


Entrance Antiphon


Receive the joy of your glory, giving thanks to God, Who has called you into the heavenly kingdom, alleluia.



Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,



Homily

Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
