PASTOR TO PEOPLE

As I am writing this newsletter article, I am also working on the Ash Wednesday sermon. The Gospel lesson read on that day is found in the sixth chapter of Matthew. In Eugene Peterson's translation, *The Message*, the eighth verse says, "This is your Father you are dealing with, and he knows better than you what you need. With a God like this loving you, you can pray very simply." I think that might be one of the important lessons of this season, to keep it simple. Persons often give something up during Lent as an act of devotion, as a way of uncluttering our lives. The primary goal is so that space is created or freed up so that we can actually hear when God is speaking to us. To practice simplicity might mean to remove, even if for a short period, conflicting claims on our time and energy, so that we can spend time with God.

Several months ago, we had a church potluck dinner with round table discussion centered on our strengths as a congregation and the areas of ministry we would like to address. One area mentioned several times was our Sunday school ministry. I would extend the topic beyond just the Sunday school hour to include our total ministry of faith formation and education. So that the conversation might continue, there will be another potluck dinner on Sunday, March 11th immediately after worship. I hope that you will plan on attending and share any ideas that the congregation might need to consider.

I want to thank all those who have returned the commitment card to the church. At this time we have received 63 cards that represent pledges of \$221,492. That represents an increase of 37 cards over last year and about \$110,000 in monies pledged. This really represents more than financial support but also the giving of time, talent, and prayers. Thank you all for your ministry.
