### PASTOR TO PEOPLE

Let's do an experiment together. I want you to look around the room you are sitting in right now and find five things that have blue in it. Notice how easy that is? When something comes into focus for us it is easier to see more of it, isn't it? It's kind of like buying a new car. Isn't it crazy how many of that same car you start to see



as soon as you buy one? It seems like you see that car everywhere now. Is it because everyone else wants to be exactly like you and they all go out and buy a car just like it? Or maybe all those cars have been there all along. And now you are just looking for them because your new car has made that car a focus for you. I believe the same thing is true for us in our faith. It can seem like sometimes that God is distant. We wonder where God has been. It seems like God has gone absent. But maybe it isn't that God has gone absent, but that we have lost our focus in that area. When we develop a mindset to look for God and God's activity in the world, it's amazing how much more we see it. Soon we can see God's activity everywhere.

Let's do another experiment. I'm going to go on a journey, and I invite you to go with me. Every day in October I'm going to read Psalm 139. Read it every day with me. Let's see if we don't start seeing God active in the world if we remind ourselves of his presence and train our minds to look for him.

Psalm 139:

O Lord, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, O Lord, you know it completely. You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it. Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there. If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast. If I say, "Surely the darkness shall

cover me, and the light around me become night," even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you. For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed. How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! I try to count them—they are more

than the sand; I come to the end-I am still with you. O that you would kill the wicked, O God, and that the bloodthirsty would depart from me—those who speak of you maliciously, and lift themselves up against you for evil! Do I not hate those who hate you, O Lord? And do I not loathe those who rise up against you? I hate them with perfect hatred; I count them my enemies. Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts. See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.













# • Missions Report •
