PASTOR TO PEOPLE

Have you ever met a person who says "Oh yay! A construction zone!" when driving down the highway? Me neither. And I have certainly never been that guy. It makes everything tighter. It slows us down. Sometimes it even sends us a completely different direction than the way we want to go. I read a story recently of a man who was working on a



part of the construction on I-40 although he was about to retire. He talked about his work and the interruptions that can happen like downpours of rain or a cold front and some ice. He talked about how people treated other drivers and the workers while they were driving in those construction zones. (That's an article for another time.) The man interviewing him asked him if, even though he was retiring, was there a part of him that was excited when it finally came time to drive on the new road, all open and free. He said that he didn't plan to ever drive that stretch of road on I-40 once it was complete. He was moving to Michigan to be with family. The interviewer told him that if it was him and he worked on a major project like this, he would want to at least experience driving on it once and enjoy how nice and new and smooth it was. The construction worker laughed, smiled, and said "I have the same philosophy about road construction that I have about life: Sometimes you do the hard things now in hopes that someone later just might have it a little easier. "That really caused me to stop and reflect. When is the last time I took something on that I knew was going to be difficult, but the end result, whether I was still there or not, just might make things easier or better for someone else? Can I see past my schedule, my interruptions, my day to day routine to find a way to do something now that just might bless someone else later on? That's really one of the things that we are called to do as Christians. And we need to look no further than Jesus on the cross and resurrected to see this image played out. Doing the hard work so that things may be easier for others. I can't find my way back to God on my own. But Jesus made the way for me. And now it's our turn as Christ followers to do the same. Paul writes in his letter to the Philippians (Philippians 2:4), "Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others."

So let me just ask: What roads are you working on? What areas of your life are you willing to do the difficult work with God so that someone else's life may be blessed later on? Where are you spending your time and resources so that someone later is saying "Thank God they did that...so now we can do this!" Don't be afraid to do the hard work now, so that your work can turn into a blessing for someone else!

• Church Re-Opening •

From the Pastor -

Your Re-Open team met again last week and through discussion and prayer have determined that it is time for us to make the following changes to worship procedures and start the process of Re-Opening our ministries.

Sunday Morning Worship: Beginning Sunday, April 11th we will return to one worship service at 10:30 a.m. This service will be in person and broadcast online. We will still ask all members to wear their masks as they enter the church, but you may take off your mask while you are sitting in your seat. If you need to move about the building, please wear your mask again.

You may sit wherever you want (please still attempt to social distance and sit only with people you regularly spend time with already).

The only exception to this is that there will be a clearly marked section for those who wish to know that all around them will be wearing a mask. If you sit in this section, please know that you will be required to wear a mask the entire service.

Nursery: Our church nursery will re-open this Easter Sunday, April 4th for both the 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. services.

Sunday Schools: Sunday Schools are now able to meet at the discretion of each class. When a class has a teacher ready to teach and enough members ready to come they may meet again. At least one teacher for the class must meet with Pastor Jim in their classroom to discuss safety protocols before the class begins meeting.

Church Committees: Church committees may

begin meeting in person again as long as each member on the committee is willing to meet in person. No person will be left out of their leadership position because they are not ready to meet in person yet. Pastor Jim is attempting to develop a system where hybrid (in person and people on zoom) meetings are a possibility to help with this transition.

Vacation Bible School: We will have Vacation Bible School this summer. We will make all attempts to keep each group small in numbers.


