truth that we are loved. At the moment when there is a chance to love, and some voice says, "You are not a loving person," you can say, "Christ's love for me makes me a new kind of person. His command to love is just as surely possible for me as His promise of love is true for me."

Yes, change is possible. Pursue it until you are perfected at the coming of Christ. And to you, my University church of Christ family, Remember that our *Mission and Vision* statement here at the University Church of Christ includes you! We are "A New Testament church seeking to evangelize, starting with the central core of Greater Cleveland. We will use our unique gifts and opportunities to engage with the community to bring souls to Jesus, develop and equip them for a 21st century ministry." always remember that God loves you, Jesus died for you, I love you, and I am your servant for Jesus' sake!
