

News of Children and Youth

The youth fundraisers this summer have been hugely successful thanks to the generosity of our church family and friends in the community. Youth Force was 100% funded by your investment shares which included gas, supplies for the mission, and room and board for the youth laborers. The difference made in the lives we helped as well as the impact it made on those attending is priceless. A Stockholders Dinner was held July 20 in the Fellowship Hall to give a report on the investment.

"Shares for Missions" are still being sold for the youth who plan to attend the Spring Break 2009 United Nations/Washington D.C. Study Tour. This mission opportunity is once again through the OK Conference VIM for youth. We have 2 to 5 youth who are interested and willing to cover a percentage of the costs. Fundraising will determine how many are actually able to attend since airfare is a considerable part of the cost.

Beware of the Flamingo!

Many of you have had an attack of the flamingo as this newsletter comes out. Our flamingo handlers (aka youth) have been busy nightly watching over the flocks. Those flamingos are tricky little birds and just when you think you're in the clear, watch out!

The youth are very appreciative of the good-humored support the flamingos have received and plan to have them tamed and out of all yards before school starts

All funds raised from the flamingos will be put into the individual youth church accounts. This is to help with costs for the various church sponsored activities in which that youth participates. The more a youth helps with the fundraiser, a bigger percentage of the fundraiser that youth will receive.

ROTATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL will begin the first Sunday in September for Kindergarten through Middle School.

What we have always loved about Sunday School is the teaching of biblical content, interaction among children and adults within the church, and finding ways for children to feel nurtured spiritually and emotionally. In this new model, the biblical content is intensively taught and repeated over several weeks in five different stations.

Adults can be involved in the lives of the church's children and youth as station leaders, working in their area of giftedness, one unit at a time. Or adults can be shepherds whose purpose is to provide a consistent, nurturing person for the children and youth from week to week. The time commitment at any given time is five to six weeks.

Please be in prayer for our Sunday School as we enter into a period of transition to a model that promises to enhance what Sunday School has provided in the past.

What does UMW accomplish?

Is it just those meetings each month – a group of ladies having a good visit? UMW is that and much, much more. It is praying together for the needs of our church family and the community we live in. It is giving financial support to our community as well as our church.

So far this year, the Poteau unit of United Methodist Women has donated \$300 to the Christian Free Clinic and the same amount to LeFlore County Youth Services. The Ministerial Alliance received \$500, and \$1,000 was donated to the Womens Crisis Center. We also met our pledge to McAlester District UMW in the amount of \$1,500. This money in turn goes to the Oklahoma Conference UMW. Some of the money is used in the District and the Conference for administrative costs. Five hundred dollars has been pledged toward the purchase of more bells for the bell choir. We also contribute to missions such as Cookson Hills.

Education is one goal for UMW members. One of the most important tools in realizing the wide scope of UMW is our Spring and Fall district meetings. Our members' base of knowledge is increased by this means and also by our local meetings and reading programs.

We enjoy becoming closer within our church family through UMW fellowship and are proud of our accomplishments, always hoping and praying to have a larger outreach to souls in need.
