With the coming of another New Year, the Church also turns her attention to a celebration that is even more ancient than Christmas. The Day of Epiphany, January 6 originally focused on the nativity, incarnation, and baptism of Christ. Traditionally, the story of the Wise Men, who brought gifts to the Christ Child, is told. This day marks the end of the twelve days of Christmas, and the entire Christmas cycle that began on the First Sunday of Advent.

Because you are the God of our faith, we enter your gates with thanksgiving and praise, we come into your presence with gladness and joyful noise, and we serve and bless you. Amen.


