“Jesus of Nazareth..is so intrinsically king that the title ‘King’ has actually become his name. By calling ourselves Christians, we label ourselves as followers of the king...God did not intend Israel to have a kingdom. The kingdom was a result of Israel’s rebellion against God...the law was to be Israel’s king, and, through the law, God Himself...God devised a new kind of kingship for them. The King is Jesus; in Him God entered humanity...” (Taken from November-Magnificat® small print edition, Pg. 371)

“Though already present in His Church, Christ’s reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled ‘with power and great glory’ by the King’s return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ’s Passover. Until everything is subject to Him...the creatures..groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God. That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ’s return by saying to Him: *Maran tha! Our Lord, come!*” (Catechism of Catholic Church, #671).

Remember that Holy Communion is reserved for those who are unmarried and have received their first Holy Communion. It is also received by those married within the Catholic Church or has their marriage blessed (con-validated) by the Catholic Church. If you are Catholic who is married outside of the Catholic Church please refrain from receiving Holy Communion. And please come forward and talk with the priest to have your marriage blessed in the Church, and have this obstacle removed so you can receive Holy Communion. Couples who use contraception with no desire to stop using contraception are also to refrain from receiving Holy Communion. If you desire to stop using contraception, come to Confession and let the priest help remove this obstacle of receiving Holy Communion. For one to receive Holy Communion we also need to be in a state of grace with no mortal sin on our souls. We need to have gone to Confession recently, at least once a year. Missing Mass is a mortal sin, unless you have a good reason (ie. you were sick, taking care of someone who is sick or extreme weather). Go to Confession prior to receiving Holy Communion if you missed Mass and did not have a good reason.
