PASTOR TO PEOPLE

One of my favorite characters in the Christmas story is Zechariah. When we meet the priest Zechariah he is in what was most likely the highest moment of his life. He has been chosen to enter the Holy of Holies to offer the sacrifice and light the incense. Just as he does so an angel of the Lord appears on the right side of the



altar.....and Zechariah is overwhelmed with fear as the angel tells him that he and his wife Elizabeth, although very advanced in age, will have a son.

Zechariah can't believe it! He'd been praying all these years....and as the childbearing years for him and Elizabeth faded into the past the dream of having a son faded with them. Zechariah replied to the angel, "How will I know that this is so? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years."

God broke through in his life in an unexpected way. This was not the only time God breaks through in unexpected ways in our scripture.... not by a long shot...

Abraham and Sarah had a baby. Moses had a speech impediment. Joshua parted the Jordan River like Moses did with the Red Sea. The Jericho walls fall down just because people marched around them and blew through a trumpet. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego hang out in a fiery furnace. And Daniel just walks right through the lion's den. And these examples are only the start of how God breaks through in unexpected ways.

Over and over again it seems that God uses unexpected people and unexpected circumstances to birth amazing moments in the lives of his children and I think that teaches us that God is looking at you and me. God may use us to break into the world in unexpected ways.

You don't have to be perfect or all put together to be used by God and your Christmas doesn't have to be perfect or all put together in order for it to be amazing. The lights, the family gatherings, the presents are nice but God is looking for a place in your heart to birth a savior. I believe God wants to break through the Christmas noise and do something unexpected. Are you ready?




