PASTOR TO PEOPLE

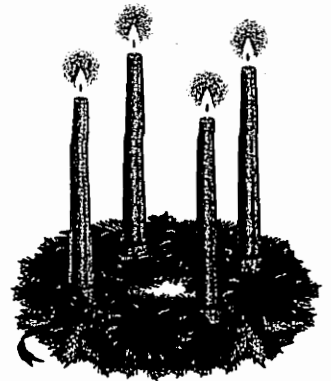
In just a few short days, the church will have the opportunity to begin her preparation for celebrating the birth of Christ. We have children practicing for the LOGOS program, handbells ringing, and the chancel choir singing. Scripture lessons for the Sundays of December point us toward the good news that God came to be with us.

One of my favorite hymns of the season is Charles Wesley's *Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus* because it signals for me the meaning behind all of that preparation. Wesley's poetry captures the expectation that through Jesus Christ God offers humankind freedom, rest, comfort, and hope. The birth of this particular child brings deliverance from the bondage of sin and establishes God's gracious kingdom in human hearts. The essential mission of Jesus Christ and his church is setting people free so that God might be made known.

One new opportunity that I am looking forward to for 2009 is a study called *Letters From Dad* being sponsored by the United Methodist Men. It is based upon the best selling book of the same name, written by Greg Vaughn. The purpose is to help men learn to leave a legacy by saying the things they've always wanted to say but just didn't know how. There will be a Kickoff BBQ Event to introduce *Letters From Dad* in the Family Life Center on Thursday, January 15. I know that seems like a long time from now, but I hope that all of the men of our congregation will set aside that date to learn more about the study.

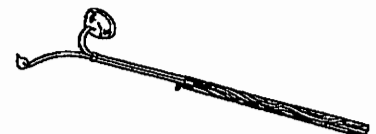

MONTHLY FOOD DRIVE

Locally there are children who do not get enough to eat when they are not in school. In response to this need, a clearinghouse in Ft. Smith coordinates with local schools in making "sacks" of food to be sent home each week with children who need food. Each month different items are collected so a steady supply of

the necessary foods is maintained.
