PASTOR TO PEOPLE

It is hard to imagine, but the summer season is quickly coming to a close. Soon, students and teachers alike will be returning to the classroom and parents will be giving a sigh of relief. During the past few months, we have sent over twenty children and youth to camp, co-sponsored Vacation Bible School with an average daily attendance of 120 children, and held two adult studies on Methodism and the current study on how the Scripture was canonized. And when many churches see low summer attendance and offerings, this congregation has remained strong.

With the return to school, the church also is making plans for new and renewed ministries. As previously announced by the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, Kim Hardaway will begin her ministry as Director of Children & Youth on August 1st. Kim has already begun making plans for LOGOS, Sunday Night Youth group, and other events and opportunities. Youth will kick-off on Sunday, August 5th with a cook-out and volleyball game. More information will be given as that day approaches.

Additionally, new adult studies will begin, although not all details have been completed. Leaders are currently being recruited to teach the *Growing Children God's Way* study. Some of you participated in that group a few years ago and have spoken highly of it. We are hoping to have two studies running, one for parents of younger children and another for those with teenagers.

Another study that I am putting together will be based on the small-group process of Grief Share. This study is designed for those who have experienced loss and changes in life. It utilizes videos and discussion as a means for healing and support.

A possibility for a second study is the Invitation to the Old Testament. Several of you participated in the New Testament study about a year ago and are familiar with the format. It too is video and discussion based. Again times and start dates for all of these are still being worked out, but we anticipate them starting soon after the school year or after Labor Day at the latest. If you have any other suggestions or ideas for topics that you would be interested in, please see either myself or Susan





THURSDAY, AUGUST 9 - Norman Rockwell in the 1940s: A View of the American Homefront at Rogers Historical Museum.

This traveling exhibition from the Norman Rockwell Museum in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, is composed of 40 popular Saturday Evening Post covers such as Rosie the Riveter and The Four Freedoms - the cornerstone of Rockwell's war years work. Exhibit augmented with items relating to WWII homefront activities in Benton County.

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 - Mount Magazine State Park.

Enjoy fine dining in the Skycrest Restaurant, with a spectacular view of the Petit Jean River Valley, Blue Mountain Lake, and Ouachita Mountains. Tall timbers and an impressive two-story chimney over a huge fireplace reflect a "parkitecture" style of a previous era.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 25 - Queen Wilhelmina State Park.

Take the Talimena Scenic Drive to the Park through the Ouachita Mountains. A spectacular mountaintop setting, breathtaking panoramic scenery; Queen Wilhelmina State Park is this and more. The park's crowning attraction is the lodge, with a tradition born with the original "Castle in the Sky" that graced this same locale high above the Ouachita Mountains over 100 years ago. Southern fare is served in the Queen's Restaurant. There is also a treasure-filled gift shop.

Admission: FREE - Pay for dinner individually.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 6 - Christmas Lights Tour, Honor Heights Park, Muskogee.

The Garden of Lights Festival runs from Thanksgiving Day through New Year's Day, nights only. This evening winter celebration includes a drive-through display of more than 1.2 million shimmering lights strung so that they enhance the natural beauty of the park's gardens, waterfalls and ponds.
